Directions to UMass Boston

From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

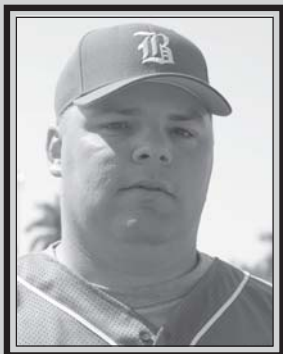
From the West

Head Coach Mark Bettencourt



Head Coach Mark Bettencourt has already established himself as perhaps the program's greatest coach in school history.

The Beacons mentor has coached the UMB nine to more wins than any other field general in UMass Boston history and guided the squad to a school-record total for wins with a 21-16 finish in 2002. Under his

guidance, the Beacons have had 10 players selected to the Little East All-Conference team, including three first teamers.

In his first year with UMass Boston baseball, he guided it to a then school-record victory total and topped that mark the following season with another school-record for wins. In just five seasons as the Beacons Head Coach, Bettencourt has etched his name in the record book as their all-time winningest coach in total wins and also has the best winning percentage of any baseball coach at the University.



Since his arrival at the Harbor Campus, he has cultivated an attitude among his players of never being satisfied and expects his squad to make noise in the conference slate every year.

In 2001, UMass Boston won more games within the conference than any year before and qualified for the Little East Conference tournament for the second time in three years under Bettencourt. As a coach, he has succeeded at building a program that has shown improvement every year, either within the conference or in overall wins.

The backbone of Bettencourt's philosophy revolves around discipline, dedication, character and work ethic. Those are the tools that he believes are important, both on and off the field.

"Every year we get closer to being a team with these attributes as a whole," explains Bettencourt. "When we reach that goal as a program my role here will have been a successful one."

Bettencourt not only preaches excellence on the field for his players, but also in the classroom and in society. In 2000-2001, his team received the athletic department's Academic Team Award, which is presented to the athletic team at UMB, whose players and coaches have demonstrated excellence toward academic success.

The Peabody native is well-seasoned in New England collegiate baseball circles, with experience as a player and as a coach.

Bettencourt spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Boston College, working with longtime mentor Richard "Moe" Maloney as the Eagles' pitching coach.

A 1995 graduate of BC, Bettencourt also was a stand-out pitcher for the Eagles before beginning his coaching career. He won four varsity letters at the Heights and was the team's captain in his senior year. Bettencourt pitched 215.2 innings in his career, spending three years as a starter and one year out of the bullpen. His finest season was in 1994, when he led the Eagle staff in innings and finished with a 6-2 record.

Upon college graduation, Bettencourt continued his playing career with the renowned Boston Park League, helping his club to league titles in 1996 and 1997 and earning all-star recognition on both occasions. He got his first taste of summer ball in the Inter City League, where he contributed to the Melrose Rams 1993 championship and in 1994 pitched for the Brewster Whitecaps in the legendary Cape Cod League.

As a schoolboy, Bettencourt excelled at Peabody High School as a starting pitcher and shortstop and quarterbacked the Tanners to the 1990 Division I Super Bowl championship. Bettencourt and his wife Lauren reside in Peabody, MA.

Assoc. Head Coach Bob Powers



Bob Powers comes back to UMass Boston for his fourth season with the Beacons. Powers has over 30 years of experience as a player and coach on his baseball resume. He will assume the position of Associate Head Coach once again, working with the program's hitters and baserunners as well as the infielders and outfielders. Under his tutelage, UMB's hitters established a new school-record for batting average with a Little East Conference leading .330 mark in 2002 and have consistently posted averages over .300. Powers also serves

as the Beacons' recruiting coordinator.

Powers served as Boston University's bench coach under Bill Mahoney from 1993-95 and has continued to stay active as a coach in the legendary Boston Park League. Inducted in the Park League Hall of Fame in 1994, Powers has enjoyed enormous success as a coach, earning Coach of the Year honors twice, while also guiding his teams to 18 playoff appearances and five championships. From 1983-1992, Powers led his teams to a 228-132 record, the most wins of any team in the league during that span.

As a player, Powers enjoyed a successful career as both a hitter and a pitcher at University of Massachusetts Amherst. In addition to his baseball career at UMass, he was a member of the Minutemen's basketball team that made three trips to the National Invitational Tournament, and was also a teammate of former NBA All-Star Julius Erving.

Powers also gained accolades as a pitcher on the high school level for Hanover High School in Massachusetts.

POWERS' HITTING PHILOSOPHY

There are certain basics that I firmly believe in that, if followed, will produce positive results.

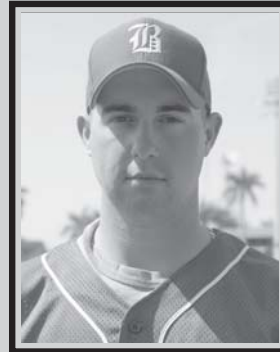
Among the principles are starting with a stance with slight flex at the ankles, knees and waist; the hands held high above the strike zone; staying back by launching each swing by slightly drawing the hands straight back; a short, soft stride; and a level or downward swing straight to the ball with the top hand palm down and the bottom hand palm up at the point of contact.

Most importantly, I demand hitters approach each at-bat (even in batting practice) with a plan. I believe in being aggressive early in the count.

When the count favors the pitcher, hitters must be able to hit the ball where it is pitched, delivering line drives to the gaps and center of the field.

We religiously practice these principles every day.

Assistant Coach Seith Bedard



Seith Bedard rejoins the Beacons as the team's pitching coach in his first year on the staff and will help to develop all of UMass Boston's hurlers. Bedard spent four seasons at UMB as one of Beacon's top pitchers.

The former UMass Boston ace received tryouts with the Boston Red Sox and Cincinnati Reds upon his graduation from the Harbor Campus.

Bedard still owns the UMass Boston record for career strikeouts with 149 and finished his career just six innings shy of being the program's all-time leader with 227 innings pitched. As one of the Beacons' top conference starting pitchers, the three-time UMass Boston Pitcher of the Year made 44 appearances to rank second on the UMB career list. Bedard also led the Beacons in innings pitched three times, including his freshman season. He was tops in strikeouts twice. He wasted no time in showing that he would be a quality starter in years to come at UMass Boston, taking a no-hitter into the eighth inning en-route to a complete game victory over Emerson College during his freshman campaign.

Bedard was no slouch on the high school level either, helping Peabody Veterans Memorial High School to a pair of Eastern Massachusetts titles and three Greater Boston League championships. He graduated from UMass Boston with a bachelor's degree in science and is a resident of Peabody, MA.

The Beacons biggest challenge in 2004 will be to overcome the unknown. For the first time in recent history, UMass Boston's baseball team will be very young and inexperienced on the college level. The Beacons return just 10 letterwinners from a year ago, and only three of those players are pitchers.

UMass Boston will rely heavily on its newcomers and their ability to jell with the veterans and fit into Head Coach Mark Bettencourt's program. Fortunately, the returning veterans are key players in the Beacons' quest for a successful season.

UMass Boston's hitters have been its strength over the past few seasons, with their hallmark being their power at the plate. The Beacons lost a lot of that power to graduation, but replace it with some very good contact hitters, who possess excellent speed. UMB will look to manufacture runs and use its athleticism to its advantage, both on the basepaths and defensively. The Beacons should be much improved defensively this season and much better conditioned, as well, after a vigorous off-season program.

Pitchers

With just three pitchers returning from last year's squad, UMass Boston will count on its newcomers more than ever on the mound this year.

A trio of seniors will be counted on to anchor a young pitching staff for the Beacons. Senior **Anthony Forbes (East Boston, MA)** returns with three years of experience and is certainly a candidate to pitch in conference play for the Beacons. The righty was 1-0 for UMB last year and walked just 10 batters in 21 innings and owns a 6-1 career mark. He is joined by classmate **Jeff Mogan (Ledyard, CT)**, who made 11 appearances to tie for the team lead last year and should challenge for a spot as a conference starter this year. The right-hander has good control and ranked fourth on the team in 2003, logging 28 1/3 innings. Senior **Ryan Barrack (Casselberry, FL)** is a hard thrower, who has added a different arm angle to his pitching style and could close out games for the Beacons. He held opponents to just a .100 batting mark with two outs in an inning.

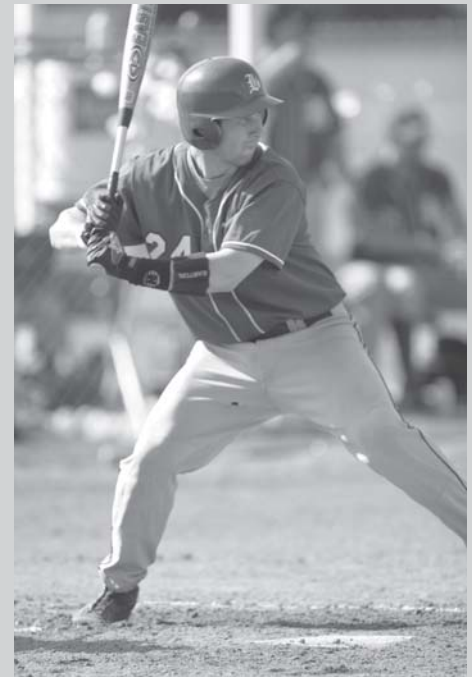
Sophomore **Ryan Blanchard (Gloucester, MA)** transferred from Division II Eckerd College, where he pitched on the JV squad, and could step in and bolster the UMass Boston staff right away by competing for starts in conference competition. The hurler has great presence on the mound and command of four pitches. Freshman **Jamie Soto (Peabody, MA)** will also challenge for a

spot in the Beacons starting rotation and seek conference innings. The lefty has excellent command of his fastball and curveball and an excellent pick-off move. UMB has another left-hander, who could also compete for conference innings, in junior transfer **Chuck Ritterson (Sewell, NJ)**, who gained experience at Gloucester Community College and helped it to the Division III JUCO World Series. A pair of freshmen, who will also see action as position players, could also figure into UMass Boston's starting rotation. **Evan Tardugno (Methuen, MA)** could see time as a starter and also get innings out of the pen. He has an above-average fastball and curveball and fellow freshman **Pat Donovan (Lowell, MA)** will also contribute on the mound when not playing in the field, also looking for time as a starter and in relief. He has the ability to throw any pitch at any time and possesses an above-average fastball and has excellent control of his curveball and change-up. The Beacons will also look for depth out of the bullpen from another pair of freshman. Southpaw **Dan Morrison (North Andover, MA)** spots his fastball really well and will give UMB a reliever from the left side, while **Nat Anglin (Milton, MA)** will also battle for time out of the pen. The righty has an above-average fastball and curveball to go with an outstanding work ethic.

Catchers

UMass Boston will count on a pair of newcomers to take over the catching duties.

Junior transfer **Troy Larocque (Hudson, NH)** spent a year playing for NCAA Division II Merrimack College before coming to the Harbor campus and should hit in the middle of the lineup. The power-hitting receiver has a very strong arm and will be counted on for his experience to handle the pitching staff. Larocque will share the responsibilities behind the dish with freshman **Jeran Mondalto (Amesbury, MA)**. The first-year catcher has great potential and hits for power and average. He has good speed and should hit in the middle of the lineup as well.

Infielders

The Beacons do have good experience in the infield, but will count on some newcomers to provide important depth.

Senior second baseman **Jon Tekela (Thornhill, ONT)** batted third in the order for UMB a year ago, but will make the transition as the team's lead-off batter. The former Little East Conference All-Star tied for the team lead with 25 RBI last year, while hitting .316 and will be counted on to draw more walks and steal bases this season. Tekela is the team's best baserunner and will also

give the Beacons some pop at the top of the order. **David DiCenso (Revere, MA)** will see time at shortstop and is an excellent contact hitter, who will bat near the top of the lineup. The junior missed time due to injury last year, but is 100% healthy and will provide UMB with a steady defensive presence up the middle. Senior **Chris King (Andover, MA)** will step into the starting role at first base after coming off the bench during his previous two seasons. He

gained valuable experience at first last year, after making the move from the outfield. He hit .280 last year and owned a .438 on-base percentage and will

provide the Beacons with some power and average from the left side. Sophomore **Mike Yagmin (New Britain, CT)** split time at short and third base last year, but will be the squad's starting third baseman in 2004. The second-year player is solid defensively and has an above average arm.



Junior Chris King owns a .288 career batting average and will start at first base for UMB.

Junior **Darwin L. Gonzalez (Lawrence, MA)** will also vie for time at shortstop after transferring from Northern Essex Community College. The junior has soft hands and a strong arm and should hit near the top of the lineup when starting. He has excellent speed and is a contact hitter, who rarely strikes out. Donovan, when not on the mound, will battle for time at third base. An excellent athlete, he should hit in the middle of the order and has a relentless work ethic. Sophomore **Bob Arey**

(Walpole, MA) will look for action at both second and first base for UMB. He is the team's only switch-hitter and makes good contact at the plate.

Outfielders

UMass Boston will enjoy the services of two of its most experienced players in the outfield and will see a pair of newcomers and a returner battle for the open left field spot.


Captain **Mike McGonagle (Boston, MA)** will play exclusively in center field after splitting his time between the outfield and catching. The Beacons' most complete player earned Second Team All-Conference honors a year ago after hitting .317, while driving in 24 runs and hitting three homers. The left-handed hitter will bat third in the lineup and can hit for power and average when not in the field, where he can cover a tremendous amount of ground to make UMB's pitchers' lives easier. Classmate **Eddie Stish, Jr. (West Hazleton, PA)** returns for his fourth season in right field after knocking in 21 runs in 2003. He will provide valuable experience and proved to come through in the clutch last year with a team-best 11 two-out runs batted in. He should hit in the middle of the order and possesses an above-average arm in the field. Sophomore **Justin Stockwell (Millbury, MA)** saw limited action last year and will look for more time in left field this season. The Beacons' most improved player from a year ago is a good contact hitter and has an accurate throwing arm. Sophomore **David Waters (Millis, MA)** can play all three outfield positions, but will primarily fight for the starting spot in left field.

He has a strong arm and can hit for power and average at the plate. He will hit near the bottom of the lineup and could surprise teams with his speed. Tardugno will also see time in the outfield, when not pitching. He's an excellent contact hitter with a great ability to get on base and will compete for time in left field. He has one of the strongest arms on the team and is a smart baserunner as well.

Although young, UMass Boston boasts one of the best crop of newcomers to step on the field for Coach Bettencourt. With key veterans, they could immediately, make the Beacons one of the top teams in the Little East Conference in 2004.

The Little East Conference

In just seven seasons as a baseball-playing entity, the Little East Conference can already stake a claim to being the most competitive Division III baseball conference in the nation.

The conference has produced three of the last six NCAA Division III national champions, with University of Southern Maine capturing the 1997 title and Eastern Connecticut State University winning the honor in 1998 and in 2002. The league also produced the 1998 national player of the year and sent three teams to the NCAA tournament in 1997 and 1998. In three of the past four seasons, the LEC saw two teams advance to the national tournament.

Although the three NCAA championships legitimized the baseball-playing arm of the conference, the Little East has long been recognized as a formidable alignment in other sports.

The conference was formed in 1986, with the notion of forming a basketball-playing league that would secure automatic bids to the NCAA Division III men's and women's basketball championships — a goal that was achieved in the 1988-89 season.

Since then, the conference has evolved to include baseball, softball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's tennis, women's volleyball, field hockey and men's and women's lacrosse.

The conference consists of University of Massachusetts Boston, Eastern Connecticut State University, Keene State College, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, University of Southern Maine and Western Connecticut State University.

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 12,719 students in the 2002-2003 academic year, with 10,071 undergraduate students and 2,648 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 31 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment.

UMass Boston's five colleges offer 73 undergraduate majors, 30 master's programs, and 14 doctoral programs, while the university's 12 institutes and centers are actively involved in research, professional public service and community outreach. More than 290 active research and training grants attracted \$30.5 million in external funds for the fiscal year 2003. The university employs 850 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Learning Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center



also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The building opened in April of 2004.

Academic Advising

At UMass Boston we prepare our students for life.

And because the life of a college student can be much more challenging than a basketball game or a soccer match, the UMass Boston athletic department provides you with the means to be successful in whatever sport you play, and also in the game of life.

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We make sure that our students are not solely concerned with maintaining athletic eligibility. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab—a fully equipped facility open exclusively to

UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people - all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and has spent previous summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.



Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.



The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

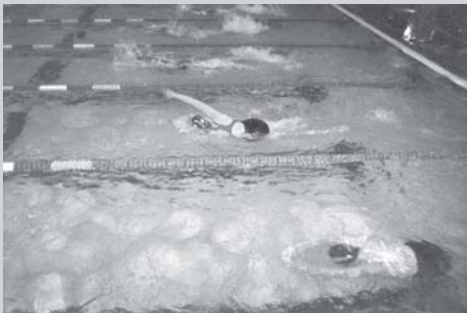
The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 14

intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball



courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative room and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically

challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site

of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.



The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.

UMass Boston in the Community *2004 Season*

Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.
- Over 100,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.
- UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.
- In 2001 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service.

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last fourteen years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached 9.4 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 6.5 million hours of community service.

There is no one way to conduct school outreach programs. It is clear from the great work done by NCAS members that there are many ways to provide quality programs. Their diversity and contributions to our nation is extraordinary.

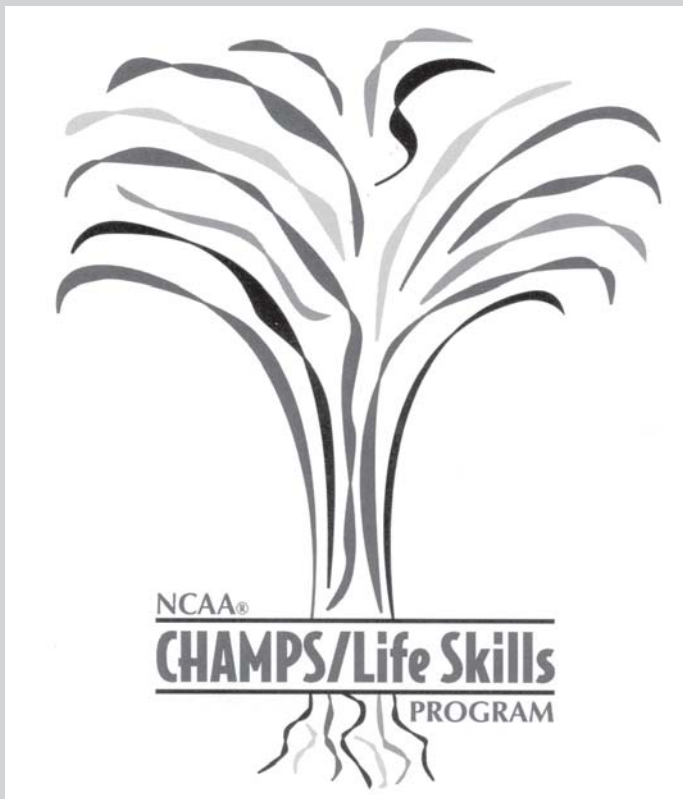

NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. Presently, 323 institutions and six conference offices now participate in this NCAA supported life skills program.
