Directions to UMass Boston

From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.

The Coaching Staff

HEAD COACH

BRENDAN EYGABROAT



Brendan Eygabroat takes over the Beacons baseball post after spending four seasons as an Assistant Coach at nearby Suffolk University, where he worked with the Rams' hitters and catchers.

Under his guidance, Suffolk catchers threw out just over 40% of would-be base stealers and the Rams saw much success as a

team, winning the Great Northeast Athletic Conference tournament championship in 2003, catapulting them into the NCAA Regionals.

He also saw time last summer as an assistant coach in the New England Collegiate Baseball League for the Mill City All-Americans working with the outfielders and hitters.

Before joining the college coaching ranks, Eygabroat enjoyed an outstanding college playing career at Mary Washington College in Virginia, where he helped the Eagles to a pair of NCAA Regional tournament appearances in 2001 and 1998. The Rochester, New York native was named captain for the Mary Washington nine for his senior season and hit .341 on way to earning South Region Honorable Mention honors as well as a spot on the Capital Athletic Conference First Team. He also helped the Eagles capture the CAC championship as a freshman.

Eygabroat starred at Brighton High School on the prep level and was named All-New York State, as well as, Monroe County Most

Valuable Player and First Team All-County following his senior campaign as a captain for BHS. The catcher helped the Barons to the Section V crown in 1996 and was named Second Team All-County in the process.

Eygabroat graduated from Mary Washington in 2001 and earned a masters degree in higher education administration from Suffolk in 2003.

The former Suffolk University hurler spent four years with the Rams under the guidance of Eygabroat and the rest of the Suffolk staff.

The big right-hander is no stranger to the coaching ranks having spent time in Boston's Intercity League as the Malden A's pitching mentor since 2002. Piantedosi can also be seen roaming the sidelines as the Head Freshman Boys Basketball Coach at Waltham High School, where he starred as a pitcher for the Hawks during his prep career.

Piantedosi currently resides in Waltham and is expected to receive a bachelor's degree in media/communications from Suffolk University in May of 2005.

ASSISTANT COACH

BOB POWERS



Bob Powers comes back to UMass Boston for his fifth season with the Beacons. Powers has over 30 years of experience as a player and coach on his baseball resume. He has worked with the program's hitters and baserunners as well as the infielders and outfielders. Under his tutelage, UMB's hitters established a new school-record for batting average with a Little East Conference leading .330

mark in 2002 and have consistently posted averages over .300. Powers has also served as the Beacons' recruiting coordinator.

Powers served as Boston University's bench coach under Bill Mahoney from 1993-95 and has continued to stay active as a coach in the legendary Boston Park League. Inducted in the Park League Hall of Fame in 1994, Powers has enjoyed enormous success as a coach, earning Coach of the Year honors twice, while also guiding his teams to 18 playoff appearances and five championships. From 1983-1992, Powers led his teams to a 228-132 record, the most wins of any team in the league during that span.

As a player, Powers enjoyed a successful career as both a hitter and a pitcher at University of Massachusetts Amherst and gained accolades as a pitcher on the high school level for Hanover High School in Massachusetts.

Season Outlook

UMass Boston comes into 2005 armed and ready for battle. The Beacons have some of the most talented sophomores in the conference and their pitching should be the strongest it's been in recent memory, despite the inexperience factor.

UMass Boston has just seven players, who are either entering their junior or senior campaigns, leaving most of the load up to the younger players on the squad. Fortunately, for the Beacons, their younger players have been a source of hope and a reason to be excited about the prospects for the upcoming season.

For the first time in seven years, UMB will be under the guidance of a different mentor as well. Head Coach Brendan Eygabrot takes over the reigns in his first season with the Beacons. He inherits a strong team and should be able to jump right into the thick of the conference race.

Pitchers

UMass Boston returns a trio of sophomores, who combined for half (nine) of the Beacons victories a year ago and a junior who owned an .800 winning percentage.

Sophomore **Pat Donovan (Lowell, MA)** not only established himself as one of UMass Boston's best pitchers last year, but also as one of the top hurlers in the conference, winning six games for the most in almost 10 years at UMB and highest total for a freshman in school history. Not only was he named the Little East Conference Rookie of the Year, but also landed a spot on the LEC Second Team as a pitcher. He led the club in innings pitched (65 2/3), appearances (12), starts (eight), complete games (six) and tied for the team lead in strikeouts (41), while issuing 24 free passes. He will see time on the mound vs. conference opponents again this season. Classmate **Evan Tardugno (Methuen, MA)** will also be counted on for some big innings in conference action after tossing 60 innings last season, while fanning 41 batters and allowing just 10 walks.

His 4.05 earned run average ranked second on the team and his three pick-offs led the staff. He should be a conference starter as well for UMB. Junior **Ryan Blanchard (Gloucester, MA)** posted a 4-1 mark last year and was one of two Beacons to toss a shutout. He started all seven games that he appeared in and recorded a 4.43 ERA. He should compete for conference starts and will get starts in non-conference games as

well. Sophomore **Jaime Soto (Peabody, MA)** was one of UMass Boston's best starters, despite having earned one victory. He led the team with a 3.48 earned run average, the lowest mark of any pitcher at UMB with over 20 innings pitched since 1992. The lefty will also compete for league starts and should see time as a non-conference starter. Senior **Chuck Ritterson (Sewell, NJ)** should log more innings than last year as a reliever and spot starter. The southpaw held opponents to just a .226 batting average in 16 1/3 innings of work, while going 1-0 and making three starts. Freshman **Nick Conway (Methuen, MA)** joins his former high school staffmate, Tardugno, and is expected to make a significant impact right away. He can throw four pitches effectively and should see time starting in non-conference tilts and out of the pen in conference match-ups. Senior **Paul Tedesco (East Boston, MA)**, sophomore **Bob Kniffen (Halifax, MA)** and freshman **Derrick Plante (Medford, MA)** will all look for time on the mound out of the bullpen. Tedesco could be used in end of the game situations, while Kniffen and Plante should see middle relief work and could also earn a nod for a spot start.

Catchers

The Beacons return a sophomore, who gained significant experience behind the plate last season and a freshman who should give UMass Boston a solid defensive catcher off the bench.

Sophomore **Jeran Mondalto (Amesbury, MA)** started 21 of 38 games behind the dish and has an outstanding season at the plate, hitting .323 (32-99) in his first collegiate season. Mondalto made just two errors in 108 chances and smacked 10 extra-base hits as well. He will serve as the team's primary catcher and receive even more time than last year as he looks to assert himself as one of the top receivers in the conference. Freshman **Andrew McAllister (Quincy, MA)** will vie for time at catcher, as well. The first-year player will see most of his action as a back-up, learning the ins and outs of the college game. McAllister is a good defensive catcher and will provide good depth.

Infielders

The Beacons return three of their starters in the infield and add two veteran transfers, who should step in right away and provide immediate dividends.

A pair of seniors will split time at first base. **Chris King (Andover, MA)** has grown into the role as UMass Boston's starting first baseman as he enters his fourth year in the program. A co-captain, He saw his first significant action last season, playing in 34 games, while handling 305 chances at first base. One of just three left-handed bats on the squad, he has worked hard in the off-season and should make pitchers work due to his discipline at the plate. Tedesco will also see time at first base and fill a spot in the middle of the Beacons' lineup as the designated hitter. The transfer from University of Southern Maine can hit for power and average and will be counted on as one of the team's big run-producers. Junior **Mike Yagmin (New Britain, CT)** will start at third base with Plante and Donovan also getting some time at the hot corner. Yagmin posted a solid season as a sophomore with a .303 (37-122) batting mark, while cracking nine doubles and driving in 19 runs. He was outstanding defensively, committing just five miscues in the field and should be one of the team's leaders on the field as a co-captain. Plante will also look for playing time in his first year. The frosh can hit to all fields and has some decent power and the ability to come off the bench as a valuable pinch-hitter. Senior **Darwin Gonzalez (Lawrence, MA)** split time at shortstop last year, but will assume the starting position this season. He should bat in the leadoff spot after showing a good stick last year with a .312 (29-93) batting

mark and a penchant for reaching base, as evidenced by a .396 on-base percentage. He will also keep opponents honest on the bases as a legitimate stolen base threat after swiping 10 bases in 33 games in 2004. Freshman **Sam Perkins (Cambridge, MA)** is a transfer from Gettysburg College and should see time in the middle infield off the bench. He could also provide depth behind the plate. Second base will be the only infield spot with any unknowns coming into the season, but junior **Jose Morales (Lowell, MA)** brings experience

to the position after two years on the junior college level. The transfer is a strong offensive player, who has good speed and should serve in a leadership role as well. He could see time at shortstop as well. Tardugno will make the move from the outfield and see action at second base when not on the hill. The sophomore has worked hard in the off-season to regain the hitting stroke he possessed as the Merrimack Valley Conference Player of the Year in 2003 as a prep star and should make a greater contribution at the plate.

Outfielders

UMass Boston's outfield returns just one starter from last season's trio. Sophomore **David Waters (Millis, MA)** will return as the Beacons' left fielder, but could also spell center, if needed. The 6'2", 200 lb.

Waters had a tremendous first season, hitting .363 (29-80), while slugging .550 and crushing three home runs. He can hit for power and average and will hit in the middle of the Beacons order and be counted on for run production, while using his speed to grab an extra base as well. Donovan will make the move from third base to right field this season, when not on the

mound. The Sophomore was one of UMass Boston's biggest bats a year ago, leading the team with 28 runs batted in, while hitting .333 (36-108) and maintaining a .407 on-base percentage. Donovan will hit in the middle of the Beacons' order and after slugging .537 a year ago with 14 extra-base hits, he should be one of the team's biggest power threats at the plate. Freshman **Fernando Peña (Peabody, MA)** is penciled in as UMB's starting center fielder where the team can take full advantage of his tremendous speed and ability to cover ground and track balls in the outfield. The first-year player should hit near the bottom of the order and is a good contact hitter with excellent speed to make things happen on the bases. Junior **Justin Stockwell (Millbury, MA)** returns for his third season and will compete for time in the outfield at the corner positions. He has a great work ethic and has really improved at the plate. Kniffen returns to the Beacons after taking a year away from baseball and should also fight for time in the outfield. He has a good bat and good speed and will see time off the bench.

The Little East Conference

In just eight seasons as a baseball-playing entity, the Little East Conference can already stake a claim to being the most competitive Division III baseball conference in the nation.

The conference has produced three of the last seven NCAA Division III national champions, with University of Southern Maine capturing the 1997 title and Eastern Connecticut State University winning the honor in 1998 and in 2002. The league also produced the 1998 national player of the year and sent three teams to the NCAA tournament in 1997 and 1998. In three of the past five seasons, the LEC saw two teams advance to the national tournament.

Although the three NCAA championships legitimized the baseball-playing arm of the conference, the Little East has long been recognized as a formidable alignment in other sports.

The conference was formed in 1986, with the notion of forming a basketball-playing league that would secure automatic bids to the NCAA Division III men's and women's basketball championships — a goal that was achieved in the 1988-89 season.

Since then, the conference has evolved to include baseball, softball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's tennis, women's volleyball, field hockey and men's and women's lacrosse.

The conference consists of University of Massachusetts Boston, Eastern Connecticut State University, Keene State College, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, University of Southern Maine and Western Connecticut State University.

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 12,719 students in the 2002-2003 academic year, with 10,071 undergraduate students and 2,648 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 31 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment.

UMass Boston's five colleges offer 73 undergraduate majors, 30 master's programs, and 14 doctoral programs, while the university's 12 institutes and centers are actively involved in research, professional public service and community outreach. More than 290 active research and training grants attracted \$30.5 million in external funds for the fiscal year 2003. The university employs 850 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Learning Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center



also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The building opened in April of 2004.

Academic Advising

At UMass Boston we prepare our students for life.

And because the life of a college student can be much more challenging than a basketball game or a soccer match, the UMass Boston athletic department provides you with the means to be successful in whatever sport you play, and also in the game of life.

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We make sure that our students are not solely concerned with maintaining athletic eligibility. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab—a fully equipped facility open exclusively to

UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people - all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and has spent previous summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training

staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.



Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.

Clark Athletic Center

2005
Season

The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 14 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative room and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.



Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports

Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.



The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.

UMass Boston in the Community *2005 Season*

Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.
- Over 100,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.
- UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.
- In 2003 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the sixth straight year.

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last eighteen years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 11.4 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 12.5 million hours of community service.

There is no one way to conduct school outreach programs. It is clear from the great work done by NCAS members that there are many ways to provide quality programs. Their diversity and contributions to our nation is extraordinary.

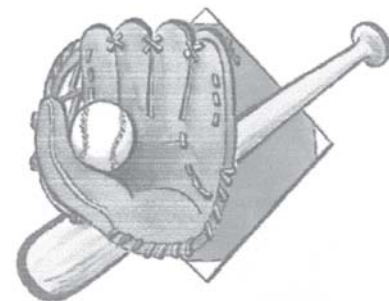

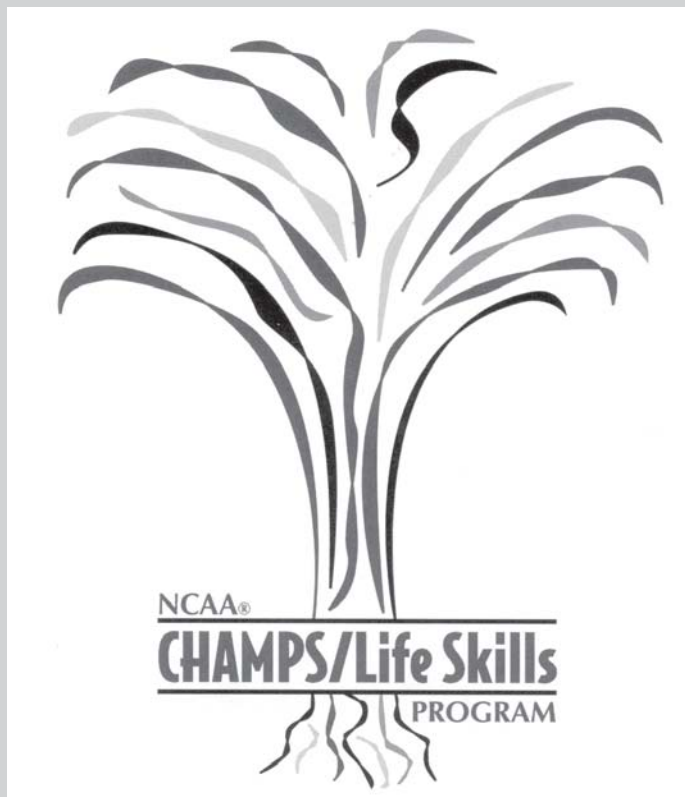

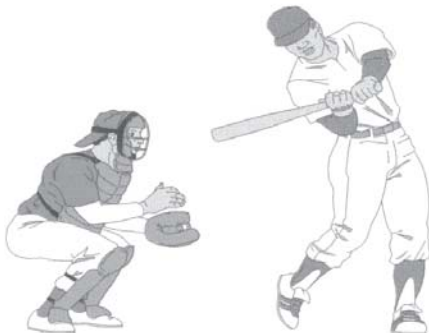
