Directions to UMass Boston

From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.

HEAD COACH BRENDAN EYGABROAT



Brendan Eygabroat enters his second season with the Beacons. In just his first season at the head of UMB's baseball post, he led the Beacon nine to its most wins in the conference in school history and a first-ever win in Little East Conference tournament. Under Eygabroat's direction the squad also posted the fourth-highest

victory total in a single-season in school annals, which included the first-ever season sweep over LEC rival, UMass Dartmouth. He also mentored a pair of players, who earned All-Conference recognition.



Prior to his arrival on the Harbor Campus, he spent four seasons as an Assistant Coach at nearby Suffolk University, where he worked with the Rams' hitters and catchers.

Under his guidance, Suffolk catchers threw out just over 40% of would-be base stealers and the Rams saw much success as a team, winning the Great Northeast Athletic Conference tournament championship in 2003, catapulting them into the NCAA Regionals.

He also saw time as an assistant coach in the New England Collegiate Baseball League for the Mill City All-Americans working with the outfielders and hitters.

Before joining the college coaching ranks, Eygabroat enjoyed an outstanding college playing career at Mary Washington College in Virginia, where he helped the Eagles to a pair of NCAA Regional tournament appearances in 2001 and 1998. The Rochester, New York native was named captain for the Mary Washington nine for his senior season and hit .341 on way to earning South Region Honorable Mention honors as well as a spot on the Capital Athletic Conference First Team. He also helped the Eagles capture the CAC championship as a freshman.

Eygabroat starred at Brighton High School on the prep level and was named All-New York State, as well as, Monroe County Most Valuable Player and First Team All-County following his senior campaign as a captain for BHS. The catcher helped the Barons to the Section V crown in 1996 and was named Second Team All-County in the process.

Eygabroat graduated from Mary Washington in 2001 and earned a masters degree in higher education administration from Suffolk in 2003.

MARK PIANTEDOSI



Mark Piantedosi begins his second season with the Beacons, after having been reunited with coach Eygabroat as the Beacons' pitching coach in 2005.

The former Suffolk University hurler spent four years with the Rams under the guidance of Eygabroat and the rest of the Suffolk staff.

In his first season at the Harbor Campus, Piantedosi helped guide the UMass Boston pitching staff to its most wins in conference play in school history and a spot in the Little East Conference tournament. Under his guidance UMB hurlers posted the lowest team earned run average since the Beacons set a record in 1983 with a 4.75 mark.

The big right-hander is no stranger to the coaching ranks having spent time in Boston's Intercity League as the Malden A's pitching mentor since 2002. Piantedosi can also be seen roaming the sidelines as the Head Freshman Boys Basketball Coach at Waltham High School, where he starred as a pitcher for the Hawks during his prep career.

Piantedosi currently resides in Waltham and graduated from Suffolk University with a bachelor's degree in media/communications in 2005.

SCOTT BLUMSACK



Scott Blumsack brings an abundance of collegiate coaching and playing experience with him to the Beacons' program. He will work with the team's outfielders and hitters.

The former Malden High School star spent the last three seasons as the Head Coach of Bunker Hill Community College and has coached in Boston's famed Intercity League

for the past seven years.

His presence has not only been felt on the New England coaching scene, but also as a player, having played two seasons at Roger Williams University and prior to that, helping the Penmen of Southern New Hampshire University to an ECAC Division II championship during the first of two campaigns with the program in 1997.

A Greater Boston League Baseball All-Star, Blumsack currently resides in Watertown, MA with his fiancée, Danielle.

ASSISTANT COACH

CHRIS KING



Chris King didn't waste any time coming back into the UMass Boston baseball fold after seeing time in 90 games in four years as a player from 2002-05.

A captain for the Beacons in his senior season, King worked to make himself one of the most disciplined hitters in school history, drawing 24 walks to establish a single-season record at UMB and ranked second on the team with a .406 on-base percentage.

An great example of hard work and dedication, "Kinger" established career-highs in hits, runs batted in, doubles and total bases in his last year of competition and graduated with the distinction of having recorded the second-most career putouts (550) for the Beacons, including the second-highest single-season total (290) as a junior.

The Andover native earned a degree in criminal justice from UMass Boston in 2005 and currently resides in Dorchester.

There will be a lot of question marks and unknowns that will follow the Beacons into the 2006 season. The biggest will be: How will the team respond to losing every one of their primary position starters from a year ago and their top two pitchers?

UMass Boston will undergo a major retooling effort, while also relying on a few returners to step up with huge contributions. The Beacons bring in some talented newcomers, and a number of them possess valuable experience from the junior college level.

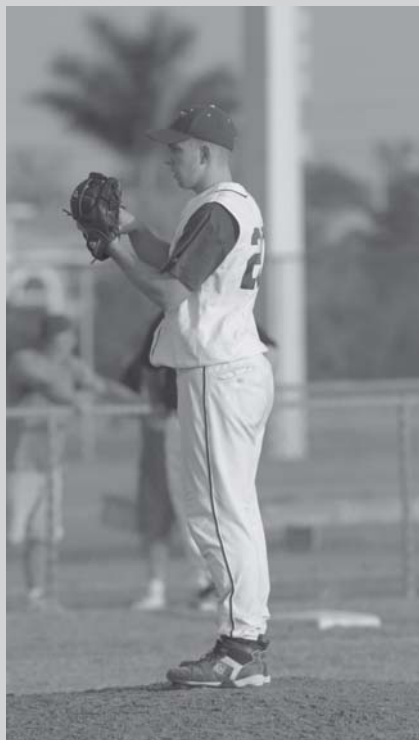
UMass Boston recently has been known for its big hitters, but has been starting to make its mark with its pitching as well. The Beacon nine will count on some good arms again this year and will look to manufacture more runs by putting pressure on the defense with aggressive base running and situational hitting, rather than relying on the big extra-base knock.

Pitchers

UMass Boston returns three pitchers from a year ago that could compete for a spot at the top of the rotation.

Senior **Ryan Blanchard (Gloucester, MA)** is the most experienced of the three and has proven to be a warrior with the mettle to step in as a starter in conference contests. The crafty right-hander throws five different pitches for strikes and can come at hitters from different angles. He is one of three team captains and made seven starts to rank second on the squad last year in addition to four appearances out of the pen, while earning a save.

Junior **Jaime Soto (Peabody, MA)** was one of the Beacons best starters, two years ago, but struggled last season. The southpaw has good experience and has pitched in big games for UMB in the past. He will compete for one of the team's spots as a conference starter. A tri-captain this year, he made four starts a year ago and owned a 2:1 strikeout to walk ratio with 26 strikeouts and 13 bases on balls. Sophomore **Nick Conway (Methuen, MA)** could be the wildcard after hurling 46

innings a year ago in his first season, the third-most innings on the staff. The right-hander has great stuff and an above average fastball and curveball and could make a huge impact for the Beacons as a top of the rotation starter if he can harness his potential. He made five starts in '05, while tying for the team-lead with 13 appearances and struck out 37 batters for the second-most on the squad. Junior **Bob Kniffen (Halifax, MA)** pitched well in limited action last year and should get the call from the pen more this season with the role as the team's closer. He posted a 2.45 earned run average in 14 2/3 innings last year, while going 1-0 in six appearances.

Junior **Michael Mish (South Hadley, MA)** joins the UMass Boston pitching ranks after spending time at American International College and Mount Holyoke Community College. He has good control and should make an immediate contribution with his experience and will see action as both a starter and reliever. Junior **Bryan Curran (Brockton, MA)** will also see time on the mound when not playing third, and will vie for innings in conference play and starts during the week. Junior transfer **Rollin Seudat (Brooklyn, NY)** also brings experience to the Beacons' staff and will see time in relief for the team. Senior **José Morales (Lowell, MA)** will also throw some relief innings for UMass Boston along with junior transfer **Mike Marchesi (Arlington, MA)**, who joins UMB after playing for Bunker Hill Community College.

Catchers

The Beacons will count on a tested newcomer with junior college experience to take over the majority of the catching duties. Junior **Billy Gannon (Milton, MA)** joins UMass Boston after spending two seasons at Massasoit Community College where he was a part of a Junior College World Series run. He's a very strong defensive catcher with a quick release to limit opposing base stealers. The receiver also has great speed for a catcher and will pose a threat on the basepaths as well as at the plate.

Freshman **Steven Freeman (Salisbury, MA)** will back-up behind the plate and could also get at-bats as the Beacons' designated hitter. He possesses a lot of power and will also be used in pinch-hitting situations.

Infielders

The Beacons will count on a pair of returners to step up as well as quality contributions from a junior transfer and a group of freshmen to form a productive infield.

Morales saw the most time of any of the returning position players, starting 22 of 29 games that he played in, primarily at

second base. He will make the move to first base this season, but could also see action at second, third and catcher. He should

provide some power in the line-up as evidenced by his three homers last year and is a good baserunner with good instincts. Sophomore **Derrick Plante (Medford, MA)** saw limited action at third base in his first year, but should see more time at first base as a starter and could play some third as well. He brings a good glove to the position and will be looked upon to produce runs in the lineup.

Junior transfer **Bryan Curran (Brockton, MA)** was a major cog in

Massasoit Community College's tremendous success and will start at third base for UMass Boston. He owns a strong arm and should be one of the best hitters on the team, while hitting for power and average to go with good speed. Freshman **Richie Montecalvo (Medford, MA)** will be given the chance to start at shortstop right out of the gate and should give UMB a smooth, defensive player with a strong arm up the middle. He's a gamer and should hit at the bottom of the line-up with the potential to move up. **Ernesto Green (San Diego, CA)** is another impact freshman who will get the chance to start right away at second base. He's a deft fielder with above average speed and is a good line drive hitter, who could find himself near the top of the batting order. Sophomore **Ryan Oshima (La Jolla, CA)** is another West Coast player that will push for time at second base. He is very strong defensively and has good speed on the basepaths. A spray hitter, he could find a place in the nine-hole or as a table setter in the line-up.

Freshman **Adrian Piña (Hyde Park, MA)** is a good line-drive hitter with some pop to the gaps and should see opportunities in key pinch-hitting situations, but will also vie for time at first base. Senior **Alex Gang (Newton, MA)** should provide depth at first base as well and will give the team a left-handed bat off the bench and some speed for pinch-running duties. Freshman **Stephen Garcia (Chelsea, MA)** hits the ball well to all fields and has a strong arm, which will help him compete for starting assignments at third base. Sophomore **AJ Luongo (Malden,**

MA) will also compete for time at third base, but can play the outfield as well and can hit for power and average, which could translate into at-bats as the team's designated hitter and a key pinch-hitter.

Outfielders

The outfield will get a total facelift for the Beacons with just one returner from last season, who started 11 games. UMass Boston will look for players to step up and will also count on valuable experience from a junior transfer.

Junior center fielder Bob Kniffen saw action in 29 games for the Beacons last year and batted .286 (14-49). An excellent defensive outfielder with great range and an outstanding throwing arm, Kniffen has been named a tri-captain for the squad and will have to step up for the team as its leadoff hitter. He's a good line-drive hitter, who makes good contact and runs the bases well, which will be key, batting from the top spot in the order. Jaime Soto will also be asked to step up and contribute as UMB's left fielder. When he's not on the mound, Soto will make the transition as a position player for the first time in his collegiate career. The Beacons' only regular left-handed hitter, he will bat in the middle of the line-up where his power can be utilized the best.

Junior transfer **Sean C. Ketterer (Plymouth, MA)** should step in and start in right field for UMass Boston. He brings an impressive cache with him, coming from Massasoit Community College, where he captained the squad to a pair of World Series appearances. Ketterer is a good line drive hitter with power and should hit in the middle of the order. He has a strong arm, which will be an asset in the outfield as well. Freshman **Chris Oram (Lynn, MA)** is a very strong defensive outfielder with an above average arm and great range and will compete for time off the bench. His speed will also make him a pinch-running option. Ryan Blanchard and Mike Marchesi could also see time in the outfield.

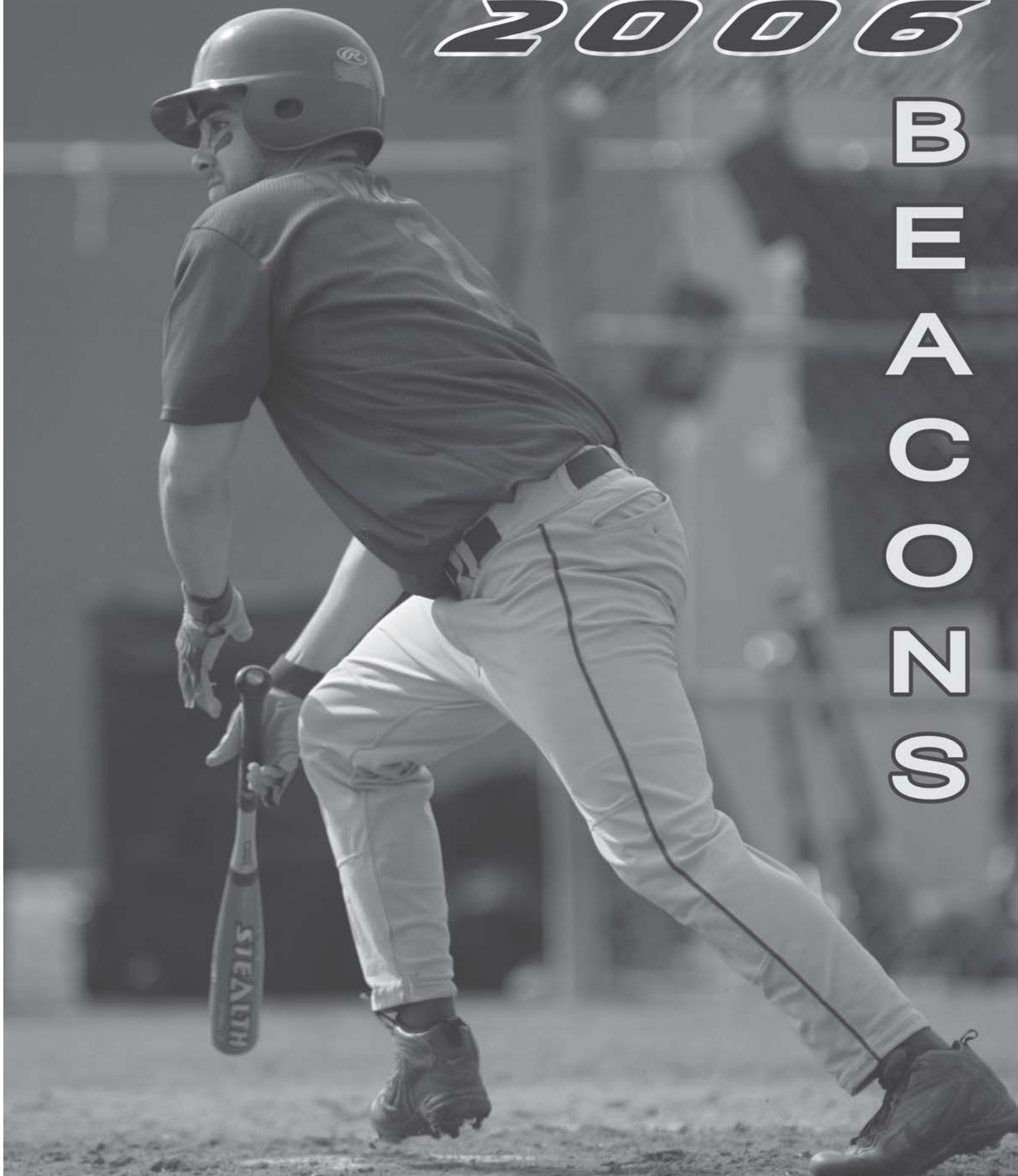

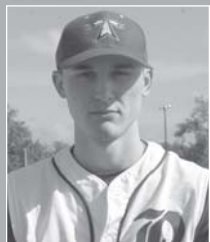

The Little East Conference

2006
Season

In just nine seasons as a baseball-playing entity, the Little East Conference can already stake a claim to being the most competitive Division III baseball conference in the nation.

The conference has produced three of the last seven NCAA Division III national champions, with University of Southern Maine capturing the 1997 title and Eastern Connecticut State University winning the honor in 1998 and in 2002. The league also produced the 1998 national player of the year and sent three teams to the NCAA tournament in 1997 and 1998. In three of the past five seasons, the LEC saw two teams advance to the national tournament.

Although the three NCAA championships legitimized the baseball-playing arm of the conference, the Little East has long been recognized as a formidable alignment in other sports.

The conference was formed in 1986, with the notion of forming a basketball-playing league that would secure automatic bids to the NCAA Division III men's and women's basketball championships — a goal that was achieved in the 1988-89 season.

Since then, the conference has evolved to include baseball, softball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's tennis, women's volleyball, field hockey and men's and women's lacrosse.

The conference consists of University of Massachusetts Boston, Eastern Connecticut State University, Keene State College, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, University of Southern Maine and Western Connecticut State University.

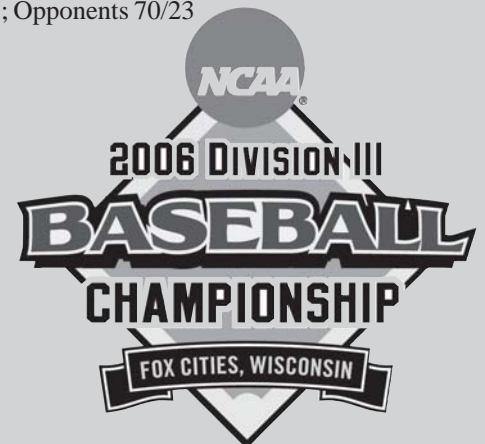

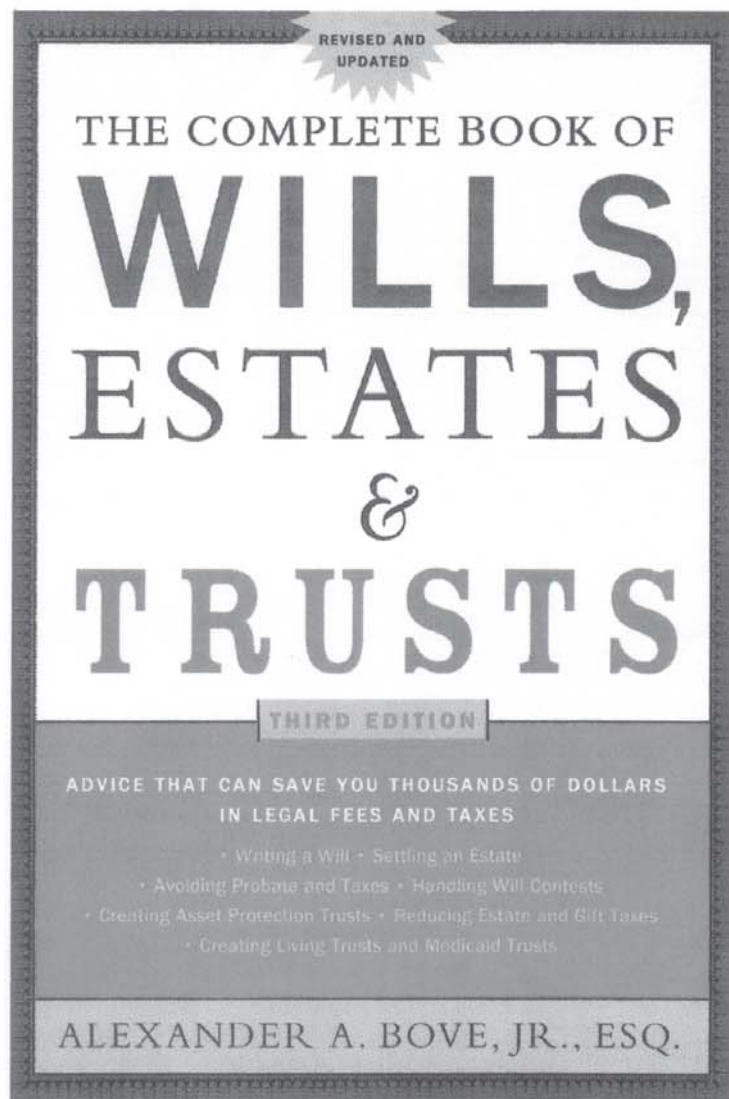

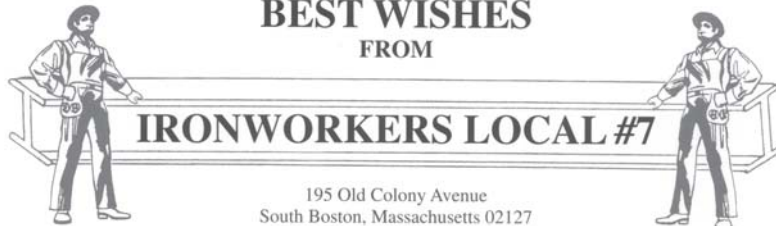

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 11,682 students in the 2004-2005 academic year, with 8,832 undergraduate students and 2,850 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 33 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment. More than 80 languages are spoken in the homes of members of the 2004 graduating class.

UMass Boston's six colleges offer over 100 undergraduate majors, 61 master's programs, and 14 doctoral programs, while the university's 26 institutes and centers are actively involved in research, professional public service and community outreach. More than 290 active research and training grants attracted \$30.5 million in external funds for the fiscal year 2003. The university employs 821 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Learning Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center



also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the 331,000-square-foot Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The campus' new "front entrance" opened in April of 2004.

Academic Advising

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab--a fully equipped facility open exclusively to UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and nine summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.

Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.

Clark Athletic Center

The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 14 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative room and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.



Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports

Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.



The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.

UMass Boston in the Community *2006 Season*

Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- **More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.**
- **Over 200,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.**
- **UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.**
- **In 2004 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the seventh straight year.**
- **UMass Boston earned a National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators/Jostens Community Service Award for the second consecutive year.**

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last twenty years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 13 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 14.2 million hours of community service.

There is no one way to conduct school outreach programs. It is clear from the great work done by NCAS members that there are many

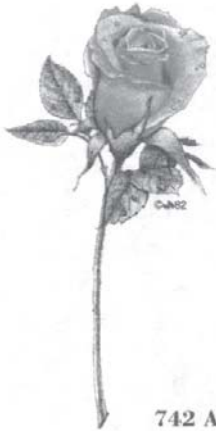

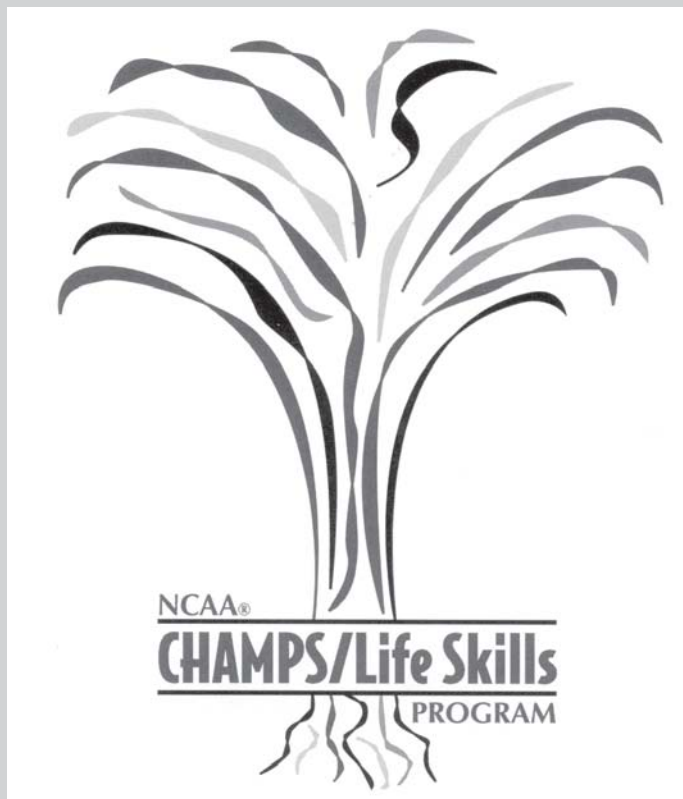

NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. Presently, 323 institutions and six conference offices now participate in this NCAA supported life skills program.
