### From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

### From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

### From the West

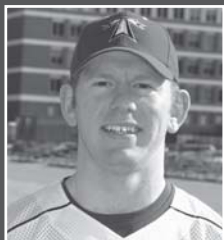
Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.

# THE COACHING STAFF

## BRENDAN EYGABROAT

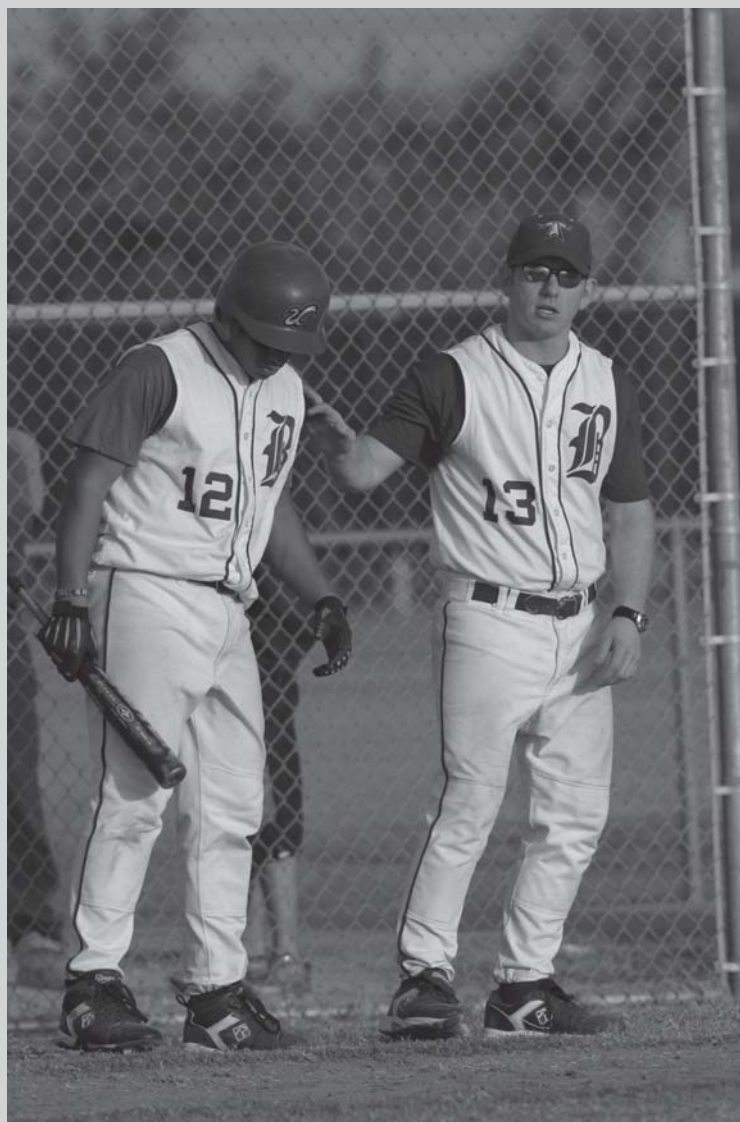


### Head Coach

*Mary Washington '01  
Third Season*

In just two seasons, Head Coach Brendan Eygabroat has already led the Beacon nine to milestones never broached before. He also holds the highest career winning percentage of any other baseball coach in school history.

In just his first season at the helm of UMB's baseball post, he led UMass Boston to its most wins in the conference in school history



and a first-ever win in Little East Conference tournament. He followed that last season by establishing a new school-record for wins in Little East Conference play, a first-ever ECAC New England tournament appearance, while taking down national powerhouses, University of Southern Maine and Eastern Connecticut State University for the first time in school history. His pitching staff shattered the school-mark for lowest earned run average, posting a 4.48 figure in 2006, led by Nick Conway, the first-ever UMB player to be named Little East Conference Pitcher of the Year.

Eygabroat's program produced the league's Pitcher of the Year and five players have been named to the Little East Conference All-Star squad. In just two seasons.

Prior to his arrival on the Harbor Campus, he spent four seasons as an Assistant Coach at nearby Suffolk University, where he worked with the Rams' hitters and catchers.

Under his guidance, Suffolk catchers threw out just over 40% of would-be base stealers and the Rams saw much success as a team, winning the Great Northeast Athletic Conference tournament championship in 2003, catapulting them into the NCAA Regionals.

He also saw time as an assistant coach in the New England Collegiate Baseball League for the Mill City All-Americans working with the outfielders and hitters.

Before joining the college coaching ranks, Eygabroat enjoyed an outstanding college playing career at Mary Washington College in Virginia, where he helped the Eagles to a pair of NCAA Regional tournament appearances in 2001 and 1998. The Rochester, New York native was named captain for the Mary Washington nine for his senior season and hit .341 on way to earning South Region Honorable Mention honors as well as a spot on the Capital Athletic Conference First Team. He also helped the Eagles capture the CAC championship as a freshman.

Eygabroat graduated from Mary Washington in 2001 and earned a masters degree in higher education administration from Suffolk in 2003.

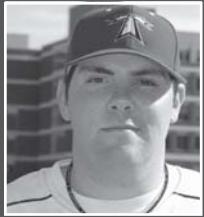

## MARK PIANTEDOSI



**Assistant Coach**

*Suffolk '05*

Mark Piantedosi begins his third season with the Beacons, after having been reunited with coach Eygabroat as the Beacons' pitching coach in 2005.

The former Suffolk University hurler spent four years with the Rams under the guidance of Eygabroat and the rest of the Suffolk staff.

In his first season at the Harbor Campus, Piantedosi helped guide the UMass Boston pitching staff to its most wins in conference play in school history and a spot in the Little East Conference tournament and last year, bettered that win mark again. Under his guidance, in 2005, UMB hurlers posted the lowest team earned run average in 22 years and last year set a new school-record with a team ERA of 4.48. Under Piantedosi's tutelage, the Beacons also produced the school's first Little East Conference Pitcher of the Year in Nick Conway last season.

The big right-hander is no stranger to the coaching ranks having spent time in Boston's Intercity League as the Malden A's pitching mentor since 2002. Piantedosi can also be seen roaming the sidelines as the Freshman Boys Basketball Coach at Waltham High School, where he starred as a pitcher for the Hawks during his prep career.

Piantedosi currently resides in Waltham and graduated from Suffolk University with a bachelor's degree in media/communications in 2005.

## SCOTT BLUMSACK



**Assistant Coach**

Scott Blumsack returns for his third season on the UMass Boston staff. He is a student of the game with an abundance of collegiate coaching and playing experience and will work with the team's pitchers and hitters.

The former Malden High School star spent three seasons as the Head Coach of Bunker Hill Community College, where he helped produce a pair of All-New England players and directed his squad to the conference championship in 2004. He has also coached and played in Boston's famed Intercity League for the past 11 years and helped lead the Athletics of the ICL to a pair of playoff appearances and was selected as a coach for two All-Star games as well.

His presence has not only been felt on the New England coaching scene, but also as a player, having played two seasons at Roger Williams University, where he hit over .330 for his career and, prior to that, helping the Penmen of Southern New Hampshire University to an ECAC Division II championship during the first of two campaigns with the program in 1997.

A Greater Boston League All-Star, Blumsack currently resides in Watertown, MA with his wife, Danielle.



## JAMES CORDES



**Assistant Coach**

*Redlands '04*

James Cordes ventures to the East Coast after an extremely successful playing career on the West Coast. The former shortstop was a three-year starter for University of Redlands, where he was a scholar athlete for Bulldogs. The Idaho native finished his career with an even .300 batting average and was named to the California Invitational All-Tournament team, while helping the Bulldogs to the tourney title.

Following his outstanding playing career, he enjoyed success on the coaching level as well, helping the Redlands East Valley High School nine to the playoffs in each of his two seasons as Associate Head Coach.

A 2004 graduate with a degree in history and a minor in creative writing, Cordes will instruct the UMass Boston infielders and hitters in addition to recruiting duties.

He currently resides in Brighton and is nearing completion of a masters degree in education from Boston College.

## CHRIS KING



**Assistant Coach**

*UMass Boston '05*

Chris King didn't waste any time coming back into the UMass Boston baseball fold as an assistant coach last year after seeing time in 90 games in four years as a player from 2002-05. He will be working with the outfielders and hitters.

A captain for the Beacons in his senior season, King worked to make himself one of the most disciplined hitters in school history, drawing 24 walks to establish a single-season record at UMB and ranked second on the team with a .406 on-base percentage.

An great example of hard work and dedication, King established career-highs in hits, runs batted in, doubles and total bases in his last year of competition and graduated with the distinction of having recorded the second-most career putouts (550) for the Beacons, including the second-highest single-season total (290) as a junior.

The Andover native earned a degree in criminal justice from UMass Boston in 2005 and currently resides in Dorchester.

UMass Boston baseball exorcised some demons last season, defeating perennial powerhouses, University of Southern Maine and Eastern Connecticut State for the first time in school history. The Beacons also posted their highest total of wins in conference play after putting up a 7-7 record in the Little East Conference slate. UMass Boston will look to build on last year's success, armed with the reigning LEC Pitcher of the Year and a number of new quality hurlers on the staff.

Not only does the Beacons' pitching look even stronger than last year, but it's offense should be as well, with the return of six starters, including the top three hitters, who hit a combined .356 last season, including a single-season record for hits by the leadoff hitter.

## Pitchers

UMass Boston's pitching staff established a school-record low earned run average last season and should be even better this season with the return of aforementioned junior **Nick Conway (Methuen, MA)**, who shattered the school-record for strikeouts with 82, en-route to being named the LEC's top pitcher. Joining Conway are a number of talented newcomers, thus making the Beacons' pitching stronger and deeper to allow the staff to have more defined roles within the bullpen and starting rotation.

Conway had a dream season for any sophomore last year, owning a 2.83 earned run average, while tossing a school-record 86 innings and was named to the LEC First Team. The righty hurled a league-high two shutouts, while issuing just 24 walks and holding opponents to a stingy .233 batting average. The junior will be the Beacons' top pitcher again this season, joined by senior **Jaime Soto (Peabody, MA)** as UMB's number two starter. The senior is the most-experienced pitcher for the Beacons and is coming off a season where he went 3-2 with a 4.32 earned run average in a career-high 58 1/3 innings of work. The lefty struck out a personal-best 42, including a school-record 16 vs. Fisher College and was charged with just 25 walks. He will be counted on to have another career-year.

UMass Boston will look to a pair of newcomers for key starting innings during the week as well as a push for innings vs. conference opponents. Junior transfer **Mike Dorval (Belchertown, MA)** comes to the Beacons after two years with Holyoke Community College, where he stands fourth on the school's all-time strikeout list with 83. The right-hander will push for conference starts, but will see the majority of his innings during non-conference action. He can throw a fastball, curveball and change-up for strikes. Freshman **Mike Andriano (Massapequa, NY)** will also vie for important starting innings as the number two or three pitcher on the staff. The burly, southpaw is very poised and can also throw all three of his pitches for strikes. A wild card for UMass Boston is freshman left-hander **Blake Philbrook (Tujunga, CA)**, who is coming off of shoulder soreness from the fall. The West Coast native has the

potential to be one of the top pitchers in the league, when healthy. He could give the Beacons a shot in the arm with a late-season return and be primed for the post-season, while sophomore **Anthony Lauretto (Pembroke, MA)** and junior **Derrick Plante (Medford, MA)** could also see some spot starting work as well as time out of the pen. Lauretto is a transfer from Eastern Nazarene, where he made eight appearances and walked just one batter out of 28 faced, while putting together a 4.05 ERA. Plante made three starts a year ago, while owning a 2-0 mark to go with a 4.86 ERA in 16 2/3 innings of work. Freshman **Brendan Healy (Westfield, MA)** give UMB another potential lefty starter, who could see time in non-conference contests and key innings in league tilts. The rookie has a live arm with a good fastball and can mix in a big dropping curveball to go with a change-up, while fellow southpaw **Michael Gavin (Belmont, MA)** will be called upon to face situational left-handed batters with a fastball, curveball and change-up.

Another area UMass Boston should be significantly improve in is the bullpen. Sophomore transfer **Tom Michael (Manchester, NH)** could step right in as the team's closer after fanning 83 batters to finish one strikeout shy of New River Community College's record for single-season strikeouts a year ago. The right-hander is used to the work load, throwing 64 2/3 innings last year and should be near the top in appearances for UMB. Senior **Bob Kniffen (Halifax, MA)** could also vie for time as the closer, but will also see time in the set-up role. He made 12 appearances last season and owned a 3.14 earned run average, while recording a save. A pair of freshmen will give the Beacons key middle relief as well with **Ryan Murphy (Pembroke, MA)** being counted on for significant innings. The right-hander compliments a fastball and change-up with an outstanding slider and big right-hander **Dan Rivkin (Enfield, CT)** will be tough on righties coming at them with a side-arm delivery. He should see a significant amount of innings and throws a fastball, slider and change-up.

## Catchers

UMass Boston is least experienced at the catcher position. The Beacons will have a pair of freshmen competing with a returning sophomore for the job behind the dish.

Sophomore **Steven Freeman (Salisbury, MA)** saw limited action last year in 12 games, batting .222 in nine at-bats. He receives and blocks the ball well and could also get at-bats as designated hitter. Freshman **Alnor Rodriguez (Orlando, FL)** migrates North and will compete for the starting spot as a strong defensive catcher. He also throws the ball extremely well and will bat from the right side with the ability to hit to all fields. Classmate **Joseph Priscella (Quincy, MA)** bats from the left side and hits for tremendous power. He's a solid all-around receiver and should contribute this season.

# SEASON OUTLOOK

## Infielders

The Beacons will return three starters in the infield, while entertaining healthy competition for the starting spot at third base.

Senior **Bryan Curran (Brockton, MA)** will make the move from third base to shortstop. A First Team All-Conference selection last year in his first campaign with UMass Boston, he be counted on to show that form again this season. Curran ranked among league leaders in stolen bases (14), on-base percentage (.450) and slugging percentage (.543), while tying for the team-lead with 39 runs scored. He can hit for power and average, as evidenced by his .364 output last year and should hit in the middle of the Beacons' order.

Plante made the transition to first base last year and will be the starter to open the season as well. He hit .480 over UMass Boston's final seven games to finish at .280 for the year. He's a smart player, who should be a key contributor. Soto will also see action at first base, after moving from the outfield. In first year as a full-time hitter to go along with his pitching, Soto was the team's top run-producer with 30 runs batted in to go with a .281 batting mark and a .418 slugging average. He should bat in the middle of the line-up and will also see time as a designated hitter to give UMB a powerful left-handed bat. Andriano will also look for time at first base. The rookie is good around the bag and swings the bat well from the left side.



Ryan Oshima seized the chance to start at second base last year and will be there again in 2007.

Sophomore **Ryan Oshima (La Jolla, CA)** will assume full-time duties at second base after becoming the regular midway through last season. The middle infielder batted .253 and swiped 11 bases in as many attempts. He's got good speed and runs well on the bases and could serve as a catalyst near the top of the order or at the bottom as a table-setter. Freshman **Doug Anglin (Milton, MA)** will back-up at second base and is a very

hard worker with good knowledge of the game. He should improve and contribute more as the season progresses.

Sophomore **Stephen Garcia (Chelsea, MA)** will battle a pair of newcomers for time at third base. The Beacons' lone returner at the hot corner saw action in 13 games last season. He has soft hands and a strong throwing arm and has shown continued improvement from last year. Dorval saw action at third base for Mount Holyoke last year and is a very strong hitter, who would hit in the middle of the UMass Boston line-up. He

can hit to all fields with power and for high average and could also get at-bats as the DH. Freshman **Steve Bowers (Portland, OR)** will also vie for time at third base and can also play the middle infield. He is a very good offensive player, who handles the bat well and can hit for power.

## Outfielders

The Beacons' outfield looks to be very strong with the return of their All-Conference centerfielder and a healthy right fielder, who was enjoying an All-Conference caliber campaign before going down with an injury.

Senior **Bob Kniffen (Halifax, MA)** will patrol center field for UMass Boston after posting a career-year that saw him nip the school's single-season mark for hits with 57, en-route to a .339 batting mark. He started all 37 games from the lead-off spot and 18 bases, while knocking in 24 runs and scoring 39 times. He is one of the best outfielders in the region and should solidify the Beacons' outfield defense. Returning in right field will be senior

**Sean Ketterer (Plymouth, MA)**, who led the squad with a robust .372 batting average and .543 slugging percentage, despite missing 11 games with a fractured wrist. He will be one of the team's top offensive threats and will bat in the clean-up spot and is a strong outfielder with good speed, range and a very good arm.

Sophomore **Chris Oram (Lynn, MA)** returns for his second year after seeing action in 27 games a year ago. He has shown great improvement from last year and will vie for the starting spot in left field. He's a

solid all-around outfielder, has good speed and can spray the ball to all fields at the plate. Junior **Dan Ciocca (Natick, MA)** is a transfer from Massachusetts Bay Community College and is very poised and has excellent power at the plate. He should vie for time in the outfield and could also get some at-bats at designated hitter. Michael will also seek time in the outfield when not pitching. He's a good offensive player, who runs the bases well and can hit to all fields. Junior **Mike Power (Dedham, MA)** is also a transfer from Mass Bay Community College and will look for time at the corner outfield spots and will also be used off the bench as a pinch runner. Freshman **Matt Pierson (Nampa, ID)** and junior **Grant Emde (Cohasset, MA)** will also look for time in the outfield. Pierson has good speed and can hit to all fields, while Emde is returning to the game after taking a few years away in the US Marine Corps, but played two seasons of college ball at Roger Williams University in 1999 & 2000.

In just 10 seasons as a baseball-playing entity, the Little East Conference can already stake a claim to being the most competitive Division III baseball conference in the nation.

The conference has produced three of the last eight NCAA Division III national champions, with University of Southern Maine capturing the 1997 title and Eastern Connecticut State University winning the honor in 1998 and in 2002. The league also produced the 1998 national player of the year and sent three teams to the NCAA tournament in 1997 and 1998. In four of the past six seasons, the LEC saw two teams advance to the national tournament.

Although the three NCAA championships legitimized the baseball-playing arm of the conference, the Little East has long been recognized as a formidable alignment in other sports.

The conference was formed in 1986, with the notion of forming a basketball-playing league that would secure automatic bids to the NCAA Division III men's and women's basketball championships — a goal that was achieved in the 1988-89 season.

Since then, the conference has evolved to include baseball, softball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's tennis, women's volleyball, field hockey, men's and women's lacrosse and men's and women's indoor and outdoor track.

The conference consists of University of Massachusetts Boston, Eastern Connecticut State University, Keene State College, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, University of Southern Maine and Western Connecticut State University.

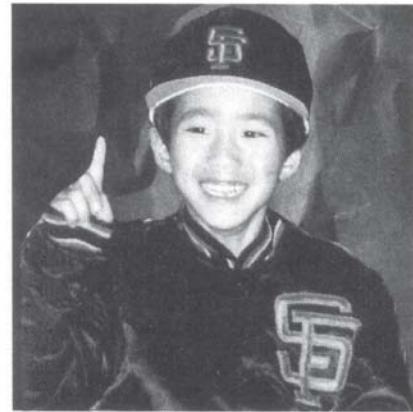

# THIS IS UMASS BOSTON

2007  
Season

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 11,862 students in the 2005-2006 academic year, with 8,958 undergraduate students and 2,904 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 34 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment. More than 90 languages are spoken in the homes of members of the 2004 graduating class.

UMass Boston's graduate school and six colleges offer over 100 undergraduate majors, minors, and programs of study, and nearly 61 graduate programs, including 14 at the doctoral level., while the university's 30 institutes and centers are actively involved in research and public service in the areas of public policy; gerontology; media; labor; women in politics; African-American, Latino, and Asian issues; and environmental concerns. More than 280 active research and training grants attracted a total \$35.6 million in external funds—a new record of success—for the fiscal year 2004-05. Comparing five-year averages shows the amount awarded UMass Boston increased a remarkable 70% between 2001 and 2005. The university employs 821 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Instructional Technology Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena



that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the 331,000-square-foot Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The campus' new "front entrance" opened in April of 2004.

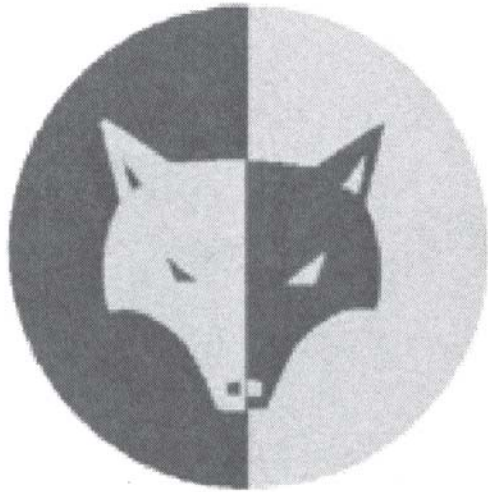

We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab--a fully equipped facility open exclusively to UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

## Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

Shannon Soares, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. Shannon's credentials include a stint with Dennis-Yarmouth High School as its head athletic trainer and two summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.

## Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.

# CLARK ATHLETIC CENTER

2007  
Season

The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 16 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative room and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.



Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-

sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.



The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world. The complex has also doubled as a concert venue, hosting multiple-Grammy winning artist Kanye West in 2006.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.

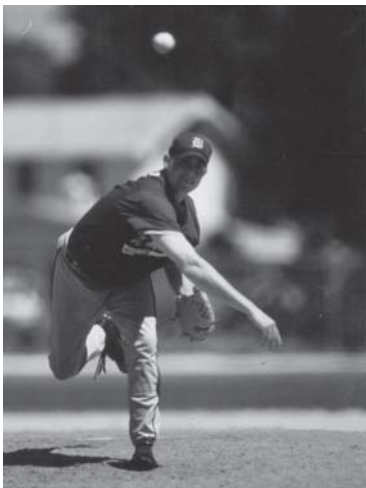

# UMASS BOSTON IN THE COMMUNITY <sup>2007</sup> Season

Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 16 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- **More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.**
- **Over 150,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.**
- **UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.**
- **In 2005 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the eighth straight year.**
- **UMass Boston was named "Honorable Mention" by the National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators/Jostens in the category of *An Array of Projects or Activities*.**

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last twenty years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 14 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 15.7 million hours of community service.

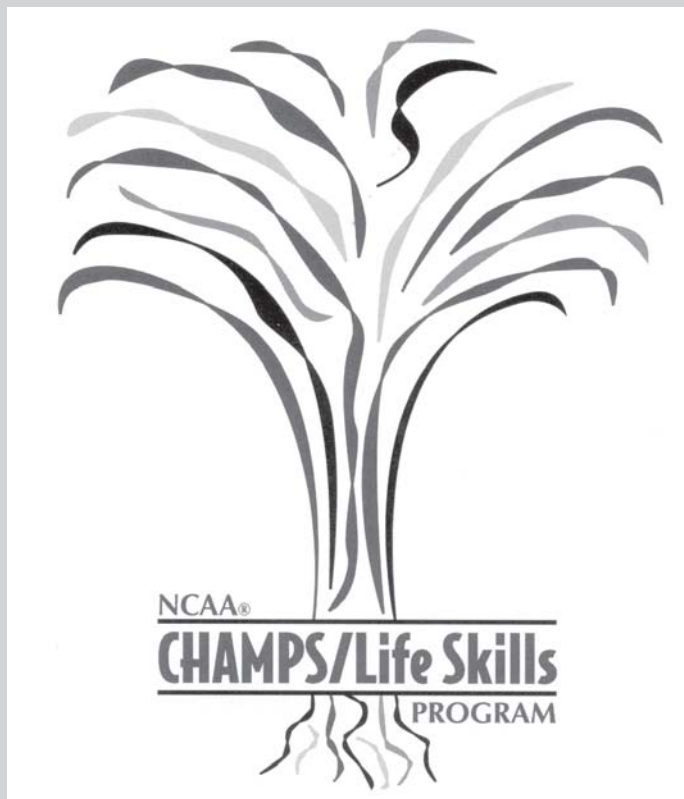

## NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

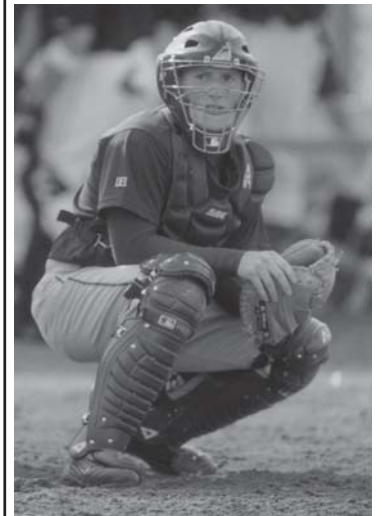
