## Directions to UMass Boston

### From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

### From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

### From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.

## MICHAEL BERTONI



### Head Coach

UMass Boston 2002  
Second Season

Michael Bertoni begins his first full season as the Beacons' Head Coach. He served as the Beacons' interim head coach for the final 13 games of the 2003-04 season, after taking over for head coach Jack Foley on January 16, when Foley took a medical leave of absence from the program.

Bertoni wasted no time in establishing his presence as UMass Boston's mentor with a near upset of Norwich University in just his second game as the Beacons' leader on January 17. Bertoni's Beacons dressed just 14 players and took an early 1-0 lead over the nation's number one team and held Norwich scoreless for the second period to mark just the fifth time that the Cadets had failed to score a goal in a period up to that point in the season. Norwich didn't take a lead until 46 minutes into the contest and eventually pulled out a 4-2 victory. NU Head Coach Mike McShane lauded UMass Boston as its toughest opponent to that point of the season, following the game.

Bertoni will be counted on to inspire the Beacons' to a complete turn-around from the previous three seasons that have seen the program struggle. The Franklin, MA native was an assistant coach for UMass Boston during the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons, prior to his appointment to the interim head role this past season. The former forward has known no other college program than the Beacons', having played four seasons at the Harbor campus in addition to his coaching stint. In his



time at UMass Boston, Bertoni saw action in 83 games and was team captain during his senior campaign. He racked up 30 career points, but was known more for his heart and soul as he was for his talent with UMB. His work ethic and dedication served as the example for his teammates. The UMass Boston standout was rewarded for his hard work during his senior year with the Strength and Conditioning Athlete of the Year Award.

Bertoni's prep career was spent starring for Franklin High School as a four-year letterwinner. He earned the Most Dedicated Senior Award in his final year with the Panthers.

A 2002 graduate of UMass Boston with a bachelor's degree in physical education, Bertoni is currently pursuing a master's degree in special education. He has also gained valuable experience teaching physical education in the Boston public school system.

# COACHING STAFF



## GREG KUTCHMA



### Assistant Coach

Lebanon Valley College 2002

Greg Kutchma begins his first season on the UMass Boston staff and is very familiar with hockey at the NCAA Division III level.

Kutchma was a captain for the Lebanon Valley College squad, where he enjoyed a four-year career in Annville, PA. A forward with the Flying Dutchmen, he was one of the top scorers in school history, tallying 116 points on 60 goals and 56 assists in 101 career games. His total of 24 goals as a freshman rank as the third-most in school history for a season.

Upon the end of his collegiate playing career, Kutchma stayed on the ice as a professional, playing one season for the Flint Generals of the United Hockey League.

Kutchma played his prep hockey at Bishop McCort High School in Johnstown, PA, before moving on to Lebanon Valley College, where he earned a degree in English in 2002.

He now resides in Medford, MA.

## CRAIG PASTER



### Assistant Coach

UMass Boston 2004

The former UMass Boston goaltender begins his first season as an assistant coach with the Beacons. Craig Paster minded the net for UMB for four seasons and will serve as UMass Boston's goaltending coach.

Paster took over the reigns as the Beacons' primary goaltender as a sophomore and went on to see action in 57 games to rank third all-time at the Harbor campus. The two-time team Most Valuable Player ranks second in school annals in career saves with 1,867 and holds the single-game mark with 63.

When not playing for UMass Boston, Paster also spent time as a coach for the USA Hockey satellite program.

Paster enjoyed an outstanding high school career, playing three years of hockey at Thayer Academy, while helping the Tigers to the 1996 and 1998 ISL championship. He also played three years of baseball at Thayer and has served as an assistant coach for the Westwood American Legion baseball nine.

Paster graduated from UMass Boston in 2004 with a degree in history and currently resides in Quincy, MA.

In Head Coach Michael Bertoni's first full year as UMass Boston's mentor, he heads onto the ice with a team that is looking for a fresh start. The Beacons will have 16 freshman suit up for them this season and just nine returners from last year's edition. With new personnel comes new perspective and hopes and UMass Boston needs an infusion of different outlooks after struggling in recent times.

## Forward

The Beacons will be young at every position this season, but there are some veterans, who should make significant impacts as well.

Senior **Patrick Donlan (Norwell, MA)** led the squad with 13 goals a year ago and will be counted on to use his speed to create offense on the transition and should be one of the better forwards in ECAC East. Sophomore **Steve Kelleher (Rockland, MA)** had a nice rookie campaign last year for UMB, tallying 21 points on six goals and 15 assists to rank second on the team. He will be looked at as one of the Beacons' leaders and is one of the better skilled forwards in the league. Returning to the fold is junior **Julian Giantonio (Everett, MA)**, who took a year away from playing last season, but should add to the UMass Boston scoring punch. He ranked second on the team as a freshman with 22 points and will look to use his size and regain his form as one of the team's best scoring threats.

**Aaron Olsen (Norfolk, MA)** and **Jason Wiseley (Cherry Hill, NJ)** add to the veteran presence at forward. Olsen will be looked at to use his speed and tenacity to create turnovers and Wiseley will provide leadership on and off the ice. He is one of the hardest working players on the team and

should push everyone else.

**Dave Baczkowski (Lancaster, MA)** is one of eight freshman forwards for the Beacons. He should make an immediate impact and will see time on special teams. He owns a quick, hard shot and drives to the net well. **Chris Flaherty (South Boston, MA)** should step right in and play a regular shift at forward. He has exceptional hands, which will allow him to make plays. **Ryan Kelleher (Haverhill, MA)** possesses the skills needed to compete in ECAC East and should help create offense for UMass Boston and **Kyle Simpson (Scituate, MA)** should be able to make plays and use his relentless pursuit to apply pressure. **(Rick Tennyson (Hingham, MA))** will also see time on the penalty kill and has good speed, while **Erik Riffe (South Berwick, ME)** is a quick skater, who will try and create turnovers on the ice. Included in the Beacons' first-year class are a pair of second semester additions. **Dominic DiMarzo (East Boston, MA)** should be an impact player, who will be one of the better freshman in ECAC East. He sees the ice extremely well and should see time on special teams. **Mark Bates (Medford, MA)** will provide UMass Boston with a physical presence and is a big, strong forward, who can create offense around the net.

## Defenseman

The Beacons lose one of the best defenseman in Division III from last season, but return three veterans, including a pair of seniors.

**Dan Noonan (Burlington, MA)** enters his fourth season with UMass Boston and will see time as a full-time blueliner. He has good hands and his skating ability will make him an asset on the power play. **Jason McDonald (Dorchester, MA)** provides the Beacons a big presence on the defense. His 6'5" frame should serve to intimidate opponents and his reach will give him an advantage on the ice. He will be looking to have a big year. **Brian Margetts (Hingham, MA)** has good hands, is a great team player and will bring a physical presence to the team. He could also see time at forward.

To UMass Boston's advantage, the freshmen manning the blue line are very talented and primed to step right in and contribute right away. **Andrew Ward (Evanston, IL)** is extremely poised with the puck and has the potential to be one of the best defenseman in the league in years to come. **Ben Leazott (Franklin, MA)** is a strong skater, who will see significant time on the ice and should develop into one of the league's better defensemen. **Hunter Dowd**

**(Brick, NJ)** will be asked to take on a starting role immediately and is a tough, hard-working player, who will see time on special teams. **Tim Recio (Pittsburgh, PA)** should prove to be a valuable piece to the Beacons defense and should be very effective at shutting down opponents' top units. **Mark Ingram (Paisley, Scotland)** could see time at both forward and defense. His strong work ethic should earn him time on the checking line. **Jon Hutcheon**

**(Billerica, MA)** will add to UMass Boston's depth at defense when he joins the team for the second semester. He should make an immediate impact with his aggressive style of play.

## Goaltender

The Beacons are somewhat of an unknown entity at goaltender. They return sophomore **Sean Bertoni (Franklin, MA)**, who saw action in 11 games last year in his first season. He compiled a 5.89 goals against average in 560 minutes of action, while stopping 308 shots for an .848 save percentage. He has shown great improvement and should be the team's top goaltender. Freshman **Buddy Johnson (Pembroke, MA)** will add to the mix, after joining the team for the second semester. He should step in right away and earn starting assignments. He's big and strong and owns a deceptive style. Freshman **Terrence Sullivan (Littleton, MA)** will also join UMass Boston for the second term and will vie for action in net. He has quick reflexes and will look to improve.

# ECAC EAST



Home to 12 of the most prestigious ice hockey programs in the nation, the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) is a conference filled with tradition, legendary players, coaches and administrators and a bright and exciting future.

In terms of tradition, no conference can lay claim to the history of the ECAC.

The birthplace of collegiate ice hockey, member institutions have been sponsoring the sport for nearly a century. On February 1, 1896 in Baltimore, Maryland, Yale faced Johns Hopkins in the first collegiate ice hockey game. Two years later on January 19, 1898, Brown defeated Harvard in Boston in the first college hockey game between schools still sponsoring the sport.

From a team standpoint, Cornell (1969-70) stands as the only team in NCAA ice hockey history to produce a perfect unbeaten and untied record en route to the Division I men's title. The Big Red posted a mark of 29-0-0 under coach Ned Harkness, a Hockey Hall of Fame inductee in 1994.

On the ice, legendary players such as Princeton's Hobart Amory Hare "Hobey" Baker, Cornell goaltending sensation Ken Dryden, who led the National Hockey League's Montreal Canadiens to five Stanley Cups, and Clarkson's Dave Taylor, who starred with the NHL's Los Angeles Kings, are among the numerous standouts who made their mark in the conference.

The ECAC East is comprised of 10 teams, including Division II Saint Anselm College and Saint Michael's College. ECAC East plays an interlocking schedule with the New England Small College Athletic Conference. Each game played within this schedule is counted as a conference contest. Each school will play every school once during the regular season, but each conference will have a separate post-season tournament. All Division III teams will qualify for the tournament.

# THIS IS UMASS BOSTON



The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 12,719 students in the 2002-2003 academic year, with 10,071 undergraduate students and 2,648 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 31 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment.

UMass Boston's five colleges offer 73 undergraduate majors, 30 master's programs, and 14 doctoral programs, while the university's 12 institutes and centers are actively involved in research, professional public service and community outreach. More than 290 active research and training grants attracted \$30.5 million in external funds for the fiscal year 2003. The university employs 850 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Learning Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight



machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the Campus Center — a \$50 million project which opened in April of 2004 and centralizes student services and activities.

## Academic Advising

At UMass Boston we prepare our students for life.

And because the life of a college student can be much more challenging than a basketball game or a soccer match, the UMass Boston athletic department provides you with the means to be successful in whatever sport you play, and also in the game of life.

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We make sure that our students are not solely concerned with maintaining athletic eligibility. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab—a fully equipped facility open exclusively to

UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

## Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.



A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and she continues to spend the summer working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.

## Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.

The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 13 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's

building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six

25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative and combative rooms and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural

programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began

hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.

The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.



Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- **More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.**
- **Over 100,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.**
- **UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.**
- **In 2003 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the sixth straight year.**

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last eighteen years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 11.4 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 12.5 million hours of community service.

There is no one way to conduct school outreach programs. It is clear from the great work done by NCAS members that there are many ways to provide quality programs. Their diversity and contributions to our nation is extraordinary.

## NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. Presently, 323 institutions and six conference offices now participate in this NCAA supported life skills program. The NCAA mission of CHAMPS/Life Skills is "committed to a comprehensive program that provides educational experience and services in order to develop well balanced lifestyles for student-athletes; to encourage growth in decision making, planning and fulfillment of career and life goals."

The CHAMPS/Life Skills program will be presented this year at UMB through the development of workshops/guest speakers that address identified life skill needs in the five commitment areas of this program.

As part of our membership in CHAMPS/Life Skills, each year one of four student athlete nominees will attend the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference.

## STUDENT ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student athlete representatives from each of UMass Boston's teams. The purpose of the organization is to promote all UMB sports and provide student athletes an opportunity to impact those issues that affect their daily lives.

SAAC is the student athlete's voice and their vehicle to implement new ideas and influence positive change to enhance the student-athlete experience at UMass Boston.

Members of each team will nominate and select an eligible student athlete to represent their sport on the SAAC. An alternate will also be selected, in the event that the designated representative cannot attend a meeting. It is expected that each team will be represented at every scheduled meeting/event.

Throughout the year, student athletes are encouraged to communicate ideas and concerns to the respective representative of their sport.



## The Codfish Bowl

Considered the premier Division III hockey tournament in the country, the Codfish Bowl is the second-oldest invitational in the nation.

The Codfish Bowl hockey tournament originated on Huntington Avenue with Boston State College. Boston State athletic director James "Gus" Sullivan and hockey coach Ed Barry formed the event in 1965 with the intent to provide small schools in the area a tournament to display their talents. The two named the tournament after the state fish, the cod, and the hockey gala was born.

Boston State won the first five tournaments and captured six of the first seven titles. Following the merger of Boston State with UMass Boston in 1982, the tournament has been a part of the Beacon tradition for the last 16 years, in which time it has evolved into a showcase for Division III hockey.

Adding to the prestige of the Codfish Bowl is the legacy of great performances throughout the tournament's history. Several of the key performers in past Codfish games have gone on to success in the professional ranks as well. Boston State goaltender Bill Berglund earned two consecutive Most Valuable Player awards in the tournament before moving on to the World Hockey League. Dick Lamby of Salem State won MVP honors on his way to the Olympic Games, the St. Louis Blues and the New York Rangers. Lowell's Craig MacTavish was the MVP of the 1978 tournament, and he went on to win Stanley Cups with the Edmonton Oilers and New York Rangers. Hubie McDonough, meanwhile, won MVP honors for Saint Anselm in 1984 before taking his game to the New York Islanders and San Jose Sharks.

In addition to the personalities, the Codfish Bowl has seen equally memorable moments. Longtime followers of the tournament will never forget Dick Kelly's end-to-end rush in 1969 as Boston State edged Merrimack to win its fifth straight title. UMass Boston fans will remember Scott Duffy's double-overtime goal against eventual national champion Babson in the 1983 championship game and Mike Snuggs' 32-save shutout in 1997 to help return the bowl to the Harbor Campus. Ryan Equale of Connecticut ended the longest game in tournament history when he scored with seven seconds remaining in double overtime to give the Huskies their first title. And who can forget the 1986 tournament, in which all four games were decided in overtime.

## Nickname and Colors

Looking to establish an identity for UMass Boston's athletic program, the athletic department staff selected Beacons as the University nickname, and royal blue and white as the school colors in the mid-1970s.

The nickname was chosen because UMass Boston sits on Boston Harbor, where lighthouses dot the coastline. The most renowned lighthouse in Boston Harbor, or the rest of the country for that matter, is Boston Light. Located at the entrance to the harbor, the structure has guided ships to safe harbor since first illuminating its beacon in 1716. The British destroyed Boston Light in 1776, but Governor John Hancock had the lighthouse rebuilt in 1781.

On September 23, 2002, UMass Boston introduced a "new" Beacon and changed its colors to Beacon Blue, Black and White.

**SPORTS MEDIA RELATIONS OFFICE** The UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office is located on the lower level of the Clark Athletic Center. The phone number is (617) 287-7815; the fax number is (617) 287-7840; you can reach Director of Sports Media Relations, Alan Wickstrom, by e-mail as well at alan.wickstrom@umb.edu.

**PRESS ROW FACILITIES** Space in the UMass Boston ice hockey press box is extremely limited, with priority given to game personnel. Media members requesting space in the press box are advised to make arrangements with UMass Boston Sports Media Relations Director, Alan Wickstrom, as early as possible.

**CREDENTIALS** Media members wishing to obtain credentials to UMass Boston ice hockey games must notify the Sports Media Relations office at least one day in advance of the requested game. Photographers who wish to shoot from the penalty box must make prior arrangements with the Sports Media Relations Director. Media members working in the penalty box assume the responsibility for all risks.

**RADIO** Radio stations wishing to broadcast UMass Boston ice hockey games must make arrangements with the Sports Media Relations office at least two weeks prior to the requested game. Telephone lines will be supplied by the University, provided the requested notice is given. All calls will be made on a collect or calling card basis.

**MEDIA PARKING** Media members should park in the upper level of the University's parking garage. Parking passes will be made available to media members who request them in advance.

**PRESS ROW SERVICES** The UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office will provide team rosters, pregame statistics and the ECAC East weekly report prior to the game. Shot totals will be distributed after each period and a complete box score will be available after the game.

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS** A 10-minute cooling off period, recommended by the NCAA, will be strictly enforced, after which UMass Boston Head Coach Michael Bertoni and selected players will be made available to media members. Postgame interviews will be conducted in the rink area near the locker room door.

**PLAYER INTERVIEWS** Interviews other than those immediately following a game must be arranged through the UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office. The Sports Media Relations Director will see that all reasonable requests are met, and a time will be arranged so as not to interfere with the student's academic schedule.

**MEDIA WORK ROOM** The Clark Athletic Center office will be open following games for media wishing to file postgame reports. There is ample work space with power outlets and telephones.

**POSTGAME FAXES** The Sports Media Relations office will fax a complete box score and game story to media outlets upon request. Requests should be made prior to the game.
