Directions to UMass Boston

From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.



MYLES BERRY
HEAD COACH
FIFTH SEASON

Myles Berry is entering his fifth season as the Beacons' Head Soccer Coach.

The UMass Boston mentor was named the 2006 Little East Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Beacons to an 11-7-1 record, including a semi-finals appearance in the Little East Conference Tournament. Berry saw four of his players earn LEC All-Star accolades, including three on the first team as well as a pair of All-Region honorees.

In 2005, he led the squad to its first winning season since 1999 with an 8-7-1 mark, which made UMass Boston eligible for the ECAC New England Tournament.

Berry is not unfamiliar to the Beacons' soccer scene, holding the distinction as UMass Boston's first-ever Head Women's Soccer Coach from 1995-97. He still holds the UMB record for coaching wins in women's soccer with 16.

Prior to his arrival to the Harbor campus, Berry coached next door, guiding the boys' soccer squad at Boston College High School as the Eagles' Head Coach for 12 seasons from 1980-1991. During his time at BC High, he posted a 104-58-38 record and led the Eagles to a pair of Catholic Conference Championships as well as eight state tournament appearances.

Berry played his collegiate soccer at Boston College, where he was a defensive starter under three different head coaches.

Not only has the longtime UMass Boston coach excelled on the soccer sidelines, but he was also the Beacons' Men's Lacrosse coach for 20 seasons and compiled 152 victories to rank 23rd on the NCAA's all-time list.

He resides in Quincy, MA with his wife, Ginny, and his 18-year old son Myles.

Rick McCann enters his fifth season on Coach Berry's staff at UMass Boston.

Prior to joining the sidelines as a coach for the Beacons, McCann was one of the best goalies in UMass Boston soccer history, posting a single-season record 0.90 goals against average in 1995 and ranks second all-time with a career goals against mark of 1.37. McCann also stands second on the Beacons' career save percentage list with a mark of .818 and registered an .846 efficiency figure in 1995 for the third-best percentage in the program's history.

The Quincy, MA native also ranks on the UMass Boston career list for matches played (ninth with 22), minutes played (ninth with 2,036), shutouts (tied for fourth with six) and victories (tied for ninth with nine).

Prior to his collegiate playing career with the Beacons, he played two seasons at Massasoit Community College and was a standout at North Quincy High School.

He earned a degree in criminal justice from UMass Boston in 1997.

The 2007 Beacons come off one of the best seasons in school history and return the core of that successful team. UMass Boston not only enjoyed a fine record last year, but the quality of its wins were very impressive, defeating a pair of regionally ranked teams on the road and having its season decided by penalty kicks in the Little East Conference semifinals.

The team features nine seniors and four juniors, including nine upperclassmen from last season.

Forwards

The Beacons' offense will generate from the midfield, but the presence of its forwards will certainly be significant. UMass Boston boasts an experienced junior as well as a pair of newcomers, who could make an impact.

Junior **Henry Marin (Haverhill, MA)** started four of 14 matches last year and has great touch around the net. A proven goal scorer, as evidenced by his team-leading 10 goals in 2005, Marin should see a lot of time and be counted upon to put the ball in the back of the net.

Freshman **Ludji Chipps (Port AuPrince, Haiti)** has great size, speed and athletic ability and could be a force right away for the Beacons. His size and ability to score should pose problems for the opposition. Sophomore **Luis Vasquez (Cambridge, MA)** is a transfer from Dean College and has good athletic ability and speed and should provide depth up front.

Midfield

UMass Boston's strength will undoubtedly lie in the midfield with the return of an All-Region performer and five seniors, including three in their fourth campaign with the Beacons.

Junior **Romeo Zeqo (Medford, MA)** enjoyed a career-year as one of the top players in the region. A tremendous, all-around player, Zeqo led the team with 23 points and 10 goals and ranked third among conference players in both

categories on way to being named to the D3kicks.com Northeast Region First Team as well as a Little East Conference First Team All-Star. He is joined by senior **Maynor Sanchez (Boston, MA)**, who is a dangerous offensive player with the ability to take anyone one-on-one. He will be looked upon to increase his scoring output from last season.

Classmate **Guilherme Goncalves (Medford, MA)** was named a Co-Captain and will provide valuable leadership on and off the field, while serving as a ball distributor on the field. He ranked third among Little East Conference leaders with six assists and possesses the ball very well. Senior **Emile Pierre-Louis (Medford, MA)** provides the Beacons with an offensive weapon, consisting of both tremendous speed and a strong shot and should be an very capable scorer. Senior **Stew Tracy (Belfair, WA)** returns for his second season and should be an integral part of the midfield as one of the most complete players on the team. He can play any position on the field and should make everyone around him better.

A number of newcomers should also help UMass Boston, starting with freshman **Alex Cavallero (Lenox, MA)**, who has outstanding potential. He's a big, strong player with a tireless work ethic and should make an impact in either the midfield or the backfield. Senior **Levon Tebelekian (Glendale, CA)** has very good technical ability and experience and should find playing time right away. Freshmen **Kyle Wing (Isanti, MN)** and **Jason LaFlam (Salisbury, VT)** should both make significant contributions for the Beacons this year. Wing is a smart player, who should fill multiple roles, using his quickness and athletic ability, while

LaFlam is a tough, hard-working player with good quickness, who should also make a bid for starting minutes on the field. Sophomore **Johnny Ramirez (Hudson, MA)** and **Norman Jiménez (Boston, MA)** could also vie for time on the field and provide depth for UMass Boston. Ramirez has good technical ability and speed and Jiménez is an aggressive player with a great attitude.

Backfield

The Beacons graduated a key member of their backfield, but return with both experience and the addition of some talented newcomers.

Senior **Anthony Cataldo (Everett, MA)** has started in all four seasons at UMass Boston and is a tough, aggressive player with the ability to play in the offense, if needed, while classmate **Carlos Cabral (Dorchester, MA)** should see time in a starting role this season. He's a very good defender and excellent in one-on-one situations. Sophomore **Terence Reardon (Hanover, MA)** will start at the stopper position and reads the game very well. He's a tough player with good skills and can also contribute in the attack. Junior **Herald Nikollara (Brighton, MA)** is an aggressive and tough defender, who will compete for a starting spot, while junior **Pat O'Connell (Dartmouth, MA)** is a tough player with good ability and distributes the ball well. Sophomore defender **Jose David Grajales (Central Falls, RI)** is a transfer from Community College of Rhode Island and should be a huge part of the defense. He is a good technical player with good size and organizes the defense well. Senior **Alexandre Klein (Nandy, France)** will also be a main contributor in the backfield and reads the game really well. He an excellent ball distributor and plays with confidence.

Goalkeeper

The Beacons boast one of the top goalkeepers in the Little East Conference and should very strong at the position.

Junior **Paul Maniscalco (Hanover, MA)** is a Co-Captain and was named a Little East Conference Second Team All-Star for the second straight season after posting a 1.47 goals against average and .795 save percentage to rank fifth in the LEC.

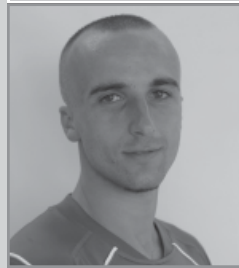

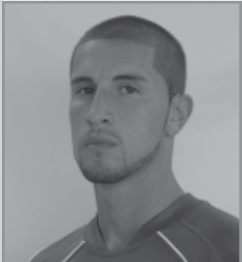

2007 SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP

The Little East Conference officially began on April 28, 1986 as a playing conference for men's and women's basketball among six New England institutions: Eastern Connecticut State University, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth (formerly Southeastern Massachusetts University), the University of Massachusetts Boston and the University of Southern Maine. From the beginning the conference was officially recognized by the NCAA.

The number of sports contested in the conference has grown to include men's and women's soccer, baseball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track, men's and women's outdoor track, men's and women's lacrosse, softball, men's and women's tennis, volleyball and field hockey, as well as the original men's and women's basketball. The number of participating institutions rose to seven with the addition of Western Connecticut State University in 1993-94 and then to eight for the 1997-98 year as Keene State College joined.

Along with planning for the inclusion of new sports within the conference, the LEC's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field programs are participating in an innovative joint program with the MASCAC conference to determine New England Alliance championships. Events contested are scored within each conference and for the Alliance as well.

The LEC recognizes the advantages of combining with other conferences which allows teams with lower numbers of participants to join forces and compete at a full-team level. It is likely there will be additional sports contested within the Alliance over time.

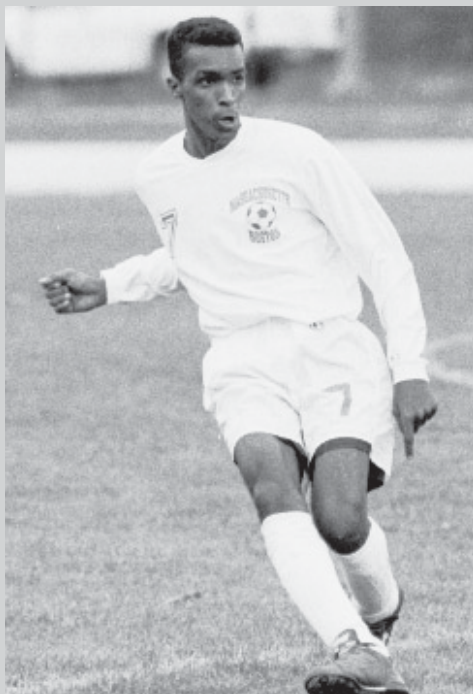

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 12,362 students in the 2006-2007 academic year, with 9,246 undergraduate students and 3,116 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 36 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment. More than 90 languages are spoken in the homes of members of the 2007 graduating class.

UMass Boston's graduate school and six colleges offer over 100 undergraduate majors, minors, and programs of study, and nearly 61 graduate programs, including 14 at the doctoral level., while the university's 30 institutes and centers are actively involved in research and public service in the areas of public policy; gerontology; media; labor; women in politics; African-American, Latino, and Asian issues; and environmental concerns. More than 280 active research and training grants attracted a total \$35.6 million in external funds—a new record of success—for the fiscal year 2004-05. Comparing five-year averages shows the amount awarded UMass Boston increased a remarkable 70% between 2001 and 2005. The university employs 815 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Instructional Technology Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for



intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the 331,000-square-foot Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The campus' new "front entrance" opened in April of 2004.

Sports Medicine

Shannon Soares, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. Shannon's credentials include a stint with Dennis-Yarmouth High School as its head athletic trainer and two summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.

Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.



The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 16 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat



basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative room and a

sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities

are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA.



The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.

The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world. The complex has also doubled as a concert venue, hosting multiple-Grammy winning artist Kanye West in 2006.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.



Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well—service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- **More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.**
- **Over 2,500 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.**
- **UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.**
- **In 2005 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the eighth straight year.**
- **UMass Boston was named "Honorable Mention" by the National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators/Jostens in the category of *An Array of Projects or Activities in 2005*.**

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last 21 years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 15.3 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 16.6 million hours of community service.

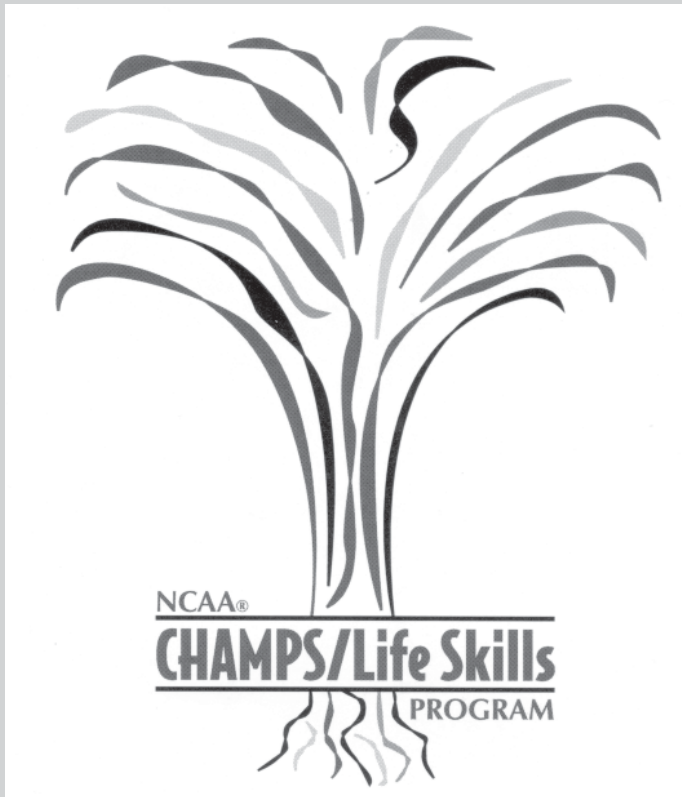

NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. Presently, 323 institutions and six conference offices now participate in this NCAA supported life skills program. The NCAA mission of CHAMPS/Life Skills is "committed to a comprehensive program that provides educational experience and services in order to develop well balanced lifestyles for student-athletes; to encourage growth in decision making, planning and fulfillment of career and life goals."

The CHAMPS/Life Skills program will be presented this year at UMB through the development of workshops/guest speakers that address identified life skill needs in the five commitment areas of this program.

As part of our membership in CHAMPS/Life Skills, each year one of four student athlete nominees will attend the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference.

STUDENT ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student athlete representatives from each of UMass Boston's teams. The purpose of the organization is to promote all UMB sports and provide student athletes an opportunity to impact those issues that affect their daily lives.

SAAC is the student athlete's voice and their vehicle to implement new ideas and influence positive change to enhance the student-athlete experience at UMass Boston.

Members of each team will nominate and select an eligible student athlete to represent their sport on the SAAC. An alternate will also be selected, in the event that the designated representative cannot attend a meeting. It is expected that each team will be represented at every scheduled meeting/event.

Throughout the year, student athletes are encouraged to communicate ideas and concerns to the respective representative of their sport.
