A Tune-up for the NCAA Regional Junior **Sarah Shapiro (Weymouth, MA)** finished 31st overall with a time of 23:36 to lead the Beacons at the ECAC Championship in Waterford, CT on Saturday.

Shapiro was the top UMass Boston finisher in the six-kilometer run. She finished 1:50 behind the first place finisher.

Senior **Emily P. Schwan (Albany, NY)** clocked in with a time of 25:27 to take 97th place overall, while junior **Rebecca G. Perry's (Topsfield, MA)** time of 27:36 was good for 157th place overall. Junior **Rachel Gazda (Springfield, MA)** finished 175th overall with a time of 28:45,

For the UMass Boston men, sophomore **Michael Leavitt (Brockton, MA)** placed 59th overall in the eight kilometer race, with a time of 27:05 and freshman **Ryan Norton (Walpole, MA)** crossed the line in 177th place with a time of 29:33. Junior **Thy Toeum (Somerville, MA)** rounded out the Beacons' results with a 258th place showing and a time of 37:18.

A Win, the Wait and the End

The Beacons finished their regular-season with a 2-1 victory over host Saint Joseph's College (ME) last Monday. The win gave UMass Boston a .500 or better record to make them eligible for the ECAC playoffs, but unfortunately, after a week of waiting to find out, the team did not receive a bid.

The Beacons scored twice in less than five minutes to provide enough offense for a 2-1 victory over host Saint Joseph's College (ME), in Standish, ME on Monday, October 31.

Freshman forward **Henry Marin (Haverhill, MA)** put UMass Boston on the board after taking a cross from sophomore midfielder **Guilherme Goncalves (Medford, MA)** and netting his 10th goal of the season at 54:45 of the second half. The Beacons wasted no time to increase their lead when freshman defender **Romeo Zeqo**

(Malden, MA) netted an unassisted goal just 4:43 later at 59:28 to give UMB a 2-0 advantage.

Saint Josephs cut the deficit in half with just 7:07 left in the match, but it would be the end of the scoring for the day as UMass Boston held on.

Freshman goalkeeper **Paul Maniscalco (Boston, MA)** stopped four shots to earn the win for the Beacons.

MANISCALCO NAMED TO MEN'S SOCCER ALL-LITTLE EAST CONFERENCE SECOND TEAM

Paul Maniscalco (Boston, MA) was named to the Little East Conference Men's Soccer Second Team on November 8.

Maniscalco is selected to the squad as a goalkeeper in just his first year of collegiate soccer. The freshman finished second among all Little East Conference keepers with 99 saves and placed third in the league with 5.82 saves per contest. The Hanover High School product played every second of every match for the Beacons, posting a 2.18 goals against average in 1570 minutes of action. He also registered a .723 save percentage and recorded three shutouts. Maniscalco owned an 8-7-2 overall record, the best mark for a UMass Boston squad since the 1999 season. He posted shutouts in two of his first three collegiate matches and maintained a 0.75 GAA through the first four matches of the season. The six-foot, 180-pound rookie held the opposition to a goal or less in eight contests and also stopped seven or more shots in a game on eight occasions, including a season-high 11 saves on September 27 at Salem State College. The Little East Conference took notice of Maniscalco during the season, honoring him with the league's Defensive Player of the Week Award for the week of October 3-9. The freshman was stellar in net that week, posting a 0.90 goals against average, while allowing just two goals in 200 minutes of action. The keeper stopped 16 shots over two matches for a .889 save percentage and held University of Massachusetts Dartmouth to just one goal in 110 minutes and stopped all but one shot vs. Clark University, which was ranked number six in New England at the time.
