Tournament Time The Beacons dropped their only dual match of the week to Suffolk University, 9-0 on October 16, before heading to Providence, RI to compete in the Little East Conference Championships. The team finished in seventh place with 6.5 points.

The Beacons gained five and a half points the first day, led by senior **Aurora Lormeus (Milton, MA)**, who was seeded sixth in the Flight 1 singles bracket and defeated the number three seed from Rhode Island College, 9-7 and advanced to the semifinals where she took down the seventh seed from Bridgewater State, 7-5, 7-6 (11). Lormeus was finally beaten in the finals by the number one seed from Salem State, 7-6 (2), 6-1. Lormeus experienced success with doubles partner **Emily Johnson (Saugus, MA)**, as well, winning their first round match as the second seed at Flight 1 doubles, 8-6 over the seventh-seeded team from University of Southern Maine. Lormeus and Johnson then teamed to defeat the number three seed from Bridgewater State, 8-6, to move into the final against the first seeded team from Rhode Island College, where they were defeated 9-8 (2). Johnson was the number five seed in singles action in Flight 2, defeating the number four seed from Western Connecticut State University, 8-6, but was knocked out in the semifinals by the top seeded player from Bridgewater State.

Freshman **Brittany Engel (Freehold, NJ)** and classmate **Novita Dewi (Malang, Indonesia)** combined for UMass Boston as the number six seed in Flight 3 doubles to down the number three seeded team from Western Connecticut State, 8-5, before bowing to the second-seeded duo from Bridgewater State, 8-1, in the semifinals. Engel was defeated as the number eight seed in the first round of the Flight 4 singles bracket, 8-1, by the number one seed from Bridgewater State and was also defeated in the consolation bracket by the number five seed from UMass Dartmouth, 8-0.

UMB sophomores **Kristen Chan (Irvine, CA)** and **Katie McPherson (South Park, PA)** were defeated as the eighth seed in Flight 2 doubles by the top-seeded team from Rhode Island College, but won over the number five seed from Southern Maine in the consolation round, 8-2. Chan and McPherson were beaten in the consolation finals by sixth-seeded Salem State, 8-2. Chan lost her opening round singles match as the eighth seed in Flight 3 singles to the number one seed from Rhode Island College, 8-0 and was later beaten in the consolation bracket by the number five seed from Plymouth State University, 8-4. McPherson was defeated in her initial round match in Flight 5 singles as the number eight seed by the first seeded player from Bridgewater State, 8-0 and was then beaten in the consolation bracket by fifth-seeded player from Plymouth State, 8-4.

UMass Boston senior **Bing Nguy (Sacramento, CA)** played in the Flight 6 singles bracket as the number seven seed taking on the second seed from Bridgewater State, but fell, 8-5, before losing in the consolation bracket to the sixth seeded player from Western Connecticut State, 8-2.

Reaching New Heights UMass Boston women's soccer blanked Framingham State, 1-0, on October 18 for its fourth win of the season. The Beacons have their highest victory total since 1997, when the squad was 6-10-1. UMass Boston ended the week with a 7-0 loss in Keene, NH to Little East Conference foe Keene State on Saturday.

Sophomore midfielder **Erika Marsters (Mashpee, MA)** provided all the offense of the match vs. Framingham with her third

goal of the season at 20:26 of the first half. Sophomore forward **Kristi Morales (San Francisco, CA)** sent a cross from the right sideline into the box where classmate **Krysten Platte (Weymouth, MA)** collected the ball in front of the net and fed Marsters for the eventual game-winning tally. Framingham State had two excellent opportunities to tie the match with a pair of shots in tight with just 11 minutes to play, but junior sweeper **Katherine Wall (Arlington, MA)** blocked both of them. Despite being outshot 25-9 by the Rams, freshman keeper **Ashley McRoberts (Merrimack, NH)** and junior **Courtney Haroules (Littleton, MA)** combined to register the shutout for UMass Boston. McRoberts played the entire first half and made eight saves, while Haroules turned away four shots in the second half.

The Beacons held Keene State to just one goal in the first half, before the Owls unleashed six unanswered tallies in the second stanza. McRoberts made a season-high 16 saves for UMB.

Keeping an Even Keel

The Beacons split four matches last week, including a pair of conference contests. They dispatched of visiting Framingham State in three games, 30-27, 30-26, 30-23, on October 16. Sophomore **Kate White (Plymouth, MA)** smashed a season-high 19 kills and classmate **Natalie Crist (Santa Maria, CA)** spiked for 13 to lead the team to

its eighth straight victory. White also owned a .316 hitting percentage to go with seven digs, while Crist hit a robust .391, while serving up an ace, coming up with three digs and making a pair of blocks. Sophomore outside hitter **Megan MacAuley (Upland, CA)** led the UMass Boston defense with a match-high 15 digs to go with four kills and a block, while freshman libero **Emily Thompson (Wausau, WI)** scooped up 12 digs. Senior setter **Randle Stock (Hopkinton, MA)** set for 20 assists in two games and added seven digs and freshman setter **Alexandria Quinn (Brockton, MA)** saw action in the third game and responded with 14 assists and three digs. Senior middle hitter **Denise Hill (Sabana Seca, PR)** contributed with six kills, two digs and two blocks.

UMass Boston's win streak came to an end two nights later vs. Roger Williams, falling, 3-1. The Lady Hawks took game one of the match, 30-25 and trailed 22-17 in the second match, before going on a 6-1 run to tie the match at 23-23 and outscored UMass Boston 14-7 during the stretch to win the second game, 31-29, and grab a 2-0 lead in the match. The Beacons bounced back, in dominating fashion, with a 30-14 win in game three, but the Lady Hawks regrouped with a 30-27 win in game four to clinch the match. White put down a match-high 15 kills on a .333 hitting percentage in addition to four aces and four digs to lead UMass Boston. Crist swung for 12 kills and came up with a block, while Stock set for a match-high 43 assists and added four kills on an .800 hitting mark to go with a service ace, a block and five digs. Freshman outside hitter **Karly Sanchez (Lawrence, MA)** spiked for 11 kills and collected four digs and a block and sophomore outside hitter MacAuley chipped in with eight kills, six digs and an ace. Thompson led all players with 18 digs.

The Beacons traveled to Plymouth, NH for a Little East Conference tri-match on Saturday and dropped the first match in three games to host Plymouth State, 30-14, 30-15, 30-26, but rebounded to beat UMass Dartmouth, 23-30, 30-28, 30-28, 30-27. White led UMB vs. Plymouth State with nine kills in addition to 10 digs and a block, while Crist chipped in with six kills and a block. Thompson scooped up 15 digs to lead the defensive effort. Sanchez spiked for a team-high 14 kills vs. UMass Dartmouth, while hitting .269 and registering a pair of blocks and MacAuley smashed 13 kills on a .243 hitting mark, got down for 15 digs and stood up for a block. White and Crist each scored with 12 kills. White also added a pair of aces, five digs and a block and Crist came up with three digs and two blocks. Stock directed all of the action with 53 assists to give her 1,315 for her career at UMass Boston to move into second on the all-time career list at UMB.

Second Half Woes The Beacons didn't have much luck in the second half of their matches last week, losing to Framingham State, 5-2, on October 17 and Keene State 4-2 on Saturday.

Framingham State netted three second-half goals, including the eventual game-winner just 1:53 into the second half to defeat UMass Boston. Senior midfielder **Guilherme Goncalves (Medford, MA)** netted his second goal of the season to open the day's scoring when junior midfielder **Romeo Zeqo (Medford, MA)** found him just 2:50 into the match for a 1-0 edge. The Rams answered with 10:40 gone, but the Beacons reclaimed the lead when Zeqo and Goncalves hooked up again, in reverse roles, as Goncalves sent a cross to the right side that Zeqo put into the left corner of the net for his team-leading eighth goal of the season at the 19:49 mark of the first half to give UMB a 2-1 lead. Framingham State tied the match at 32:10 of the second half to make it 2-2. UMass Boston junior keeper **Paul Maniscalco (Hanover, MA)** made seven saves on the day.

Keene State also scored three second-half goals to get the win on Saturday. The first three and half minutes of the match saw a flurry of scoring as UMass Boston wasted no time getting on the board when senior midfielder **Emile Pierre-Louis (Medford, MA)** found freshman midfielder **Alex Cavallero (Lenox, MA)** at the left corner of the box for a wicked shot that ricocheted off the Keene State keeper and into the back of the net for his third goal of the season just 37 seconds into the match to give the Beacons a 1-0 edge. The Owls answered just 33 seconds later to knot the contest at 1-1 at the 1:10 mark of the first half. The Beacons took just under two minutes to reclaim the lead when Pierre-Louis found Goncalves at the top of the box where he ripped a shot, from 18 yards out, into the back of the net for his third tally of the season and a UMB 2-1 edge with 3:09 gone in the match. The teams remained scoreless for the remainder of the half and into the second half until Keene State scored at 57:49 of the second half to tie the contest at 2-2. The Owls took the lead at the 63:06 mark of the second stanza. The Beacons had a chance to tie the game when Cavallero made a bid for his second goal of the day, but it was blocked by a Keene State defender at 66:42. The Owls added an insurance goal at 77:52 for a 4-2 advantage. Maniscalco stopped eight shots for UMB.
