**Lucky Seven** UMass Boston matched its highest goal output in school history with a 7-0 win over Newbury College on October 2 and freshman forward **Jillian Moreira (Somerville, MA)** tallied seven points on two goals and three assists. Moreira's point total is the most since Shannon Murphy collected seven points with three goals and an assist vs. Lesley University on October 14, 1997 and it's the most goals scored by UMass Boston since a 7-2 victory at Lasell College on September 30, 1997.

Moreira opened the scoring when sophomore midfielder **Merideth Fredericks (Holbrook, MA)** fed her for a shot that found the back of the left side of the net at 17:29 of the first half to give UMass Boston a 1-0 edge. Moreira then found freshman forward **Nicki Finamore (Weymouth, MA)** with a cross in front of the net for a diving header that resulted in her second goal of the season and a 2-0 Beacons' lead just 25 seconds later at 17:54. Moreira assisted on UMass Boston's fourth goal, as well, when she sent a cross in tight to freshman midfielder **Catherine Granwehr (Wallingford, PA)** that she sent into the left corner of the net for her first collegiate goal and a 4-0 margin at 53:55 of the second half. Moreira was then part of a double assist when junior **Courtney Haroules (Littleton, MA)** sent a touch cross to her that she sent with a thru-ball to freshman forward **Kemi Stephanie George (Benin City, Nigeria)**, who scored into the left corner of the net for her first career goal at 58:15 of the second half for a 5-0 UMB lead. Sophomore forward **Beca Cortazio (Cambridge, MA)** led Moreira to the left corner, as well, where she found the back of the net for her second goal of the match and her fourth of the season to give the Beacons a 6-0 advantage at the 60:18 mark of the second stanza. Fredericks registered her second assist of the day when she sent a cross from the right corner of the field into the box, where freshman **Lauren Vargas (Rochester, MA)** collected the ball and scored at 24:48 of the first half for her first collegiate tally and a 3-0 UMass Boston lead. Cortazio capped the scoring when freshman midfielder **Jill Collins (West Haven, CT)** found her with a cross and she made a move, before going one-on-one with the keeper and then beating her with a shot into the left corner at 72:36 of the second half for a 7-0 Beacons lead. Haroules spent the first half in net for UMass Boston and was untested in 45 minutes, before taking the field as a forward, while freshman keeper **Ashley McRoberts (Merrimack, NH)** patrolled the pipes for the second half for UMB and was also untested as the Beacons held a 40-0 shot advantage.

UMass Boston capped the week with a 2-0 loss at Eastern Connecticut State on Saturday. The Warriors opened the scoring with a goal at 8:47 of the first half and connected again at 23:22 for their second goal of the day. Haroules made 11 saves for the Beacons.

**Getting that First One** The Beacons won their first match of the season with a 9-0 shutout over host Pine Manor College on October 4. Senior **Aurora Lormeus (Milton, MA)** won at first singles, 6-2, 6-4 and teamed with sophomore **Emily Johnson (Saugus, MA)** to win at number one doubles, 8-0. Johnson won her own singles match at number two with an easy 6-1, 6-0 showing. Sophomore **Kristen Chan (Irvine, CA)** also registered a 6-1, 6-0 decision at

third singles and combined with sophomore **Katie McPherson (South Park, PA)** to win at second doubles, 8-6. McPherson was a winner at number five singles, as well, with an impressive 6-1, 6-1 effort, while freshman **Brittany Engel (Freehold, NJ)** breezed at fourth singles, 6-0, 6-1. She paired with freshman **Novita Dewi (Malang, Indonesia)** to win at number three doubles, 8-1. Dewi also won in singles play with a 6-0, 6-1 victory at number six.

**The Best Start** The Beacons defeated Becker College on October 3 to move to 8-3-0 on the season for their best start in school history, before falling to Eastern Connecticut State, 3-0, on Saturday.

Following a scoreless first half, the final 27 minutes of action saw all seven goals in the match scored. Junior midfielder **Maynor Sanchez (Boston, MA)** opened the scoring with an unassisted goal coming at the 63:28 mark of the second half to give UMass Boston a 1-0 edge. Junior forward **Henry Marin (Pereira, Colombia/Haverhill (MA) H.S.)** netted his fourth goal of the season with an assist from junior midfielder **Romeo Zeqo (Volos, Greece/Medford (MA) H.S.)** just 4:09 later to give the Beacons a 2-0 margin. Becker cut the lead in half with a score at 72:40 of the second half, but Zeqo answered with his seventh goal of the year, when he converted a goal off a cross from freshman midfielder **Jason LaFlam (Salisbury, VT)** at 75:32 of the second stanza. The Hawks came right back to pull to within one goal just 17 seconds later to make it 3-2. Zeqo and senior defender **Anthony Cataldo (Everett, MA)** combined to find freshman forward **Ludji Chipps (Port AuPrince, Haiti)** for his fourth goal of the campaign and a 4-2 Beacons' lead at 77:33 of the second half. Sanchez capped the scoring with his team-leading eighth goal of the season on Zeqo's third helper of the afternoon with just 6:37 left to play in the match. Junior keeper **Paul Maniscalco (Hanover, MA)** made three saves on the day to earn the victory for UMass Boston, while Christopher Nosek stopped nine shots for Becker.

It took just a 13-minute span in the first half for all of the scoring in the match to take place as Eastern Connecticut netted the first score at the 17:49 mark. The Warriors scored again at 21:29 and 30:15 and that would be it for the match, despite the Beacons owning a 12-8 shot advantage. Maniscalco made three saves for UMB on the afternoon.
