## Directions to UMass Boston

### From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

### From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

### From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.

# COACHING STAFF



## HEAD COACH SHAWN RENEE POLK

Seventh Season  
Massachusetts '93

Shawn Renee Polk, who has gained a reputation as one of the better young coaches in the Boston area, became UMass Boston's 10th women's basketball coach in August 1998. Now in her sixth year at the helm of the Beacons' program, she has brought in a core of players that have helped UMass Boston become one of the top programs in the region under her guidance. The Beacons have shown improvement over the course of her six years and become one of the Little East Conference's top teams.

Polk came to UMass Boston with extensive experience in the Boston basketball circles. She spent two seasons as the head coach at Roxbury Community College and has worked with a number of local basketball organizations.

Polk has established herself as an active leader in sports and athletics in the city of Boston. She is the former Director of the highly regarded Boston Neighborhood Basketball League (BNBL), the city's oldest youth basketball league. She oversaw all operations of the entire league, including 22 sites with over 3,000 boys and girls between the ages of 11-19. She was also the sports director at the YMCA in Boston for two years, a physical education teacher for the City on A Hill Charter School in Boston and has worked as an event manager and a coach with the Bay State Games.



A 1993 graduate of UMass Amherst with a bachelor's degree in sport management, Polk also serves as the facilities scheduling coordinator for the UMass Boston athletic department. She is a resident of Dorchester.



## ASSISTANT COACH DANIELLE FITZPATRICK

Danielle Fitzpatrick begins her first season on the UMass Boston coaching staff after completing an outstanding collegiate playing career.

The New Hampshire native starred for Brandeis University and was named an Honorable Mention All-American, while being selected as a First Team All-Conference member for the UAA and an Eastern College Athletic Conference All-Star. The tri-captain led the Judges to the ECAC championship and was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player as well as the team's season MVP. Fitzpatrick left her mark at Brandeis being named the school's Female Athlete of the Year and having the ultimate honor of having her uniform number retired.

The 2004 graduate has also coached in basketball camps at Brandeis, as well as, AAU camps.



## ASSISTANT COACH MITCHELL HERCULE

Mitchell Hercule is no stranger to UMass Boston basketball, having played three seasons for the men's team and spending two years as the Beacons' manager.

He begins his first season on the women's coaching staff after serving as an assistant coach at John D. O'Bryant High School in 2003. The former frontcourt performer scored over 700 points for the Beacons and grabbed over 300 rebounds during his career and showed a great work ethic, earning Most Improved honors for the team and a New England All-Star selection following his senior season.

A 2002 graduate of UMass Boston, Hercule holds a degree in social psychology and resides in Mattapan, MA.



## ASSISTANT COACH MICHAEL J. PARETCHAN

After three seasons as a coach with the boys and girls' basketball programs at Foxboro High School, two years at Wayland High School and a year at Weymouth High School, Michael J. Paretchan came back to UMass Boston in 2001-02, armed with a wealth of coaching experience.

The 1999 UMass Boston magna cum laude graduate, was a three-sport athlete for nearby Boston College High School, playing basketball, football and baseball.

Paretchan has coached club and travel baseball teams in the basketball off-season and is a resident of Weymouth, MA.

# SEASON OUTLOOK

UMass Boston women's basketball went through some growing pains last season as seven players saw action on the collegiate level for the first time in their careers, including five who saw significant time. The young Beacons struggled last year, but also gained invaluable experience in the process and ended a long losing streak to Plymouth State University along the way.

UMass Boston returns to the court, having lost just two major contributors from last year. With the return of its core players from last year, combined with a year of experience under its belt and the addition of some very talented newcomers, UMass Boston should be right back in the thick of the Little East Conference championship hunt.

One thing the Beacons have is depth with 17 players, including many who are expected to make solid contributions. With a squad loaded with quick, athletic players with good size, UMass Boston should be able to play 94 feet at full speed and give opponents fits, especially on the defensive end of the court, where UMB will be aggressive and not afraid to use extensive pressure.

## Backcourt

If anything, the Beacons have an abundance of talented, athletic guards. UMass Boston's backcourt possesses a lot of energy and quickness and should give opponents fits on the defensive end of the court and allow the Beacons to run the break on the offensive end.

Junior point guard **Elmina Darville (Randolph, MA)** will look to lead UMass Boston into battle as the most experienced player on the roster. The point guard started all but two games, averaging 7.3 points per game last season and will be asked to step up her offensive game and provide the same tenacity on the defensive end as in the past.

Sophomore **Kristen Reske (Duxbury, MA)** showed the ability to score in bunches last season and will look to become a more consistent threat from the outside. An excellent shooter, she drained 26 three-pointers to rank second on the squad. Sophomore **Ashley Greene (Brookline, MA)** will take time off in the first semester, but will be available second semester. She saw action at the point last season and will compete for time there again. Her ability to penetrate and shoot, should give opponents difficulty in defending her. Junior transfer **Lydia Coverdale (Malden, MA)** will also join the Beacons for second semester and will immediately step into the starting backcourt. The guard played three semesters at University of Maine-Farmington and possesses a solid all-around game, starting all but one game she was there, averaging 6.6 points, 3.8 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 2.9 steals per outing.

Junior **Amy Ouellette (Pembroke, MA)** returns for her third season,

armed with the experience of playing in the Little East and sophomore **Aregash Gelaw (Cambridge, MA)** also returns after gaining a year of experience. Both guards will vie for time off the bench. Freshman **Loren Turner (South Boston, MA)** provides UMass Boston good size in the backcourt. The 5'9" guard has great court sense and passing abilities and will look to make an impact. Classmate **Desarie Johnson (Dorchester, MA)** has great quickness and will look to grab significant minutes off the bench. Senior **Kristen Smoyer (Stratham, NH)** and freshman **Marcia Beatty (Marstens Mills, MA)** will both change gears from the soccer field to the basketball court. Smoyer is an outstanding athlete and intense competitor, who will look to make the most of her first and only year of basketball at UMB. Beatty is very athletic with a tremendous work ethic and will compete for minutes as well.

## Frontcourt

The Beacons have more size in the front court this year and the experience from last year's edition should give them a solid presence in the blocks.

Sophomore forward **Denise B. Ridge (Milton, MA)** really stepped up her game down the stretch last year and will look to continue her improvement into this season. She was the team's second-leading scorer with 7.9 points per game and the squad's third-leading rebounder with five boards per tilt. Classmate **Erin Towne (East Taunton, MA)** started all but one game last year and will compete for the starting nod again. Towne proved to be a solid rebounder, leading the team with 5.5 caroms per game. Her size and versatility will be an advantage for UMB.

You can't coach height, which is why junior **Agata Matel (Dorchester, MA)** will provide the Beacons with an intimidating shot blocker once again. The 6'3" center led the LEC with 40 total blocks to go with 5.4 rebounds in just 15.8 minutes per game. **Danielle Jones (Malden, MA)** provided an immediate spark off the bench for UMB last year and will be counted on for the same energy this year. She led the team with 49 steals in just 17.7 minutes per outing and should rebound and defend as well as anyone on the squad.

Highly touted freshman **Jennifer Bennett (Lake Luzerne, NY)** should be able to contribute right away for the Beacons. The six-foot rookie has a long wingspan and her athleticism will pose big problems for opponents. She will compete for a starting spot for UMB, while freshman small forward **Jessica Baxter (Boston, MA)** will also look for time. Baxter is a strong rebounder and good team player and just adds to a frontcourt with improved depth and talent. Freshman **Alicia Querusio (Somerville, MA)** gives the Beacons another player with great size, standing at six feet tall. She has great potential and is very coachable and will look to provide important minutes off the bench.

The Little East Conference was formed in 1986. However, the seed for the conference was planted in 1984 in a meeting held at the University of Massachusetts Boston.

The underlying concern of the group was to form a basketball-playing conference with a long-range goal of securing automatic bids to the NCAA Division III men's and women's basketball championships. After a second meeting, invitations were extended to those institutions with interest in joining a conference. Eastern Connecticut State University, University of Massachusetts Boston, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, Southeastern Massachusetts University (now known as the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth) and the University of Southern Maine joined as charter members to form the Little East Conference. Western Connecticut State University was accepted into the conference in the fall of 1991, and Keene State College joined the league for the 1997-98 season.

Following the NCAA's mandatory two-year waiting period, the Little East Conference was awarded an automatic bid to the Division III men's and women's basketball championships for the 1988-89 season. The Little East Conference's success against non-conference competition in both regular-season and post-season play was a major factor in its being accorded automatic qualification so quickly. The conference's representatives to the NCAA tournaments are determined via the annual post-season conference tournament, to which each league team qualifies.

Since its formation, the Little East has seen its members ranked number one in national pre-season men's and women's polls, reach the NCAA Women's Final Four and the NCAA Men's Final Four. The women's squads have sent at least two teams to the NCAA tournament in four of the last six years, including the past three seasons.

In addition to men's and women's basketball, the Little East offers league play in baseball, softball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's lacrosse, field hockey and women's volleyball.

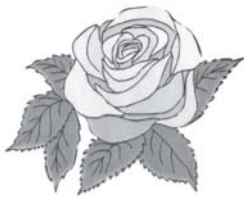

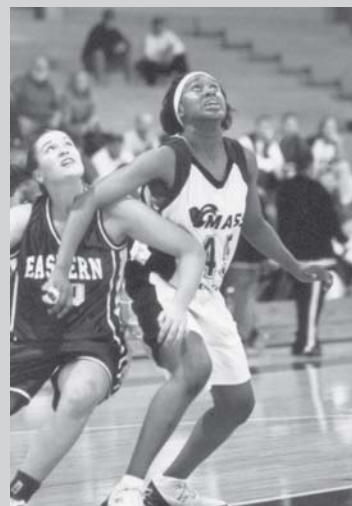

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

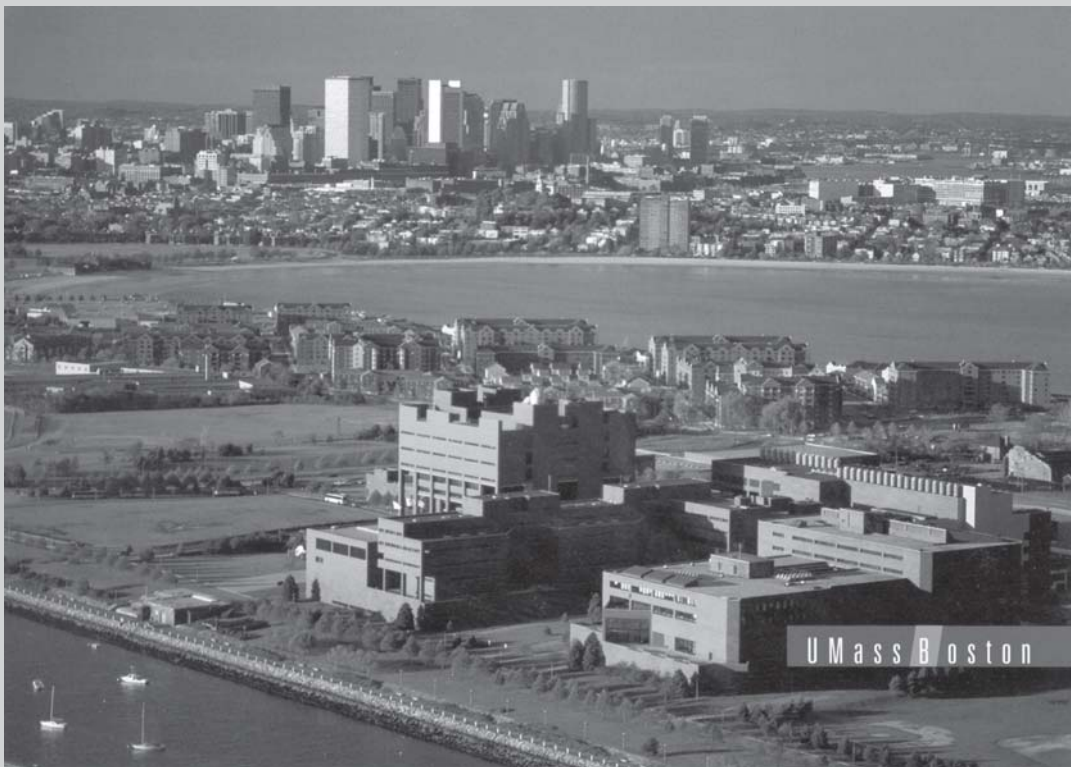
UMass Boston enrolled 12,719 students in the 2002-2003 academic year, with 10,071 undergraduate students and 2,648 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 31 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment.

UMass Boston's five colleges offer 73 undergraduate majors, 30 master's programs, and 14 doctoral programs, while the university's 12 institutes and centers are actively involved in research, professional public service and community outreach. More than 290 active research and training grants attracted \$30.5 million in external funds for the fiscal year 2003. The university employs 850 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Learning Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center



also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the Campus Center — a \$50 million project which opened in April of 2004 and centralizes student services and activities.

## Academic Advising

At UMass Boston we prepare our students for life.

And because the life of a college student can be much more challenging than a basketball game or a soccer match, the UMass Boston athletic department provides you with the means to be successful in whatever sport you play, and also in the game of life.

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We make sure that our students are not solely concerned with maintaining athletic eligibility. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab--a fully equipped facility open exclusively to UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

## Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and she continues to spend the summer working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.



What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.

## Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.

The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 14



intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball

courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative and combative rooms and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged.

UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site

of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.



The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.



Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.
- Over 100,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.
- UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.
- In 2003 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the sixth straight year.

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last eighteen years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 11.4 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 12.5 million hours of community service.

There is no one way to conduct school outreach programs. It is clear from the great work done by NCAS members that there are many ways to provide quality programs. Their diversity and contributions to our nation is extraordinary.

### NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. Presently, 323 institutions and six conference offices now participate in this NCAA supported life skills program. The NCAA mission of CHAMPS/Life Skills is "committed to a comprehensive program that provides educational experience and services in order to develop well balanced lifestyles for student-athletes; to encourage growth in decision making, planning and fulfillment of career and life goals."

The CHAMPS/Life Skills program will be presented this year at UMB through the development of workshops/guest speakers that address identified life skill needs in the five commitment areas of this program.

As part of our membership in CHAMPS/Life Skills, each year one of four student athlete nominees will attend the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference.

### STUDENT ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student athlete representatives from each of UMass Boston's teams. The purpose of the organization is to promote all UMB sports and provide student athletes an opportunity to impact those issues that affect their daily lives.

SAAC is the student athlete's voice and their vehicle to implement new ideas and influence positive change to enhance the student-athlete experience at UMass Boston.

Members of each team will nominate and select an eligible student athlete to represent their sport on the SAAC. An alternate will also be selected, in the event that the designated representative cannot attend a meeting. It is expected that each team will be represented at every scheduled meeting/event.

Throughout the year, student athletes are encouraged to communicate ideas and concerns to the respective representative of their sport.



# BEACON TRADITION

## Retired Number

# 33

In the history of UMass Boston women's basketball, no one player has had the all-around effect on the program as Eileen Fenton.

Fenton is the only player in school history to have been named Little East Conference player of the year. She was a two-time selection to the Little East all-star team and was an honorable mention selection as a sophomore.

In addition to her impact at the conference and regional levels, Fenton left UMass Boston as the holder of 14 university records. Her scoring record of 1,516 career points was surpassed in 1997 by Linda Caruso and her career rebounding record of 1,220 boards was broken by Andreen Gilpin in 2003. She one of two players in school history to have amassed at least 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in her career.

In recognition of Fenton's accomplishments, her framed number 33 jersey hangs above the awards display in the Clark Athletic Center, and no other Beacon women's basketball player will wear that number.

Fenton is one of only three Beacon athletes to have a retired number. John "Boo" Rice of the men's basketball team had his number 5 retired, while men's soccer All-America Carlos Fernandes' number 7 joined the ranks in 1997.

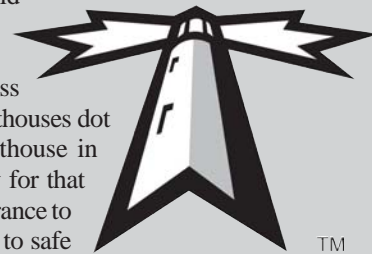
In 2003, Fenton was inducted into the UMass Boston Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the inaugural class, along with Ed Barry, John "Boo" Rice, Genesis Eddins, the 1985-86 indoor women's track and field team and the 1986 outdoor women's track and field team.



## Nickname and Colors

Looking to establish an identity for UMass Boston's athletic program, the athletic department staff selected Beacons as the University nickname, and royal blue and white as the school colors in the mid-1970s.

The nickname was chosen because UMass Boston sits on Boston Harbor, where lighthouses dot the coastline. The most renowned lighthouse in Boston Harbor, or the rest of the country for that matter, is Boston Light. Located at the entrance to the harbor, the structure has guided ships to safe harbor since first illuminating its beacon in 1716. The British destroyed Boston Light in 1776, but Governor John Hancock had the lighthouse rebuilt in 1781.



On September 23, 2002, UMass Boston introduced a "new" Beacon and changed its colors to Beacon Blue, Black and White.

## History of the Beacon

### Seeing the light

For centuries, beacons have guided ships in the most perilous waters to safety. Quite often, a Beacon was the only light sailors could see in the black of night. The light was reassuring. Hopeful. Sustaining. It helped ships stay the course. A beacon of light has since become synonymous with any source of guidance and inspiration. The word "beacon" became part of the heritage of the City of Boston in the 1780's, when a beacon stood on what is now called Beacon Hill. Today, Beacon Hill, the most historic and elegant neighborhood in the city, is recognized as the essence of Old Boston.

### Lighting the Way

Paul Finnegan, one of the first administrators of athletics at the University of Massachusetts, Boston, recognized the symbolic importance of the beacon. In fact, he became a beacon in his own right. In the early 1970's, Finnegan established intramural and recreational athletics for UMass Boston Students at the university's first campus in Park Square, with programs on the Boston Common and at the Greater Boston YMCA. Knowing that the campus would be built on Boston Harbor, where beacons guide ships from all over the world, Finnegan believed a beacon would be the ideal symbol to represent UMass Boston and its athletic teams.

### Shine On

With good reason. The beacon is a symbol of hope and guidance. As a light that is never extinguished, it represents a constant. A promise that, if you persevere, you will reach your destination. As the city's only public university, UMass Boston guides students to a better future. It offers promise to those associated with the university that they can shine. Rise above. Realize their hopes and dreams. It reflects UMass Boston Athletics. UMass Boston athletic teams have been known as the Beacons since 1974. In 1982, an official logo was rendered. It remained for almost 20 years but this friendly cartoon character failed to capture the drive and determination of UMass Boston's athletics. However, the new Beacon logo does exactly that. And more.

Our logo, like our program, conveys light, strength and endurance. We have an intensity of focus, a relentless pursuit to achieve. We endure in the darkest of outlooks. With a substantial international student-athlete population, we are a beacon for diversity. In fact, we are the only institution in the country with a Beacon as its mascot. Appropriately, this is UMass Boston, a university like no other.

Complete box scores will be distributed at halftime and at the end of the game. A running play-by-play summary will be available as well.

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS** A 10-minute cooling off period, recommended by the NCAA, will be strictly enforced, after which UMass Boston Head Coach Shawn Polk and selected players will be made available to media members. Postgame interviews will be conducted in the Clark Athletic Center lobby.

**PLAYER INTERVIEWS** Interviews other than those immediately following a game must be arranged through the UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office. The Sports Media Relations Director will see that all reasonable requests are met, and a time will be arranged so as not to interfere with the student's academic schedule.

**MEDIA WORK ROOM** The Clark Athletic Center office will be open following games for media wishing to file postgame reports. There is ample work space with power outlets and telephones.

**POSTGAME FAXES** The Sports Media Relations office will fax a complete box score and game story to media outlets upon request. Requests should be made prior to the game.

# UMB TIP-OFF CLASSIC

In 2000, the Beacons added to its tradition by starting the UMass Boston Women's Basketball Tip-Off Classic. The Classic signals the beginning of the season for the Beacons. UMass Boston won the inaugural Classic with a convincing 91-20 victory over Newbury College.

The Beacons have won the tournament twice in its three years of existence. Framingham State College, became the first team other than UMB to own the crown after defeating the Beacons 80-74 in the 2002 edition.

Regis College is the only visiting team to have made more than one visiting appearance in the Classic, having played in the inaugural tournament and the 2001 tourney.

Most Valuable Players of the Classic include UMass Boston's Felicia Haynes (2000), Andreen Gilpin (2001) and Framingham State's Janice Coppolino (2002).

The Tip-Off Classic went on hiatus in 2003, but is back for 2004. The Beacons will take on Green Mountain College, while Framingham State College faces Simmons College.

UMass Boston has a long-standing record of service to the Boston and area community and the women's basketball team has been a big contributor to the athletics department's effort. The Beacons have been involved in various events.

**Hull Youth Basketball Clinic** - The UMass Boston women's basketball team has developed a program to serve young girls in the Boston suburb of Hull, providing 75 young students, ages 10-14, with a four-hour basketball clinic at the Hull High School gymnasium. The girls are also invited to a women's basketball game at the Clark Athletic Center, where the team members host a post-game social hour for their guests.



**Boston North End CYO Girls Basketball League** - This girl's basketball league is for girls aged 9-12 and is held in the North End Community Center in Boston's North End. UMass Boston has been associated with them for the past year. The league consists of 30 teams from surrounding communities. The league, now in its third year takes place from October through March and the Beacons provide clinics and staffing at no charge. The girls from this league attend UMass Boston women's basketball games throughout the year.



**Promising Pals** - For the third consecutive year, the members of the women's basketball team participated in a city-wide campaign, serving as pen pals with middle school youngsters. All 14 members of the UMass



Boston squad participated, offering advice to the students on school and social matters while also promoting the importance of healthy exercise and nutrition. At the end of the school year, the team members and their pen pals have the opportunity to meet at a special breakfast.

**Red Auerbach Foundation Double Dutch** - For the fourth year in a row, this program involved coaches and players from the University's women's basketball team. The team helps and supports instruction in jump rope skills for middle school youngsters ages 11-14.

**Men's and Women's Basketball Clinic** - This program is held every year at the Paul Dever Elementary School, which serves the inner-city neighborhood adjacent to the UMass Boston campus. All players from each team, approximately 25-30 players, participate in this one-day clinic for approximately 400 students in grades kindergarten-sixth, teaching the students the fundamentals of the game and offering advice on conditioning, healthy nutrition and a lifestyle choices to children in an age group where they are most receptive to positive reinforcement.



**Bring your Child to Work Day** - This clinic is held annually throughout the university. The University hosts bring your child to work as a way of introducing children to our environment and having a full day of structure and fun. The women's basketball team has been hosting this clinic for three years and it continues to grow. The kids love it, the parents love it and my team looks forward to participating.
