Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

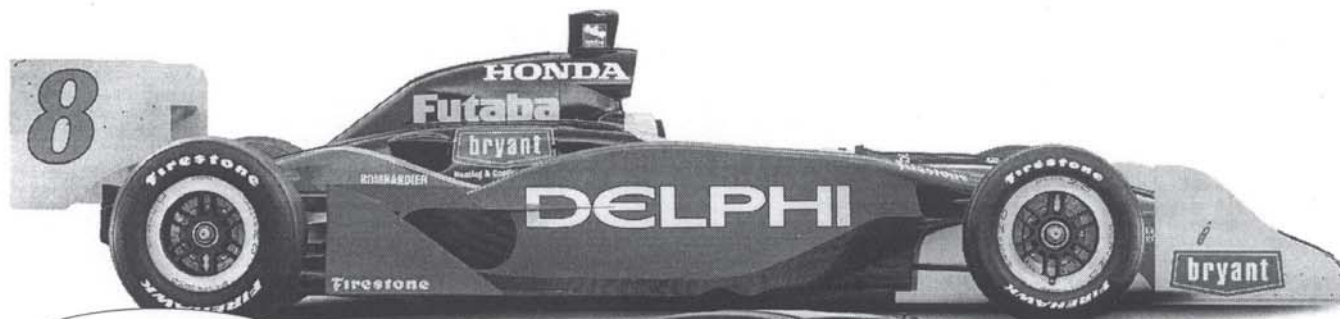
### From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

### From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.

# COACHING STAFF

## SHAWN RENEÉ POLK



### Head Coach

*Massachusetts 1993  
Ninth Season*

Shawn Reneé Polk, who has gained a reputation as one of the better young coaches in the Boston area, became UMass Boston's 10th women's basketball coach in August 1998. Now in her ninth year at the helm of the Beacons' program, she has brought in a core of players that have helped UMass Boston become one of the better programs in the region under her guidance. The Beacons have shown improvement over the course of her eight years and become an annual player within the Little East Conference.

Polk came to UMass Boston with extensive experience in the Boston basketball circles. She spent two seasons as the head coach at Roxbury Community College and has worked with a number of local basketball organizations.

Polk has established herself as an active leader in sports and athletics in the city of Boston. She is the former Director of the highly regarded Boston Neighborhood Basketball League (BNBL), the city's oldest youth basketball league. She oversaw all operations of the entire league, including 22 sites with over 3,000 boys and girls between the ages of 11-19. She was also the sports director at the YMCA in Boston for two years, a physical education teacher for the City on A Hill Charter School in Boston and has worked as

an event manager and a coach with the Bay State Games.

A 1993 graduate of UMass Amherst with a bachelors degree in sport management, Polk also serves as the facilities scheduling coordinator for the UMass Boston athletic department. She is a resident of Roxbury.



## JOSH BARTLEY



### Assistant Coach

*Westminster 2000*

Following four successful seasons as the Fulton High School Girls basketball team's assistant and junior varsity head coach, Josh Bartley comes to UMass Boston. While at FHS, he coached the JV squad to a school-record 18 wins and also coached the softball varsity squad to the state sectional playoffs.

Prior to his coaching career with the Hornets, Bartley enjoyed an excellent athletic career at Westminster College, where he was a four-time Academic All-Conference performer in the St. Louis Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

His athletic prowess wasn't limited to the gridiron in high school as he earned 11 letters in three sports, at Fulton H.S., with four in baseball and football and three in basketball.

He graduated from Westminster in 2000 and earned a masters of education degree from University of Missouri-Columbia three years later.

## CLARE DROESCH



### Assistant Coach

*Boston College 2005*

Clare Droesch begins her first year on the UMass Boston coaching staff and is not unfamiliar to the college basketball scene in the Hub.

A native of the New York City area, she was a four-year letterwinner for Boston College, where she finished her career with 1,136 points to rank 12th all-time on the Eagles' career scoring list. Droesch played a school-record 126 career games and helped Boston College to a 92-34 record and four straight NCAA Tournament appearances in her time at Chestnut Hill. She is just one of eight players in school-history to score at least 1,000 points and grab 500 or more rebounds and ranks third on the career three-point field goals list with 158 and sixth with 314 career assists.

Prior to her impressive collegiate career, Droesch enjoyed an outstanding high school career at Christ the King in Queens where she was a three-time All-American and participated in the annual high school All-America game as a senior. She was selected as the 2001 Player of the Year by the New York state sports writers and was the New York City Player of the Year as a sophomore and senior as well as the New York state Player of the Year as a sophomore and junior.

She graduated in 2005 from BC with a sociology degree and now resides in Brighton.

# SEASON OUTLOOK

UMass Boston's program has been on a steady climb over the past few seasons and that should continue this year with the return of nine letterwinners, including four starters from last year's edition and the top seven scorers from a year ago. The Beacons lost just 12% of its point-scoring from last season and will boast plenty of experience this year as well. The team will also be pretty balanced with key players returning in both the back and front court positions. The schedule will include a tough road within the conference, including match-ups with nationally ranked teams, but UMass Boston should compete for the top spots in the league.

## Backcourt

The Beacons backcourt will have the luxury of offering the opponents many different looks with so many different types of guards and will give UMass Boston the luxury of running a faster offense with a three-guard offense.

Senior co-captain **Kristen Reske** is one of two four-year seniors on the squad and has been one of the program's most effective three-point shooters throughout her career. She's a smart guard, who works hard on both ends of the court and led the Beacons with 45 trifectas last year,

while averaging 8.6 points per game. Junior **LaKeisha Tucker** transferred to UMass Boston last season and joined the team for the second semester. She wasted no time in establishing herself as one of the best scorers in the conference, averaging 15.3 points per game and also showed a good nose for the ball, pulling down 5.3 rebounds per game. Both Tucker and Reske will be counted on as the Beacons' main shooting threats from the guard spot. Tucker will also handle the basketball and run the offense when needed.

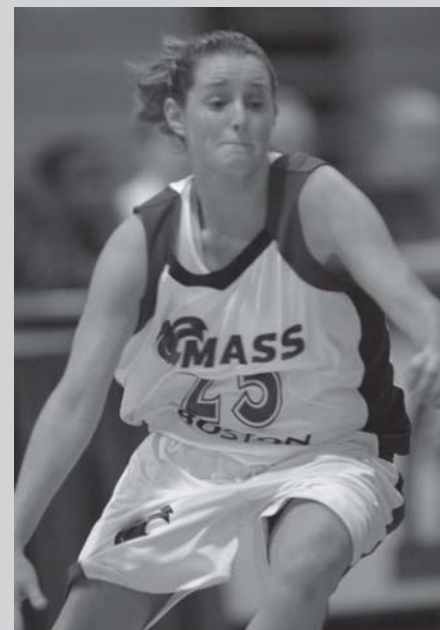
Junior **Ashley Greene** looked to emerge last year into one of the team's best point guards and will get the starting nod this season as the floor general. She netted 7.3 points per game last year and was one of UMB's best free throw shooters. Her improvement should carry into this season. Junior transfer **Myrna Tangar** comes to the Beacons after two seasons at Division II Adelphi. She will get after it on the floor and provide the team with a solid rebounder from the backcourt as well. Freshman **Caroline Ashe** will see action at both guard and forward with the ability to shoot from the perimeter as well as score in the post. She will vie for time off the bench, while junior guard **Marcia Beatty** returns for her third season. An athletic player with a tremendous work ethic, she will also look for time in the backcourt off the bench. Newcomers **Deborah**

**Bonfanti** and **Ashley Ryder** will give UMass Boston even more depth in the backcourt. Bonfanti has the potential to be a good all-around player with a good shooting touch and Ryder's understanding of the game will be a benefit to the Beacons.

## Frontcourt

UMass Boston's frontcourt lacks numbers, but packs plenty of substance and versatility. The Beacons should be able to extend opponents' defenses with front court players, who can make the outside shot as well as bang inside.

Senior forward **Denise B. Ridge** missed more than half of the season with a fractured wrist, but is healthy and will provide the team with a solid scorer in the post as well as on the perimeter. While providing leadership on a daily basis, she will also give UMB consistency in both the scoring and rebounding columns in every contest. Senior **Lydia Coverdale** will also see action in the front court on the wing after earning Little East Conference Second Team honors as a guard last year. Coverdale's 5'8" frame should allow her to make the transition smoothly. She led the squad with 6.1 rebounds, while averaging 11.7 points last year and can create off the dribble. She should be able to swing between the frontcourt and back court without a problem. Sophomore **Jenn Widener** joins the athletic front court, after time in the back court last year, as one of the most active rebounders and defenders of the forwards. She grabbed 4.5 rebounds per outing last year and her quickness should allow her to compensate for a lack of size

Junior **Alicia Querusio** is easily the team's strongest presence in the post. Her frame will give opponents fits in trying to defend her in the post, while fighting for position. She averaged 8.5 points and 5.0 boards in limited minutes a year ago and should only get better this year. Sophomore **Leanne Meninger** showed promise last season and will be counted on as one of the Beacons' key players in the blocks. She possesses a varied arsenal of offensive looks and can also rebound the basketball. She is joined by her older sister, **Courtney Meninger**, who joins the team as a sophomore as well. She should see time in the low post as well and is very smart and a coachable player.

Given the experience returning as well as the experienced and talented additions into the fold, UMass Boston should be a team that will sneak up on opponents and give them reason for concern.

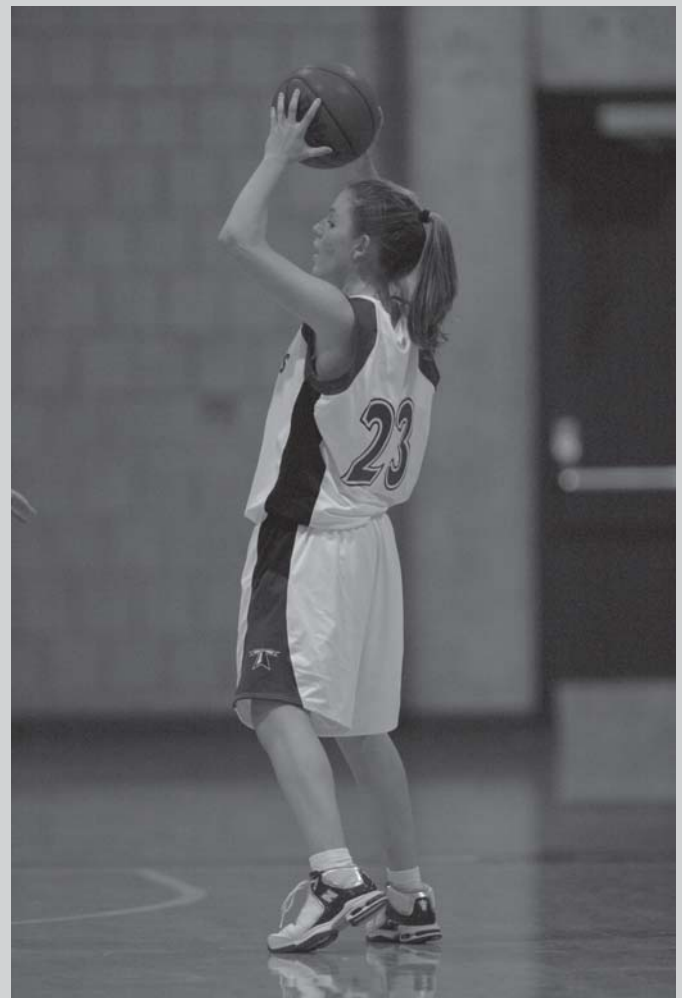

Canned at least one trifecta in 20 of 26 contests, including a stretch of eight straight games, going 16-40 for a 40% rate during that run ... Was not held without a three-pointer in consecutive games for the second year in a row ... Hit two or more threes in 17 games, including a career-high six treys vs. Framingham State College to fuel a career-best 22 points in the championship game of the Fifth Annual UMass Boston Tip-Off Classic on November 19 ... Registered double digits in scoring on 10 occasions ... Grabbed a personal-best seven boards to go with 15 points vs. D'Youville College in the consolation game of the Ramada Inn Saint John Fisher Tournament on November 27.

**2004-05** Played in all 26 games, making 19 starts ... Proved to be a lethal three-point threat, leading the team with 46 threes, while ranking fifth in the Little East with 1.8 threes made per game ... Ranked eighth among conference leaders with a .326 three-point field goal percentage ... Placed second for the Beacons with 8.6 points per game, which was good for 18th in the LEC ... Led UMB with a .771 (27-35) free throw mark and played more minutes (770) than anyone on the team ... Drained at least one three-point in 19 contests and was not held without a three-pointer in consecutive games ... Poured in a career-high 21 points on 7-10 from the floor to help the Beacons past host Plymouth State, 91-77, to secure their first-ever season sweep over PSU ... Netted double-figures in points 11 times ... Drilled all five three-point field goal attempts and all four free throw shots to finish with 19 points at Emerson on December 2 ... Averaged 3.3 assists in a four-game span from November 20 to December 2 ... Was perfect on her free throw attempts in four different contests.

**2003-04** Ranked fourth for the Beacons with 6.5 points, while playing in all 24 games and making seven starts ... Proved to be a three-point threat, hitting 26 threes to rank second on the team ... Shot 72% (18-25) from the line to place fourth on the squad ... Showed the ability to score, dropping double digits on opponents in six games, including a season-high 19 points on 7-8 shooting from the field at Pine Manor College on December 10 ... 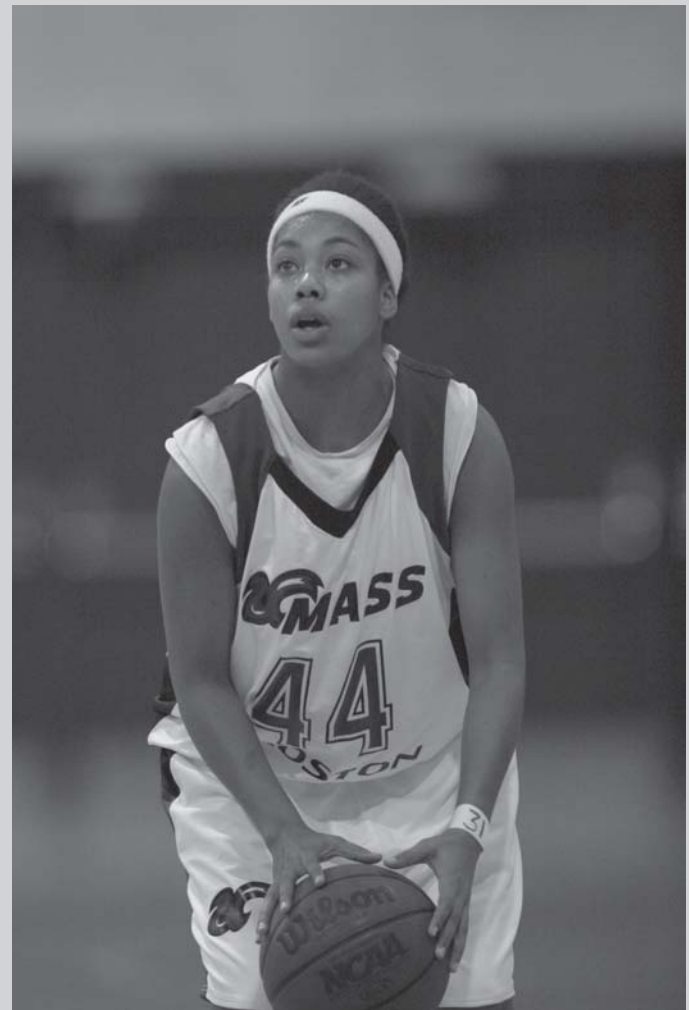

# THE LITTLE EAST CONFERENCE



The Little East Conference was formed in 1986. However, the seed for the conference was planted in 1984 in a meeting held at the University of Massachusetts Boston.

The underlying concern of the group was to form a basketball-playing conference with a long-range goal of securing automatic bids to the NCAA Division III men's and women's basketball championships. After a second meeting, invitations were extended to those institutions with interest in joining a conference. Eastern Connecticut State University, University of Massachusetts Boston, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, Southeastern Massachusetts University (now known as the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth) and the University of Southern Maine joined as charter members to form the Little East Conference. Western Connecticut State University was accepted into the conference in the fall of 1991, and Keene State College joined the league for the 1997-98 season.

Following the NCAA's mandatory two-year waiting period, the Little East Conference was awarded an automatic bid to the Division III men's and women's basketball championships for the 1988-89 season. The Little East Conference's success against non-conference competition in both regular-season and post-season play was a major factor in its being accorded automatic qualification so quickly. The conference's representatives to the NCAA tournaments are determined via the annual post-season conference tournament, to which each league team qualifies.

Since its formation, the Little East has seen its members ranked number one in national pre-season men's and women's polls, reach the NCAA Women's Final Four and the NCAA Men's Final Four. The women's squads have sent at least two teams to the NCAA tournament in four of the last eight years, including three of the last five.

In addition to men's and women's basketball, the Little East offers league play in baseball, softball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's lacrosse, field hockey and women's volleyball.

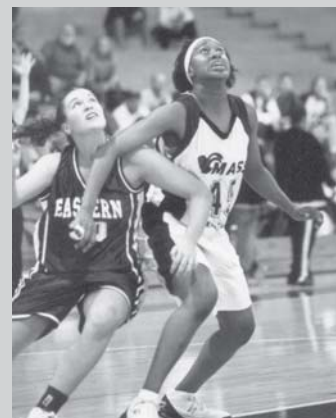

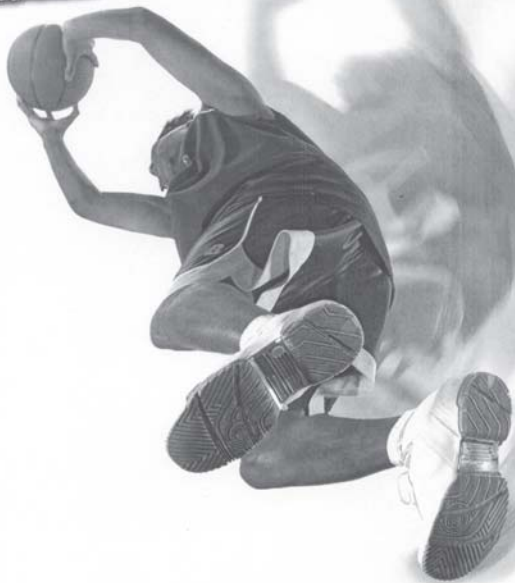

# THIS IS UMass BOSTON



The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 11,862 students in the 2005-2006 academic year, with 8,958 undergraduate students and 2,904 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 34 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment. More than 90 languages are spoken in the homes of members of the 2004 graduating class.

UMass Boston's graduate school and six colleges offer over 100 undergraduate majors, minors, and programs of study, and nearly 61 graduate programs, including 14 at the doctoral level., while the university's 30 institutes and centers are actively involved in research and public service in the areas of public policy; gerontology; media; labor; women in politics; African-American, Latino, and Asian issues; and environmental concerns. More than 280 active research and training grants attracted a total \$35.6 million in external funds—a new record of success—for the fiscal year 2004-05. Comparing five-year averages shows the amount awarded UMass Boston increased a remarkable 70% between 2001 and 2005. The university employs 821 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Instructional Technology Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena

that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the 331,000-square-foot Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The campus' new "front entrance" opened in April of 2004.

## Academic Advising

At UMass Boston we prepare our students for life.

And because the life of a college student can be much more challenging than a basketball game or a soccer match, the UMass Boston athletic department provides you with the means to be successful in whatever sport you play, and also in the game of life.

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We make sure that our students are not solely concerned with maintaining athletic eligibility. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab--a fully equipped facility open exclusively to UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

## Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

Shannon Soares, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. Shannon's credentials include a stint with Dennis-Yarmouth High School as its head athletic trainer and two summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.

## Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.



# CLARK ATHLETIC CENTER

The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 16 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's



building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an

observation deck. A weight room, creative and combative rooms and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-

sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a

workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999,



the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.

The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world. The complex has also doubled as a concert venue, hosting multiple-Grammy winning artist Kanye West in 2006.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.



Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 16 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.
- Over 150,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.
- UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.
- In 2005 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the eighth straight year.
- UMass Boston was named "Honorable Mention" by the National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators/Jostens in the category of *An Array of Projects or Activities*.

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last twenty years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 14 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 15.7 million hours of community service.

There is no one way to conduct school outreach programs. It is clear from the great work done by NCAS members that there are many

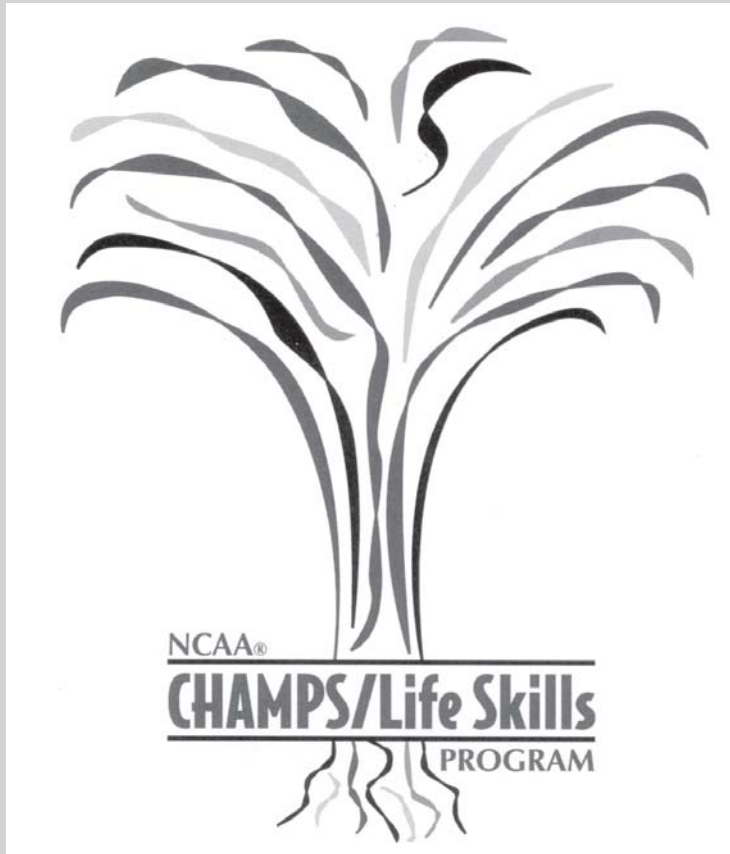

# OPPORTUNITIES FOR ATHLETES



## STUDENT ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student athlete representatives from each of UMass Boston's teams. The purpose of the organization is to promote all UMB sports and provide student athletes an opportunity to impact those issues that affect their daily lives.

SAAC is the student athlete's voice and their vehicle to implement new ideas and influence positive change to enhance the student-athlete experience at UMass Boston.

Members of each team will nominate and select an eligible student athlete to represent their sport on the SAAC. An alternate will also be selected, in the event that the designated representative cannot attend a meeting. It is expected that each team will be represented at every scheduled meeting/event.

Throughout the year, student athletes are encouraged to communicate ideas and concerns to the respective representative of their sport.

## NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. # BEACON TRADITION

## Retired Number

In the history of UMass Boston women's basketball, no one player has had the all-around effect on the program as Eileen Fenton.

# 33

Fenton is the only player in school history to have been named Little East Conference player of the year. She was a two-time selection to the Little East all-star team and was an honorable mention selection as a sophomore.

In addition to her impact at the conference and regional levels, Fenton left UMass Boston as the holder of 14 university records. Her scoring record of 1,516 career points was surpassed in 1997 by Linda Caruso and her career rebounding record of 1,220 boards was broken by Andreen Gilpin in 2003. She one of two players in school history to have amassed at least 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in her career.

In recognition of Fenton's accomplishments, her framed number 33 jersey hangs above the awards display in the Clark Athletic Center, and no other Beacon women's basketball player will wear that number.

Fenton is one of only three Beacon athletes to have a retired number. John "Boo" Rice of the men's basketball team had his number 5 retired, while men's soccer All-America Carlos Fernandes' number 7 joined the ranks in 1997.

In 2003, Fenton was inducted into the UMass Boston Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the inaugural class, along with Ed Barry, John "Boo" Rice, Genesis Eddins, the 1985-86 indoor women's track and field team and the 1986 outdoor women's track and field team.



## Nickname and Colors

Looking to establish an identity for UMass Boston's athletic program, the athletic department staff selected Beacons as the University nickname, and royal blue and white as the school colors in the mid-1970s.

The nickname was chosen because UMass Boston sits on Boston Harbor, where lighthouses dot the coastline. The most renowned lighthouse in Boston Harbor, or the rest of the country for that matter, is Boston Light. Located at the entrance to the harbor, the structure has guided ships to safe harbor since first illuminating its beacon in 1716. The British destroyed Boston Light in 1776, but Governor John Hancock had the lighthouse rebuilt in 1781.



On September 23, 2002, UMass Boston introduced a "new" Beacon and changed its colors to Beacon Blue, Black and White.

## History of the Beacon

### Seeing the light

For centuries, beacons have guided ships in the most perilous waters to safety. Quite often, a Beacon was the only light sailors could see in the black of night. The light was reassuring. Hopeful. Sustaining. It helped ships stay the course. A beacon of light has since become synonymous with any source of guidance and inspiration. The word "beacon" became part of the heritage of the City of Boston in the 1780's, when a beacon stood on what is now called Beacon Hill. Today, Beacon Hill, the most historic and elegant neighborhood in the city, is recognized as the essence of Old Boston.

### Lighting the Way

Paul Finnegan, one of the first administrators of athletics at the University of Massachusetts, Boston, recognized the symbolic importance of the beacon. In fact, he became a beacon in his own right. In the early 1970's, Finnegan established intramural and recreational athletics for UMass Boston Students at the university's first campus in Park Square, with programs on the Boston Common and at the Greater Boston YMCA. Knowing that the campus would be built on Boston Harbor, where beacons guide ships from all over the world, Finnegan believed a beacon would be the ideal symbol to represent UMass Boston and its athletic teams.

### Shine On

With good reason. The beacon is a symbol of hope and guidance. As a light that is never extinguished, it represents a constant. A promise that, if you persevere, you will reach your destination. As the city's only public university, UMass Boston guides students to a better future. It offers promise to those associated with the university that they can shine. Rise above. Realize their hopes and dreams. It reflects UMass Boston Athletics. UMass Boston athletic teams have been known as the Beacons since 1974. In 1982, an official logo was rendered. It remained for almost 20 years but this friendly cartoon character failed to capture the drive and determination of UMass Boston's athletics. However, the new Beacon logo does exactly that. And more.

Our logo, like our program, conveys light, strength and endurance. We have an intensity of focus, a relentless pursuit to achieve. We endure in the darkest of outlooks. With a substantial international student-athlete population, we are a beacon for diversity. In fact, we are the only institution in the country with a Beacon as its mascot. Appropriately, this is UMass Boston, a university like no other.

## UMass Boston Hall of Fame

# TEAM COMMUNITY SERVICE

In 2000, the Beacons added to its tradition by starting the UMass Boston Women's Basketball Tip-Off Classic. The Classic signals the beginning of the season for the Beacons. UMass Boston won the inaugural Classic with a convincing 91-20 victory over Newbury College.

The Beacons have won the tournament three times in its five years of existence, including last year's thrilling overtime victory over Framingham State College. Framingham State, became the first team other than UMB to own the crown after defeating the Beacons 80-74 in the 2002 edition.

Regis College and Framingham State College are the only visiting teams to have made more than one visiting appearance in the Classic.

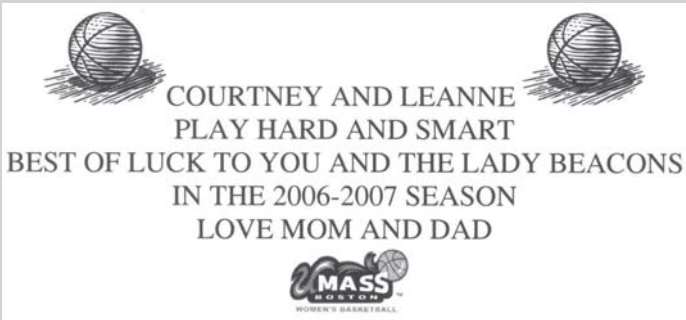

**PLAYER INTERVIEWS** Interviews other than those immediately following a game must be arranged through the UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office. The Sports Media Relations Director will see that all reasonable requests are met, and a time will be arranged so as not to interfere with the student's academic schedule.

**MEDIA WORK ROOM** The Clark Athletic Center office will be open following games for media wishing to file postgame reports. There is ample work space with power outlets and telephones.

**POSTGAME FAXES** The Sports Media Relations office will fax or e-mail a complete box score and game story to media outlets upon request. Requests should be made prior to the game.


