## Directions to UMass Boston

### From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

### From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

### From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.

## MAURA CROWELL



### Head Coach

*Colgate 2002  
First Season*

Maura Crowell (pronounced KRO-uhl) joined the UMass Boston family on August 21st to become the third head coach in the history of the women's ice hockey program after spending the past two seasons as an assistant coach with Connecticut College of the New England Small College Athletic Conference. She helped guide the Camels to their first-ever playoff appearance and also served as an instructor at the Connecticut College Development Hockey Camp. Prior to her time at Conn. College, Crowell served as an assistant coach for the Saint Mark's School girl's ice hockey program in Southborough, MA and gained head coaching experience as the Lions' junior varsity lacrosse mentor.

Crowell enjoyed an outstanding collegiate playing career at Division I Colgate University, before moving onto the coaching ranks. The left wing helped the Raiders to three straight ECAC playoff appearances, including a date in the ECAC Championship as a sophomore, and a 63-37-7 record for an impressive .621 winning percentage in her four seasons in Hamilton, NY. The four-year starter was named an Assistant Captain for her senior year and was also selected to the ECAC All-Academic team for her final season. Since her graduation in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in German, she is still prominent in Colgate's record book, ranking ninth in career points (61), sixth in career goals (29) and ninth in all-time assists (32).

The Mansfield, MA native starred at Saint Mark's School on the prep level, twice leading the Lions ice hockey team in points, while earning captain status for her junior and senior campaigns. She also excelled for the Saint Mark's field hockey program and led the field hockey and ice hockey teams to the New England Prep School Athletic Conference title during her career.

Crowell received the Valentine Piotrow German Prize, awarded for academic excellence in German Studies at Colgate and added a Master of Arts in Teaching degree in German to her mantle in 2004, while at Connecticut College. She has been extremely active in community service, helping to organize a "Big Sister" mentor program for Hamilton, NY girls playing youth hockey in addition to serving as a counselor at Brantwood Camp in Peterborough, NH, working with underprivileged adolescent girls in a residential setting and volunteering in the Special Olympics as a speed skating instructor in Connecticut.

## KRISTIN CIRBUS



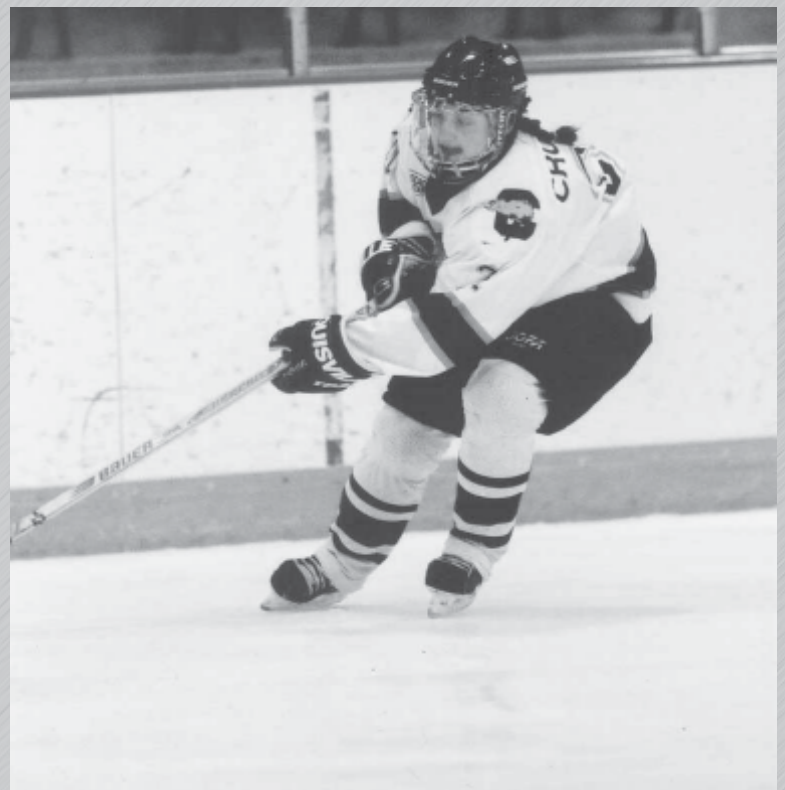
### Assistant Coach

Kristin Cirbus begins her first year on the UMass Boston coaching staff, but it no stranger to Coach Crowell, having played together as teammates for the 2001-02 Colgate Raiders when Crowell was a senior and Cirbus was a freshman. During that season, Cirbus led Colgate in assists and would top the team in helpers the following season as well. The right wing graduated Colgate in 2005 ranking 14th on the Raiders' all-time career points list.

Not only does Cirbus have an impressive playing career on her resume, but the Jamestown, NY native has also compiled valuable experience on the coaching level, serving as an instructor for 12 years at the McFall Brothers Hockey Camp in her hometown and another two years coaching in the Rick Heinz Hockey School.

Prior to earning a geography degree with a minor in education from Colgate, Cirbus starred on the junior hockey circuit for the Syracuse Stars. She now resides in Boston.

Entering their third year of play in the ECAC East, the Beacons are no longer an unknown commodity. UMass Boston was solid again last season with a 9-9-1 record in the league standings to earn the number five seed in the conference playoffs and returns almost all of its cogs from last year's squad. The Beacons' opponents didn't take them lightly and won't this year either, but this year's team has pretty much grown up together from its days as a club team in 2002-03 to now and for many of them it will be their fourth season as a group, which should translate into a sounder more polished team.

Not everything is the same for UMass Boston as Head Coach Maura Crowell takes over the reigns in her first year as the Beacons' mentor. Her emphasis on a more aggressive style of play should put pressure on opposing teams and result in a more exciting brand of hockey.

## Forward

UMass Boston returns six of its top seven scoring forwards from a year ago, including its top three. Among them is ECAC Second Team All-Star forward **Andrea Ciarletta (Watertown, MA)**, who led the Beacons with 35 points, including a team-high 20 goals and 15 assists. The junior ranked third among league players and was 15th in the nation with 1.40 points per outing. Ciarletta tallied her 50th career goal in just her second campaign and is expected to flourish in Crowell's offensive system. Senior co-captain **Molly Norton (Milton, MA)** stepped up her game last season and racked up 20 points on nine goals and 11 assists, while seeing action

in all 25 games. She tallied three-game winners to tie for the team lead and proved to be much more consistent as well. Junior **Melissa Belmonte (South Boston, MA)** should continue to be one of the team's top goal-scorers after coming off a 12-goal output from last year to go with eight assists. A creative goal-scorer, she is also one of the best playmakers on the team and should help UMB's offense once

again. **Katie Reardon (Burlington, MA)** also returns up front to add to the strong veteran presence. The junior collected 14 points on five goals and a career-best nine assists. Her level of effort should only lend itself for her to have her best season yet.

Sophomores **Casey Turner (Melrose, MA)** and **Katherine Wall (Arlington, MA)** both had excellent first years for the Beacons in 04-05 and with a season of experience behind them should become even more formidable this season. Turner ranked 11th among ECAC rookies with 19 points and her 11 assists were the second-most on the squad. She was excellent on special teams with a team-high five power play goals, which was good enough for

20th in the nation. Wall played through pain for much of the season, but still managed to suit up for every contest and contributed with 14 points on five goals and nine assists. The pair should both play an integral role in UMass Boston's success this season.

Sophomore **Lauren O'Connor (Everett, MA)** and junior **Garbrielle Goodrow (Needham, MA)** will both be counted on for solid contributions up front as well. O'Connor's height should pose problems for opponents and she's not afraid to shoot, while Goodrow, who missed most of last season but was a steady contributor for UMB as a freshman, has good hands and should also provide the Beacons with an experienced forward.

A quartet of newcomers should also give UMass Boston good depth at the forward spots. Freshman

**Maria Guanci (Everett, MA)** is a former team MVP for Everett High School and is expected to make a positive impact with a penchant for scoring, while classmate **Jaclyn Brith (Scituate, MA)** is a fast skater and shows good instincts on the ice. Freshman **Anna Dahlberg (Newton, MA)** enjoyed great individual success on the high school level and is a good skater, who could contribute, while **Christina Lynch (Salisbury, MA)** will make the transition from goalie to forward. The sophomore is a dedicated team player and will provide depth.

## Defense

The Beacons' defense fell victim to injuries and off-ice issues that diminished its effectiveness, but the main cogs are back for this season, including team co-captain **Kristin Wilson (Grand Forks, ND)**. The senior has more game experience at the college level than anyone else on the squad with 72 tilts under her belt and possesses great understanding of the game. One of team's best blueliners, she sees the ice very well, and last year posted her best offensive campaign with 13 points on a pair of goals and 11 assists. She will be counted on to anchor the defense again this season.

Junior **Kerri Zizzo (Medford, MA)** saw time at forward and on defense, before finishing out the season on the blueline. She saw action in just 16 games, due to injuries to both of her hands, but is fully healed and will look to regain the form that earned her All-Conference honors as a freshman.

Sophomores **Rose Devlin (Quincy, MA)** and **Audrey Deguire (Milford, MA)** gained a tremendous amount of experience in their first year, playing regular shifts, while showing the ability to create on the offensive end. Devlin showed great improvement throughout the season and her height and reach proved to cause problems for opponents, while Deguire quickness and ability to move the puck quickly became valuable assets for the UMass Boston defensive unit. Junior

**Leanne Corsino (Belmont, MA)** spent time at forward last year, but will return to the defense for the Beacons. She's a hard worker and good skater, who will help solidify the blueline.

A trio of newcomers will also play big roles on the UMass Boston blue line. Junior transfer **Melissa Wigmore (Duxbury, MA)** comes to the Harbor campus from Division I Hockey East program Northeastern University, where she spent two years at forward for the Huskies. Her ability should make the switch to the defensive side of the puck easier. Wigmore is a strong overall player, who handles the puck well combined with a great shot. Newcomers **Ashley Spinney (Salisbury, MA)** and **Sarah Cronin (Wakefield, MA)** should both see time for UMB. Spinney is a hard worker and great team player, while Cronin shined on the high school level for Wakefield, earning All-Star honors three times.

## Goal tender

The Beacons will carry two goaltenders for the year, but both have combined for nearly 74% of the minutes played in the program's history, so they are well experienced.

**Amanda Boucher (Billerica, MA)** saw action in a team-high 10 conference contests last year, while making eight starts. The senior assistant captain enjoyed the best season of her career, posting a 3.20 goals against average, while stopping 186 shots for a .886 save mark. She will be expected to continue her role as a team leader, both on and off the ice and will compete for the top goalie spot.

Junior **Shannon Palmer (Lynn, MA)** is the other half of UMass Boston's capable duo. She posted a 2.87 goals against average in 250:52 minutes last year to register the lowest team GAA for the second straight season. Her aggressive style allowed her to stop 135 shots, good for a team-high .918 save percentage as well.

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 11,682 students in the 2004-2005 academic year, with 8,832 undergraduate students and 2,850 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 33 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment. More than 80 languages are spoken in the homes of members of the 2004 graduating class.

UMass Boston's six colleges offer over 100 undergraduate majors, 61 master's programs, and 14 doctoral programs, while the university's 26 institutes and centers are actively involved in research, professional public service and community outreach. More than 290 active research and training grants attracted \$30.5 million in external funds for the fiscal year 2003. The university employs 821 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center



also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the 331,000-square-foot Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The campus' new "front entrance" opened in April of 2004.

 UMass Boston has won four NCAA Division III national championships, 19 individual national titles and has seen 21 different athletes achieve All-America status a total of 94 times.

 Our home, the Clark Athletic Center, is one of the best Division III athletic facilities in New England.

 UMass Boston is the only four-year, state-supported institution inside the Interstate 95 beltway.

 Students have the opportunity to commute from home or live off-campus with teammates.

 We're located just three miles from downtown Boston with all of the city's major attractions easily accessible from the campus.

## Academic Advising

At UMass Boston we prepare our students for life.

And because the life of a college student can be much more challenging than a basketball game or a soccer match, the UMass Boston athletic department provides you with the means to be successful in whatever sport you play, and also in the game of life.

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We make sure that our students are not solely concerned with maintaining athletic eligibility. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab--a fully equipped facility open exclusively to UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

## Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and nine summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.

## Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.



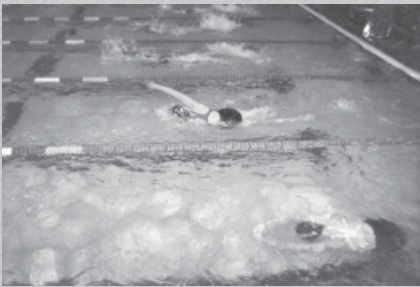
The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 14 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming



pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative and combative rooms and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-

sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.



The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.



Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- **More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.**
- **Over 200,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.**
- **UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.**
- **In 2004 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the seventh straight year.**
- **UMass Boston earned a National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators/Jostens Community Service Award for the second consecutive year.**

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last twenty years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 13 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 14.2 million hours of community service.

There is no one way to conduct school outreach programs. It is clear from the great work done by NCAS members that there are many

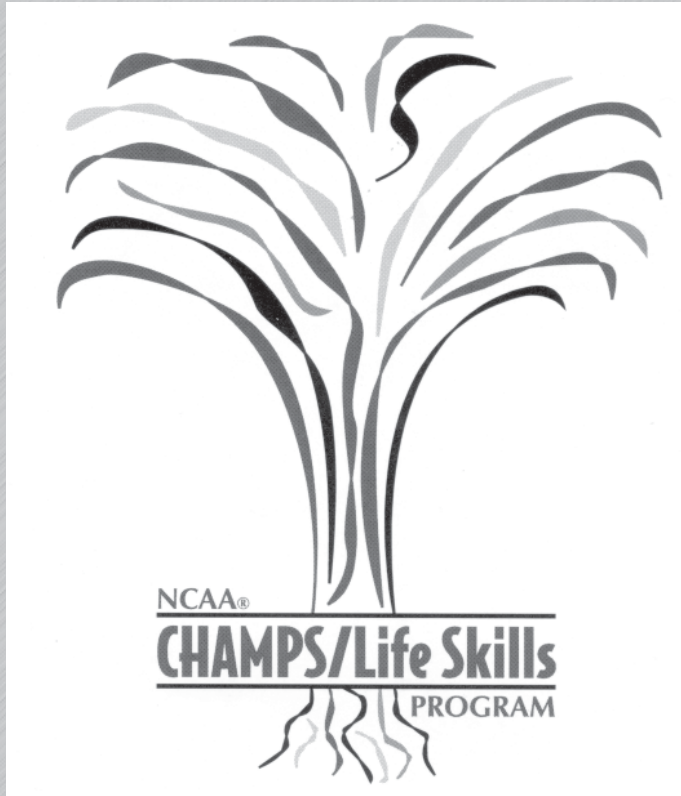

### NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. Presently, 323 institutions and six conference offices now participate in this NCAA supported life skills program. The NCAA mission of CHAMPS/Life Skills is "committed to a comprehensive program that provides educational experience and services in order to develop well balanced lifestyles for student-athletes; to encourage growth in decision making, planning and fulfillment of career and life goals."

The CHAMPS/Life Skills program will be presented this year at UMB through the development of workshops/guest speakers that address identified life skill needs in the five commitment areas of this program.

As part of our membership in CHAMPS/Life Skills, each year one of four student athlete nominees will attend the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference.

### STUDENT ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student athlete representatives from each of UMass Boston's teams. The purpose of the organization is to promote all UMB sports and provide student athletes an opportunity to impact those issues that affect their daily lives.

SAAC is the student athlete's voice and their vehicle to implement new ideas and influence positive change to enhance the student-athlete experience at UMass Boston.

Members of each team will nominate and select an eligible student athlete to represent their sport on the SAAC. An alternate will also be selected, in the event that the designated representative cannot attend a meeting. It is expected that each team will be represented at every scheduled meeting/event.

Throughout the year, student athletes are encouraged to communicate ideas and concerns to the respective representative of their sport.

## A Magical First Year

When the puck dropped at 6:57 p.m. on November 7, 2003, it was the culmination of thousands of hours of hard work by so many people dedicated to the success of UMass Boston women's ice hockey. Whether the Beacons won or lost that night, they represented the hopes of everything that's good about UMass Boston. They would symbolize a concerted effort to build a program from the ground up, the right way.

Freshman forward **Calli Beskosty** netted the night's first goal at the 4:01 mark of the first period to give UMB a 1-0 edge. Beskosty, would add another goal later in the evening and would combine with classmates, **Andrea Ciarletta** and **Melissa Belmonte** for 10 points on the night as the Beacons defeated the visiting State University of New York - Cortland Red Dragons, 5-3.

In a season where just being competitive would have been enough, UMass Boston's women's ice hockey team gave the campus a year to remember. The Beacons busted out of the gate, becoming the first program in school history to win its first five games and went on to finish the campaign with a 13-12-1 mark. Along the way, a UMass Boston player was named ECAC East Rookie of the Week on five occasions and twice had the top goaltender for the week and the week's best player once.

The "new kid" didn't look so wide-eyed as it consistently tested established programs throughout the season, including a 3-1 Valentine's Day victory over the nation's number seven-ranked team, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. It wouldn't be the last time that the Beacons would surprise an opponent as they upended heavily favored Rochester Institute of Technology on the road, 6-4, on February 28 to advance to the semi-finals round of the ECAC East post-season tournament.

The magical run finally came to an end with a loss to the nation's number one team, Manhattanville College, but considering UMass Boston didn't even exist on the women's ice hockey landscape just one year prior, it was a pretty lofty achievement and those in hockey circles took notice, selecting UMB Head Coach Laura Schuler as the ECAC East Coach of the Year. After leading the nation in scoring with 2.15 points per game, Ciarletta was named the conference Rookie of the Year and was tabbed to the league's Second Team All-Star squad, along with freshman defenseman **Kerri Zizzo**. Belmonte finished as the Division III's number three scorer, was named to the ECAC East Honorable mention team and was also a member of the conference All-Rookie unit with Ciarletta and Zizzo. Junior defenseman **Jenn Murray** was also an honorable mention selection for the Beacons.

## Building a History

In 2000, the University of Massachusetts Boston made a decision to add women's ice hockey to its athletic program. It would be the first new program added at UMass Boston since 1995 and it was imperative that everything would be done right to give the new program all the necessities to succeed from the beginning. Former Canadian Olympic Hockey star, Laura Schuler, was hired as the team's first ever Head Coach in the Fall of 2001. Soon, thereafter, former teammate, Linda Lundrigan, was brought on as her first assistant coach. Schuler spent all of 2001-02 traveling across the region and watching prep hockey games, recruiting future Beacons to fill out the roster for the 2002-03 club campaign. In UMass Boston's club season, a group of young women, who would get the puck moving for UMB, competed against primarily varsity teams and also a few club squads, while posting a very respectable 9-7-1 mark. The core of that team returned for UMB's inaugural varsity season, along with some very good newcomers to form the foundation for UMass Boston Women's Ice Hockey team. The Beacons entered the 2003-04 season as a member of the Eastern College Athletic Conference and compete in the East division.

## Nickname and Colors

Looking to establish an identity for UMass Boston's athletic program, the athletic department staff selected Beacons as the University nickname, and royal blue and white as the school colors in the mid-1970s.

The nickname was chosen because UMass Boston sits on Boston Harbor, where lighthouses dot the coastline. The most renowned lighthouse in Boston Harbor, or the rest of the country for that matter, is Boston Light. Located at the entrance to the harbor, the structure has guided ships to safe harbor since first illuminating its beacon in 1716. The British destroyed Boston Light in 1776, but Governor John Hancock had the lighthouse rebuilt in 1781.



On September 23, 2002, UMass Boston introduced a "new" Beacon and changed its colors to Beacon Blue, Black and White.

## History of the Beacon

### Seeing the light

For centuries, beacons have guided ships in the most perilous waters to safety. Quite often, a beacon was the only light sailors could see in the black of night. The light was reassuring. Hopeful. Sustaining. It helped ships stay the course. A beacon of light has since become synonymous with any source of guidance and inspiration. The word "beacon" became part of the heritage of the City of Boston in the 1780's, when a beacon stood on what is now called Beacon Hill. Today, Beacon Hill, the most historic and elegant neighborhood in the city, is recognized as the essence of Old Boston.

### Lighting the Way

Paul Finnegan, one of the first administrators of athletics at the University of Massachusetts, Boston, recognized the symbolic importance of the beacon. In fact, he became a beacon in his own right. In the early 1970's, Finnegan established intramural and recreational athletics for UMass Boston Students at the university's first campus in Park Square, with programs on the Boston Common and at the Greater Boston YMCA. Knowing that the campus would be built on Boston Harbor, where beacons guide ships from all over the world, Finnegan believed a beacon would be the ideal symbol to represent UMass Boston and its athletic teams.

### Shine On

With good reason. The beacon is a symbol of hope and guidance. As a light that is never extinguished, it represents a constant. A promise that, if you persevere, you will reach your destination. As the city's only public university, UMass Boston guides students to a better future. It offers promise to those associated with the university that they can shine. Rise above. Realize their hopes and dreams. It reflects UMass Boston Athletics. UMass Boston athletic teams have been known as the Beacons since 1974. In 1982, an official logo was rendered. It remained for almost 20 years but this friendly cartoon character failed to capture the drive and determination of UMass Boston's athletics. However, the new Beacon logo does exactly that. And more.

Our logo, like our program, conveys light, strength and endurance. We have an intensity of focus, a relentless pursuit to achieve. We endure in the darkest of outlooks. With a substantial international student-athlete population, we are a beacon for diversity. In fact, we are the only institution in the country with a Beacon as its mascot. Appropriately, this is UMass Boston, a university like no other.

## UMass Boston Hall of Fame

The Hall of Fame recognizes and honors former outstanding UMass Boston/Boston State College student-athletes, coaches, administrators and friends of the athletic program for their accomplishments and services to the Department of Athletics.

UMass Boston welcomed it's first class of Hall of Famers in 2003. The inaugural class included the 1985-86 UMass Boston Women's Indoor Track & Field team, the 1986 UMass Boston Women's Indoor Track & Field team, Ed Barry, Genesia Eddins, Eileen Fenton and John "Boo" Rice.

**SPORTS MEDIA RELATIONS OFFICE** The UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office is located on the lower level of the Clark Athletic Center. **PRESS ROW FACILITIES** Space in the UMass Boston ice hockey press box is extremely limited, with priority given to game personnel. Media members requesting space in the press box are advised to make arrangements with UMass Boston Sports Media Relations Director, Alan Wickstrom, as early as possible.

**CREDENTIALS** Media members wishing to obtain credentials to UMass Boston ice hockey games must notify the Sports Media Relations office at least one day in advance of the requested game. Photographers who wish to shoot from the penalty box must make prior arrangements with the Sports Media Relations Director. Media members working in the penalty box assume the responsibility for all risks.

**RADIO** Radio stations wishing to broadcast UMass Boston ice hockey games must make arrangements with the Sports Media Relations office at least two weeks prior to the requested game. Telephone lines will be supplied by the University, provided the requested notice is given. All calls will be made on a collect or calling card basis.

**MEDIA PARKING** Media members should park in the upper level of the University's parking garage. Parking passes will be made available to media members who request them in advance.

**PRESS ROW SERVICES** The UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office will provide team rosters, pregame statistics and the ECAC East weekly report prior to the game. Shot totals will be distributed after each period and a complete box score will be available after the game.

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS** A 10-minute cooling off period, recommended by the NCAA, will be strictly enforced, after which UMass Boston Head Coach Maura Crowell and selected players will be made available to media members. Postgame interviews will be conducted in the rink area near the locker room door.

**PLAYER INTERVIEWS** Interviews other than those immediately following a game must be arranged through the UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office. The Sports Media Relations Director will see that all reasonable requests are met, and a time will be arranged so as not to interfere with the student's academic schedule.

**MEDIA WORK ROOM** The Clark Athletic Center office will be open following games for media wishing to file postgame reports. There is ample work space with power outlets and telephones.

**POSTGAME FAXES** The Sports Media Relations office will fax a complete box score and game story to media outlets upon request. Requests should be made prior to the game.
