Directions to UMass Boston

From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.

Head Coach

*Colgate 2002
Second Season*

Maura Crowell enters her second season with UMass Boston after enjoying an outstanding first year at the helm of the women's ice hockey program. In just her first year with the Beacons, Crowell led them to school records in both regular-season and ECAC East victories with a 15-9-1 mark, including a 12-7-0 showing in league play. Under her guidance, UMass Boston advanced to the ECAC East semifinals for the second time in three years, following a first-ever home playoff game at the Clark Athletic Center and three of her players earned All-Conference honors.

Prior to her arrival, she spent the previous two seasons as an assistant coach with Connecticut College of the New England Small College Athletic Conference. She helped guide the Camels to their first-ever playoff appearance and also served as an instructor at the Connecticut College Development Hockey Camp. Prior to her time at Conn. College, Crowell served as an assistant coach for the Saint Mark's School girl's ice hockey program in Southborough, MA and gained head coaching experience as the Lions' junior varsity lacrosse mentor. The Massachusetts native remains active within the ice hockey instruction arena, having served as a talent evaluator at the Texas Affiliate Camp, which is hosted by the Texas Amateur Hockey Association and a coach and evaluator for USA Hockey's Rocky Mountain District Camp in Salt Lake City, Utah. She also coached at various camps throughout the summer months, including the Boston University Hockey Camp, the Hamilton College Hockey School, the Dynamic Skating program at Merrimack College and Hub City Hockey.

Crowell enjoyed an outstanding collegiate playing career at Division I Colgate University, before moving onto the coaching ranks. The left wing helped the Raiders to three straight ECAC playoff appearances, including a date in the ECAC Championship as a sophomore, and a 63-37-7 record for an impressive .621 winning percentage in her four seasons in Hamilton, NY. The four-year starter was named an Assistant Captain for her senior year and was also selected to the ECAC All-Academic team for her final season. Since her graduation in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in German, she is still prominent in Colgate's record book, ranking ninth in career points (61), sixth in career goals (29) and ninth in all-time assists (32).

The Mansfield, MA native starred at Saint Mark's School on the prep level, twice leading the Lions ice hockey team in points, while earning captain status for her junior and senior campaigns. She also excelled for the Saint Mark's field hockey program and led the field hockey and ice hockey teams to the New England Prep School Athletic Conference title during her career.

Crowell received the Valentine Piotrow German Prize, awarded for academic excellence in German Studies at Colgate and added a Master of Arts in Teaching degree in German to her mantle in 2004, while at Connecticut College. She has been extremely active in community service, helping to organize a "Big Sister" mentor program for Hamilton, NY girls playing youth hockey in addition to serving as a counselor at Brantwood Camp in Peterborough, NH, working with underprivileged adolescent girls in a residential setting and volunteering in the Special Olympics as a speed skating instructor in Connecticut.

Kristin Cirbus is in her second season with the UMass Boston coaching staff as the squad's first assistant and will direct the Beacons' defensive schemes during game situations.

Cirbus is no stranger to Coach Crowell, having played together as teammates for the 2001-02 Colgate Raiders when Crowell was a senior and Cirbus was a freshman. During that season, Cirbus led Colgate in assists and would top the team in helpers the following season as well. The right wing graduated Colgate in 2005 ranking 14th on the Raiders' all-time career points list.

Not only does Cirbus have an impressive playing career on her resume, but the Jamestown, NY native has also compiled valuable experience on the coaching level, serving as an instructor for 12 years at the McFall Brothers Hockey Camp in her hometown and another two years coaching in the Rick Heinz Hockey School. This past summer, Cirbus was an instructor at the Boston University hockey camp as well as the Dynamic Hockey camp.

Prior to earning a geography degree with a minor in education from Colgate, Cirbus starred on the junior hockey circuit for the Syracuse Stars, helping them to a pair of national championships as well as three state titles and a state crown with the Buffalo Bisons as well.

Cirbus also served as UMass Boston's Interim Head Women's Tennis Coach in the fall of 2006 and is pursuing a masters degree in business administration at UMB.

She now resides in Boston.

COLEEN MACNALLY

Coleen MacNally returns for her second season on the UMass Boston bench. The former Hamilton College standout will serve as a defensive coach for the Beacons.

MacNally played in 93 games for Hamilton College, while tallying 14 points on a pair of goals and 12 assists. The blueliner was an Assistant Captain for the Continentals as a senior and led all Hamilton defenseman with six points as a freshman. A 2005 graduate with a degree in biology, she helped the Continentals to a school-record 13 victories as a sophomore as well.

Prior to her arrival in Clinton, New York, MacNally played her high school hockey at Shattuck-Saint Mary's School in Faribault, Minnesota.

She is a native of Bourne and currently resides in Brighton.

PHILLIP BATEMAN



Assistant Coach
Ohio State 1996

Phillip Bateman joins the UMass Boston coaching staff for his first season. The Toronto, ONT native comes to Boston after spending last year as the Head Coach for Neumann College, where he directed the Knights to a 14-9-2 mark and led them to their first-ever ECAC West tournament victory. Under Bateman, Neumann achieved a national ranking of 11th and was seventh in the regional rankings as well.

Prior to his arrival in Aston, PA, Bateman served as an Assistant Coach for Division I University of Massachusetts Amherst, where he implemented practice plans as well as recruiting future athletes.

Bateman earned a B.S. degree in exercise science from Ohio State University in 1996. From 2001-03, he was director and head hockey coach of the Canadian Ice Academy in Mississauga, ONT, and prior to that, he served as a volunteer assistant with the Markam Waxers and the Don Mills Flyers. He was a member of the OHL Niagara Falls Thunder, and was an invitee of the Canadian National World Junior Hockey Team in 1991-1992. Bateman he is currently the Director and a Head Coach at Puckmasters in Marlboro, MA.



Season Outlook

UMass Boston enters the season as one of the top teams in ECAC East coming off last year's 15-9-1 overall record, which included a 12-7-0 mark in conference play. The Beacons advanced to the league semifinals and pushed eventual conference champion Manhattanville to the limit.

The Beacons return 81% of their goal-scoring from a year ago, including their top four scorers and have added more team speed to enhance their aggressive-style of play. The program is now in its fourth season and will boast, for the first time in school history, four-year players to give it invaluable experience on the ice. UMass Boston's biggest losses from last season are between the pipes and the blue line, but the incoming newcomers should fill those roles admirably.

The Beacons come out of the gate facing challenges throughout the first month of the season, facing the top four teams in the pre-season coaches poll, including all of their first four contests. UMass Boston has also added defending national champion Middlebury College to its slate, so it will be tested throughout the season.

Forward

The Beacons have added depth to an area, which was already one of its greatest strengths -- the offense. The returners, plus the newcomers should make the forward position as strong as it's ever been at UMB.

UMass Boston returns two of the most explosive forwards in the nation in seniors **Melissa Belmonte (South Boston, MA)** and **Andrea Ciarletta (Watertown, MA)**.



Sophomore Kate Webb returns to UMass Boston after taking a year off. She tallied 19 points as a freshman in 2004-05.

Belmonte returned to the form of her rookie season when she burst onto the college season as one of the top scorers in the country. The co-captain led the Beacons with 40 points on 15 goals and 25 assists, while ranking sixth in NCAA III with 1.00 assists per outing and comes into the campaign as a Pre-Season USCHO.com Honorable Mention selection. Ciarletta was the beneficiary of many of those feeds, netting 26 goals to go with 12 assists. She was just shy of leading the nation in goal-scoring for the second time in her career with 1.08 tallies per game

and was named to the ECAC East First Team. The pair should give opponents fits all season.

Junior forward **Casey Turner (Melrose, MA)** emerged as a legitimate scoring threat as well with 15 goals and ranked eighth among ECAC East players in goals per game. She also added 10 assists to give her 1.00 points per effort. She will see time on the power play and her tough, aggressive play should help to create turnovers. Senior **Katie Reardon (Burlington, MA)** has played more games in a UMB uniform than anyone else, along with Belmonte, in school history and joins her fellow captain to lead the Beacons with experience. She made all three of her scores count last year, with each of them going as a game-winner. A good two-way player, she will help UMass Boston on both ends of the ice. Junior **Katherine Wall (Arlington, MA)** was named an assistant captain and returns for her third season after placing fifth on the squad with a personal-best 10 assists. She is a hard worker with great hands and shot.



Sophomore Maria Guanci led all UMass Boston rookies with 19 points last year.

Sophomore **Maria Guanci (Everett, MA)** returns following a stellar first year. The forward has a tremendous work ethic and was 11th among ECAC East freshman with 19 points on six goals and 13 assists last season. She will see significant time in special teams situations. Sophomore **Kate Webb (Falmouth, MA)** also returns, but after taking a year off from hockey. The forward enjoyed an outstanding freshman campaign in 2004-05, racking up 19 points on nine goals and 10 assists and was 24th among the nation's rookies in points. She will also see action in special teams situations and add to the team's depth at forward. Junior **Lauren O'Connor (Everett, MA)** registered a career-high six points last year and should provide leadership and experience. Her work ethic pushes her teammates, making her an invaluable component.

UMass Boston welcome's a solid freshman class of forwards into the fold as well, led by **Katelyn Sawyer-Lajoie (Marlboro, MA)**. The first-year player is physically solid and should see significant playing time, including special teams situations. Classmate **Kimberly Davidge (Blackstone, MA)** has good

hands and speed and should also push for quality time in the lineup. **Kyle Mack (Needham, MA)**, **Jennifer Petitti (Quincy, MA)** and **Katelyn Corsino (Belmont, MA)** will all fight for time as well. Mack brings an aggressive style of play to the ice, while Petitti has good offensive potential. Corsino brings an added element with the ability to play on both the offensive and defensive sides of the ice.

Defense

The Beacons lose their top blueliner from a year ago, but add a top-notch proven newcomer to fill the skates. Not only that, but as a unit, the defense is probably the most experienced it has ever been for UMass Boston.

Senior **Melissa Wigmore (Duxbury, MA)** proved to be one of the best offensive defenseman in the league last year with 13 points on four goals and nine assists after making the transition from the forward spot. An assistant captain, Wigmore's offensive prowess could be used up front as well and she will also be a key in special team situations. A pair of juniors blueliners will help anchor the Beacons' defense as well. **Rose Devlin's (Quincy, MA)** height and reach will pose problems for opposing forwards, while her ability to compete in the offensive zone will be to UMass Boston's advantage. Deguire also has the ability to put the puck in the net with four goals last year. A good stay-at-home defenseman, she moves the puck well and will be counted on to contain her opponents once again.

One of the biggest additions to the UMB blueline will be sophomore transfer **Erin Shepherd (Saint Paul, MN)**, who transfers to UMass Boston from New England College, where she tallied 18

points and was named to the ECAC East All-Rookie team. She has great size and a tremendous shot and should see significant time in special teams situations as well. Sophomore **Sarah Cronin (Wakefield, MA)** was the Beacons' top rookie defenseman a year ago and has good size and is physical. She should take on a bigger role this season. A pair of freshmen will also be counted on to perform for UMass Boston. **Katelyn Pohlman**

(**Newton, MA**) has good size and a good shot from the point. She is also very fast and should develop into a solid player for UMB, while **Jennifer Senecal (Northboro, MA)** will see a lot of time as well. She is steady and has good instincts and will see action in special teams situations.

Goal tender

The Beacons will be without their top goaltender from a year ago, but add two strong newcomers and return a three-year veteran to give them excellent depth.

Senior **Shannon Palmer (Lynn, MA)** posted a 7-1-0 record for an .875 winning percentage, which led all ECAC East goaltenders and was good for second in the nation. She registered a stingy 2.26 goals against average as well to rank fourth in the conference and 15th in the country. Palmer stopped a career-high 177 shots for a .903 save mark to give her the eighth-best percentage in the league. Her experience and track record should give UMass Boston a very able goalie to see time if the newcomers aren't able to seize their opportunity. Sophomore **Jessica Sams (Bellingham, MA)** is a transfer from Division I Northeastern University, where she served as a backup goalie. Her height will serve her well as the team's number one goalie. Sams played four years of hockey for the Bellingham High School boys' squad and she moves around very well. Freshman **Amanda Bourque (Cranston, RI)** will also compete for important minutes. The first-year goalie has very good mechanics and was well accomplished on the Rhode Island circuit. Senior **Katie Frossard (Milton, MA)** will serve as a backup for UMB and has been with the program since the club days when she turned in admirable numbers.

Much is expected of this year's edition with so much experience and talent, the Beacons should prove to be one of the region's best programs.

Home to the premier Division I league in the nation, the ECAC boasts a history that gleams with accomplishments. From individual honors to contributions on the international stage, the ECAC and its players and coaches have set a high standard for excellence in the game. At the Division I level, ECAC players have 29 times achieved All-America honors, won 25 Olympic Gold Medals, and have won the Patty Kazmaier Award all five years it has existed as a designation of the nation's top player.

Membership in the ECAC's leagues has changed to meet the needs of the exploding collegiate sport as 22 teams have called the ECAC home since the first championship was contested in 1984.

The ECAC also sponsors hockey at the Division III level with some of the best programs in the nation residing in ECAC East and West. Plymouth State University and Norwich University will both join ECAC East for the 2007-08 season. Elmira won the National Championship in 2002 and 2003, defeating Manhattanville for the title in 2003, but fell in the 2005 championship game. 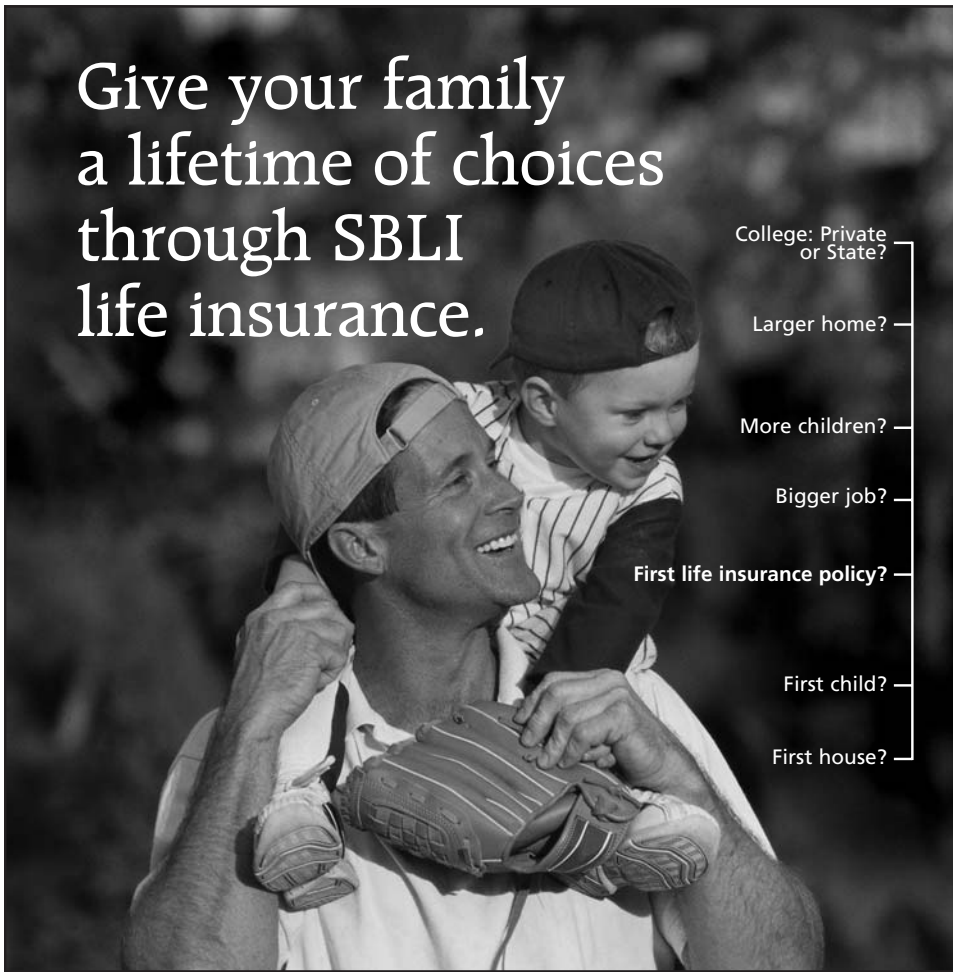

A Magical First Year

When the puck dropped at 6:57 p.m. on November 7, 2003, it was the culmination of thousands of hours of hard work by so many people dedicated to the success of UMass Boston women's ice hockey. Whether the Beacons won or lost that night, they represented the hopes of everything that's good about UMass Boston. They would symbolize a concerted effort to build a program from the ground up, the right way.

Freshman forward **Calli Beskosty** netted the night's first goal at the 4:01 mark of the first period to give UMB a 1-0 edge. Beskosty, would add another goal later in the evening and would combine with classmates, **Andrea Ciarletta** and **Melissa Belmonte** for 10 points on the night as the Beacons defeated the visiting State University of New York - Cortland Red Dragons, 5-3.

In a season where just being competitive would have been enough, UMass Boston's women's ice hockey team gave the campus a year to remember. The Beacons busted out of the gate, becoming the first program in school history to win its first five games and went on to finish the campaign with a 13-12-1 mark. Along the way, a UMass Boston player was named ECAC East Rookie of the Week on five occasions and twice had the top goaltender for the week and the week's best player once.

The "new kid" didn't look so wide-eyed as it consistently tested established programs throughout the season, including a 3-1 Valentine's Day victory over the nation's number seven-ranked team, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. It wouldn't be the last time that the Beacons would surprise an opponent as they upended heavily favored Rochester Institute of Technology on the road, 6-4, on February 28 to advance to the semi-finals round of the ECAC East post-season tournament.

The magical run finally came to an end with a loss to the nation's number one team, Manhattanville College, but considering UMass Boston didn't even exist on the women's ice hockey landscape just one year prior, it was a pretty lofty achievement and those in hockey circles took notice, selecting UMB Head Coach Laura Schuler as the ECAC East Coach of the Year. After leading the nation in scoring with 2.15 points per game, Ciarletta was named the conference Rookie of the Year and was tabbed to the league's Second Team All-Star squad, along with freshman defenseman **Kerri Zizzo**. Belmonte finished as the Division III's number three scorer, was named to the ECAC East Honorable mention team and was also a member of the conference All-Rookie unit with Ciarletta and Zizzo. Junior defenseman **Jenn Murray** was also an honorable mention selection for the Beacons.

Beacon Tradition

Building a History

In 2000, the University of Massachusetts Boston made a decision to add women's ice hockey to its athletic program. It would be the first new program added at UMass Boston since 1995 and it was imperative that everything would be done right to give the new program all the necessities to succeed from the beginning. Former Canadian Olympic Hockey star, Laura Schuler, was hired as the team's first ever Head Coach in the Fall of 2001. Soon, thereafter, former teammate, Linda Lundrigan, was brought on as her first assistant coach. Schuler spent all of 2001-02 traveling across the region and watching prep hockey games, recruiting future Beacons to fill out the roster for the 2002-03 club campaign. In UMass Boston's club season, a group of young women, who would get the puck moving for UMB, competed against primarily varsity teams and also a few club squads, while posting a very respectable 9-7-1 mark. The core of that team returned for UMB's inaugural varsity season, along with some very good newcomers to form the foundation for UMass Boston Women's Ice Hockey team. The Beacons entered the 2003-04 season as a member of the Eastern College Athletic Conference and compete in the East division.

Nickname and Colors

Looking to establish an identity for UMass Boston's athletic program, the athletic department staff selected Beacons as the University nickname, and royal blue and white as the school colors in the mid-1970s.



The nickname was chosen because UMass Boston sits on Boston Harbor, where lighthouses dot the coastline. The most renowned lighthouse in Boston Harbor, or the rest of the country for that matter, is Boston Light. Located at the entrance to the harbor, the structure has guided ships to safe harbor since first illuminating its beacon in 1716. The British destroyed Boston Light in 1776, but Governor John Hancock had the lighthouse rebuilt in 1781.

On September 23, 2002, UMass Boston introduced a "new" Beacon and changed its colors to Beacon Blue, Black and White.

History of the Beacon

Seeing the light

For centuries, beacons have guided ships in the most perilous waters to safety. Quite often, a beacon was the only light sailors could see in the black of night. The light was reassuring. Hopeful. Sustaining. It helped ships stay the course. A beacon of light has since become synonymous with any source of guidance and inspiration. The word "beacon" became part of the heritage of the City of Boston in the 1780's, when a beacon stood on what is now called Beacon Hill. Today, Beacon Hill, the most historic and elegant neighborhood in the city, is recognized as the essence of Old Boston.

Lighting the Way

Paul Finnegan, one of the first administrators of athletics at the University of Massachusetts, Boston, recognized the symbolic importance of the beacon. In fact, he became a beacon in his own right. In the early 1970's, Finnegan established intramural and recreational athletics for UMass Boston Students at the university's first campus in Park Square, with programs on the Boston Common and at the Greater Boston YMCA. Knowing that the campus would be built on Boston Harbor, where beacons guide ships from all over the world, Finnegan believed a beacon would be the ideal symbol to represent UMass Boston and its athletic teams.

Shine On

With good reason. The beacon is a symbol of hope and guidance. As a light that is never extinguished, it represents a constant. A promise that, if you persevere, you will reach your destination. As the city's only public university, UMass Boston guides students to a better future. It offers promise to those associated with the university that they can shine. Rise above. Realize their hopes and dreams. It reflects UMass Boston Athletics. UMass Boston athletic teams have been known as the Beacons since 1974. In 1982, an official logo was rendered. It remained for almost 20 years but this friendly cartoon character failed to capture the drive and determination of UMass Boston's athletics. However, the new Beacon logo does exactly that. And more.

Our logo, like our program, conveys light, strength and endurance. We have an intensity of focus, a relentless pursuit to achieve. We endure in the darkest of outlooks. With a substantial international student-athlete population, we are a beacon for diversity. In fact, we are the only institution in the country with a Beacon as its mascot. Appropriately, this is UMass Boston, a university like no other.

This is UMass Boston

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 11,862 students in the 2005-2006 academic year, with 8,958 undergraduate students and 2,904 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 34 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment. More than 90 languages are spoken in the homes of members of the 2004 graduating class.

UMass Boston's graduate school and six colleges offer over 100 undergraduate majors, minors, and programs of study, and nearly 61 graduate programs, including 14 at the doctoral level., while the university's 30 institutes and centers are actively involved in research and public service in the areas of public policy; gerontology; media; labor; women in politics; African-American, Latino, and Asian issues; and environmental concerns. More than 280 active research and training grants attracted a total \$35.6 million in external funds—a new record of success—for the fiscal year 2004-05. Comparing five-year averages shows the amount awarded UMass Boston increased a remarkable 70% between 2001 and 2005. The university employs 821 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Instructional Technology Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena



that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the 331,000-square-foot Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The campus' new "front entrance" opened in April of 2004.

Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and nine summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.

Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.



The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 16 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming



pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative room and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically

challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.



The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world. The complex has also doubled as a concert venue, hosting multiple-Grammy winning artist Kanye West in 2006.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.





Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 16 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.
- Over 150,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.
- UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.
- In 2005 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the eighth straight year.
- UMass Boston was named "Honorable Mention" by the National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators/Jostens in the category of *An Array of Projects or Activities*.

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last twenty years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 14 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 15.7 million hours of community service.

There is no one way to conduct school outreach programs. It is clear from the great work done by NCAS members that there are many

NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. Presently, 323 institutions and six conference offices now participate in this NCAA supported life skills program. The NCAA mission of CHAMPS/Life Skills is "committed to a comprehensive program that provides educational experience and services in order to develop well balanced lifestyles for student-athletes; to encourage growth in decision making, planning and fulfillment of career and life goals."

The CHAMPS/Life Skills program will be presented this year at UMB through the development of workshops/guest speakers that address identified life skill needs in the five commitment areas of this program.

As part of our membership in CHAMPS/Life Skills, each year one of four student athlete nominees will attend the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference.

STUDENT ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student athlete representatives from each of UMass Boston's teams. The purpose of the organization is to promote all UMB sports and provide student athletes an opportunity to impact those issues that affect their daily lives.

SAAC is the student athlete's voice and their vehicle to implement new ideas and influence positive change to enhance the student-athlete experience at UMass Boston.

Members of each team will nominate and select an eligible student athlete to represent their sport on the SAAC. An alternate will also be selected, in the event that the designated representative cannot attend a meeting. It is expected that each team will be represented at every scheduled meeting/event.

Throughout the year, student athletes are encouraged to communicate ideas and concerns to the respective representative of their sport.

PRESS ROW FACILITIES Space in the UMass Boston ice hockey press box is extremely limited, with priority given to game personnel. Media members requesting space in the press box are advised to make arrangements with UMass Boston Sports Media Relations Director, Alan Wickstrom, as early as possible.

CREDENTIALS Media members wishing to obtain credentials to UMass Boston ice hockey games must notify the Sports Media Relations office at least one day in advance of the requested game. Photographers who wish to shoot from the penalty box must make prior arrangements with the Sports Media Relations Director. Media members working in the penalty box assume the responsibility for all risks.

RADIO Radio stations wishing to broadcast UMass Boston ice hockey games must make arrangements with the Sports Media Relations office at least two weeks prior to the requested game. Telephone lines will be supplied by the University, provided the requested notice is given. All calls will be made on a collect or calling card basis.

MEDIA PARKING Media members should park in the upper level of the University's parking garage. Parking passes will be made available to media members who request them in advance.

PRESS ROW SERVICES The UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office will provide team rosters, pregame statistics and the ECAC East weekly report prior to the game. Shot totals will be distributed after each period and a complete box score will be available after the game.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS A 10-minute cooling off period, recommended by the NCAA, will be strictly enforced, after which UMass Boston Head Coach Maura Crowell and selected players will be made available to media members. Postgame interviews will be conducted in the rink area near the locker room door.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS Interviews other than those immediately following a game must be arranged through the UMass Boston Sports Media Relations office. The Sports Media Relations Director will see that all reasonable requests are met, and a time will be arranged so as not to interfere with the student's academic schedule.

MEDIA WORK ROOM The Clark Athletic Center office will be open following games for media wishing to file postgame reports. There is ample work space with power outlets and telephones.

POSTGAME FAXES The Sports Media Relations office will fax a complete box score and game story to media outlets upon request. Requests should be made prior to the game.
