Directions to UMass Boston

From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.





AMY ZOMBECK

Head Coach

Keene State '99 • Third Season

Amy Zombeck returns for her third season at the helm of the UMass Boston Women's Soccer program. She made an immediate impact in her first season, guiding the team to its best winning percentage since 1997. The team also netted its highest total of goals in eight years.

Zombeck saw one of her players named a Little East Conference Second Team All-Star last season to become the first player from UMass Boston since 1997 to claim the honor.

Zombeck arrived at UMB after serving as the Assistant Coach for Keene State College women's soccer for four years.

Prior to joining the Keene State coaching staff, Zombeck was a highly decorated soccer player for the Owls, earning Little East Conference Player of the Year honors as a senior. The midfielder was named Second-Team All-American by the Division III National Soccer Coaches Association of America, as well as All-Regional First Team and Little East Conference First Team as both a junior and senior. Zombeck earned All-Region Second Team accolades for her junior and senior campaigns from the New England Women's Soccer Coaches Association of America and, following her sophomore year, she was tabbed as a member of the Division II NSCAA All-Regional Second Team after leading the Owls to an appearance in the NCAA tournament.

After graduating from Keene State in 1999 with a degree in sociology, Zombeck continued her career as both a coach and player. She coached in various soccer camps and leagues and enjoyed two seasons playing in the United States Independent Soccer League with the Springfield Sirens and the New Hampshire Lady Phantoms in 2001 and 2001, respectively.

Christopher Love joins the UMass Boston staff this year and brings valuable coaching and playing experience with him.

A standout soccer player at University of Hartford, Love went on to the professional ranks, where he played for three outdoor teams and a pair of indoor squads over five years. He saw action in the United Soccer League as well as the National Professional Soccer League with such teams as the Maryland Mania, Charlotte Eagles, Canton Invaders, Hampton Road Mariners and the Baltimore Spirit.

Love went on to coach at Howard Community College and also served as the Head Junior Varsity Coach at Howard High School, both in his hometown of Columbia, Maryland for the 2000 season. He returned to the New England area when he joined the Cambridge Rindge & Latin High School boys soccer staff as an Assistant Coach in 2006.

Love graduated from University of Hartford with a degree in communications in 1993 and later earned a degree in studio art from University of Maryland in 2004. He currently resides in Cambridge with his wife Angela.

Second Season

Katherine Olsen returns to the UMass Boston women's soccer coaching staff after gaining valuable experience as a Student Assistant Coach last year and has also coached in multiple youth soccer programs on the South Shore.

Prior to joining the Beacons' coaching staff, Olsen was the team's leading scorer, while starting all 17 matches during the 2004 season. The Marshfield, Massachusetts native transferred to UMass Boston from Division I Wagner College, where she played tennis for the Seahawks.

While at Marshfield High School, Olsen was a three-sport standout, making her mark in soccer, tennis and lacrosse.

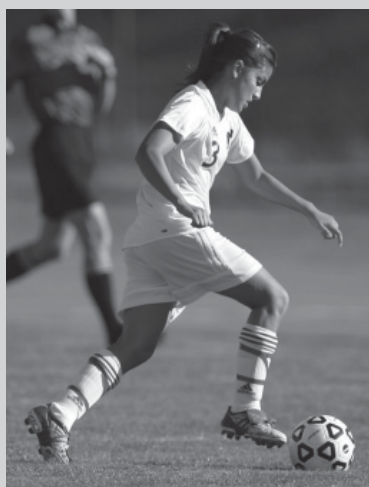

The 2007 season should be an extension of last year's growth for the UMass Boston women's soccer team. The Beacons saw an infusion of pure soccer players into the program last year and welcome 14 newcomers into the fold this season. This year's edition should benefit from the unprecedented depth and is expected to compete at a much higher level than in the past with talent and experience in all areas of the field.

Forwards

UMass Boston should be improved at the forward position this season with the addition of some talented newcomers and the return of a key veteran.

Senior **Stefani Marini (Waltham, MA)** was the team's fourth-leading scorer from a year ago and returns as a captain in her final campaign for the Beacons. She has good speed and can put the ball in the back of the net. Joining her will be freshman **Jillian Moreira (Somerville, MA)** who should make an immediate impact with her ability to beat defenders and her speed. She has a nose for the goal and should be one of the team's top offensive threats. Sophomore **Beca Cortazio (Cambridge, MA)** comes to UMass Boston from Cambridge Rindge & Latin, where she helped the Falcons to the Greater Boston League title twice. She's a versatile player, who will make the move from the backfield to forward and should add some flare to the game. Freshman **Kemi Stephanie George (Benin City, Nigeria)** has good speed and skill and will be utilized to help spark the forwards off the bench. Classmate **Lauren Forsythe (Bradenton, FL)** will also look for time off the bench and is a hard worker with the ability to put the ball in the net.



Sophomore Kristi Morales started 15 matches last year and could see time at both forward and the backfield.

Midfield

Perhaps the deepest and most talented area for the Beacons is the midfield. UMass Boston will have a good mix of veterans and

newcomers and should be able to dictate play from the middle of the field.

Sophomore **Krysten Platte (Weymouth, MA)** was the team's second-leading scorer and also a Little East Conference Rookie of the Week selection last year. She was just one of three players to start all 18 matches and could see time at both center and outside midfield. She's a hard worker with good mental toughness. Classmate **Erika Marsters (Mashpee, MA)** led UMB with ninth-highest point total in school history and started every match. She will see time at outside midfield, but could also see action at forward, where she would be a capable

scorer. She runs the flank well and can make the cross. Sophomore **Merideth Fredericks (Holbrook, MA)** is a transfer from Division II Southern Connecticut State University, where she saw action in 11 matches. She is composed on the ball and owns a good shot and should contribute both offensively and defensively.

Freshman **Nicki Finamore (Weymouth, MA)** could see time at outside midfield, when not at the forward spot. She is a hard-nosed player with a good work ethic and her shot should translate into goals for the UMass Boston offense, while classmate **Jill Collins (West Haven, CT)** can play both center and outside midfield and will be counted on to distribute the ball and create scoring opportunities. Freshman **Lauren Vargas (Rochester, MA)** will be looked on to lock down the center of the field and could also see time in the backfield. She is a versatile

player with an excellent work ethic and is very good in the air and freshman **Catherine Granwehr (Wallingford, PA)** will look for time at outside midfield, creating opportunities up and down the flanks, while preventing opponents those same chances.

Backfield

The Beacons should be solid in the backfield anchored by an all-conference sweeper and seasoned veterans.



Junior Katherine Wall was named a Second Team Little East Conference All-Star in 2006.

Junior **Katherine Wall (Arlington, MA)** returns as the team's sweeper after being named a Second Team Little East Conference All-Star last season. Despite being hampered by a back injury for much of the season, Wall was the team's third-leading scorer and held opponents to nearly half a goal fewer per game when she was on the field. She was named a tri-captain and is a quick, smart player with good communication skills and field vision. Senior **Marcia Beatty (Marstons Mills, MA)** was also named a team tri-captain and will get the starting nod at outside back. She tackles hard and can move into the attack as well. Sophomore **Kristi Morales (San Francisco, CA)** started 12 of 17 matches a year ago and will start at the stopper position this year.

She has the ability to stop anyone one-on-one and should help solidify the defense, while sophomore **Phylcia McDonald (Medford, MA)** transfers to UMass Boston from Curry, where she was a two-year starter. She will add speed, toughness and composure to the backfield. Junior **Jenna Conway (Hull, MA)** is also a transfer, coming from Massasoit Community College and could earn a starting spot in the backfield with her defensive ability. She has good speed and tackles very well. Sophomore **Jillian Hurd (Taunton, MA)** is a returner, who will see action on the outside, where her marking ability will be utilized.

Goalkeeper

The Beacons will have three keepers at their disposal for the season with playing time to be won.

Sophomore **Courtney Haroules (Littleton, MA)** should push for the starting nod with her mobility and ability to read the game. She has great height and could also see action as a forward. Freshman **Ashley McRoberts (Merrimack, NH)** will also fight for starting time and is a tenacious keeper with a great work ethic and the ability to make the big save. Hardworking freshman **Michelle Cain (Essex, MA)** will also look for time in net. She is agile and plays defense well.

THE LITTLE EAST CONFERENCE

The Little East Conference officially began on April 28, 1986 as a playing conference for men's and women's basketball among six New England institutions: Eastern Connecticut State University, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth (formerly Southeastern Massachusetts University), the University of Massachusetts Boston and the University of Southern Maine. From the beginning the conference was officially recognized by the NCAA.

The number of sports contested in the conference has grown to include men's and women's soccer, baseball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track, men's and women's outdoor track, men's and women's lacrosse, softball, men's and women's tennis, volleyball and field hockey, as well as the original men's and women's basketball. The number of participating institutions rose to seven with the addition of Western Connecticut State University in 1993-94 and then to eight for the 1997-98 year as Keene State College joined.

Along with planning for the inclusion of new sports within the conference, the LEC's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field programs are participating in an innovative joint program with the MASCAC conference to determine New England Alliance championships. Events contested are scored within each conference and for the Alliance as well.

The LEC recognizes the advantages of combining with other conferences which allows teams with lower numbers of participants to join forces and compete at a full-team level. It is likely there will be additional sports contested within the Alliance over time.

THIS IS UMass BOSTON

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 12,362 students in the 2006-2007 academic year, with 9,246 undergraduate students and 3,116 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 36 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment. More than 90 languages are spoken in the homes of members of the 2005 graduating class.

UMass Boston's graduate school and six colleges offer over 100 undergraduate majors, minors, and programs of study, and nearly 61 graduate programs, including 14 at the doctoral level., while the university's 30 institutes and centers are actively involved in research and public service in the areas of public policy; gerontology; media; labor; women in politics; African-American, Latino, and Asian issues; and environmental concerns. More than 280 active research and training grants attracted a total \$35.6 million in external funds—a new record of success—for the fiscal year 2004-05. Comparing five-year averages shows the amount awarded UMass Boston increased a remarkable 70% between 2001 and 2005. The university employs 815 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Instructional Technology Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for



intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the 331,000-square-foot Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The campus' new "front entrance" opened in April of 2004.

Academic Advising

At UMass Boston we prepare our students for life.

And because the life of a college student can be much more challenging than a basketball game or a soccer match, the UMass Boston athletic department provides you with the means to be successful in whatever sport you play, and also in the game of life.

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We make sure that our students are not solely concerned with maintaining athletic eligibility. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab--a fully equipped facility open exclusively to UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and nine summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.



Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.

CLARK ATHLETIC CENTER

The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 16 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat

basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative room and a



sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities

are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA.



The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.

The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world. The complex has also doubled as a concert venue, hosting multiple-Grammy winning artist Kanye West in 2006.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.



Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well—service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- **More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.**
- **Over 2,500 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.**
- **UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.**
- **In 2005 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the eighth straight year.**
- **UMass Boston was named "Honorable Mention" by the National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators/Jostens in the category of *An Array of Projects or Activities in 2005*.**

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last 21 years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 15.3 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 16.6 million hours of community service.

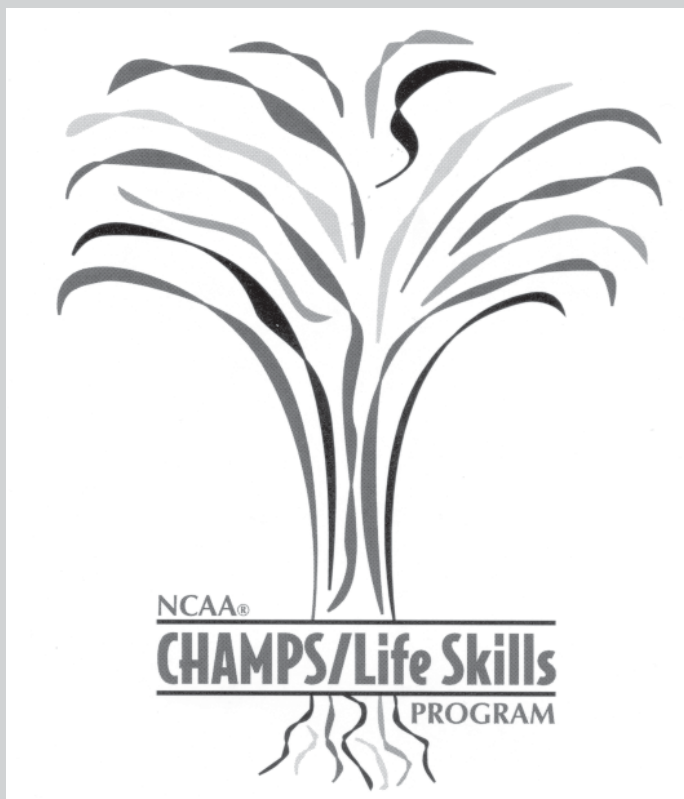

STUDENT ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student athlete representatives from each of UMass Boston's teams. The purpose of the organization is to promote all UMB sports and provide student athletes an opportunity to impact those issues that affect their daily lives.

SAAC is the student athlete's voice and their vehicle to implement new ideas and influence positive change to enhance the student-athlete experience at UMass Boston.
