Directions to UMass Boston

From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.





TERRY CONDON Head Coach

UCLA 1977 • Second Season

Terry Condon enters her second season as UMass Boston's Head Coach. In her first season, she led the Beacons to their highest win total in four seasons.

Condon brings an outstanding volleyball coaching and playing background to UMass Boston and is a legendary figure within college and United States volleyball circles. The former UCLA standout is considered one of the greatest players to ever step on the floor for the Bruins, having been named to the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame in 1992 as well as being honored as one of the 25 greatest players in UCLA history. Her number 34 was retired by the Bruins as well. She enjoyed a tremendous career with UCLA, helping it to an 89-12 record, which included a pair of national titles in 1974 and 1975 and a national runner-up placing in 1976.

Condon's amazing accomplishments were not limited to the collegiate level, however, as she made her mark on the world stage as well, playing for the United States Volleyball National team throughout the 1970s. She was named a seven-time First Team All-American, two-time Second Team All-American and was the Player of the Year in 1971. Condon enjoyed tremendous success with her teams, racking up three USA Open National Championships and was a five-time member of the USA Women's National team, including the 1970 World Championship team and the Pan American Games teams of 1971 and 1975. Her accomplishments were recognized by her selection to the USA Volleyball 75th Anniversary Women's All-Era Team (1949-77) and her honor as an All-Time Great Female Player by the United State Volleyball Association in 1983.

Condon's achievements transcended her playing career as she went on to a successful coaching career as well. Following two years as the Head Coach of California State University Bakersfield, she took over the reigns at Texas A&M University and in six years, led the Aggies to three NCAA tournament

appearances and coached the squad to a 180-101 mark for a .641 winning percentage. The year prior to her arrival, Texas A&M, posted an 18-21 mark and two years later, Condon led the squad to a 40-16 record and a ninth place national finish in 1981. She still holds the Aggies' coaching standard for highest winning percentage in a single-season with her 33-4 (.892) mark for the 1984 campaign.

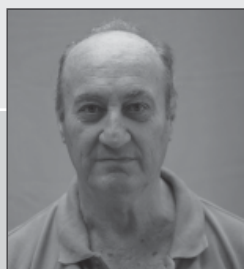
Following her coaching career, she returned to her alma mater as an Associate Athletic Director for UCLA from 1986-1994 and received three Achievement Awards. She remained in Athletic Administration when she became a Senior Associate Athletic Director at Northeastern University in Boston in 1994 and remained with the Huskies until 1998.

Condon's selection as UMass Boston Head Women's Volleyball Coach is in addition to a position that she already holds, as she was named the Senior Associate Athletic Director for the school in February of 2006. She is also the Assistant Director of many area field hockey camps and works for a tax preparation business as well.

Condon graduated from UCLA in 1977 with a Bachelor of Science degree in kinesiology and currently resides in Rowley, MA.



COACHING STAFF



PADELI GELLCI

Assistant Coach

First Season

Pandeli Gellci joins the UMass Boston staff for his first season, marking the fifth country that he has either coached or shared his knowledge of volleyball in. Gellci has served as an authority on volleyball on three continents in a career which has spanned 40 years. The long-time mentor began his career in Pogradec, Albania, where he instilled Russian volleyball techniques within his players. He is well-known in international volleyball circles, having authored several studies in volleyball playing techniques as well as philosophies, while speaking at many volleyball seminars from 1972-97. Not afraid to gain knowledge from any corner of the globe, Gellci has also incorporated Chinese coaching styles into his teachings.

He was given the prestigious title of *National Coach* in 1973, which is the highest distinction in the field of athletics in Albania. Gellci spent 13 years with the Albanian National program, serving as an Assistant Coach from 1972-75 and as the Head Coach from 1976-80. He went on to lead the National Youth team from 1982-85 as the Head Coach as well.

His teams have enjoyed much success including a Second Division crown for the Pogradec men's team in 1960 and the 1966 women's title for Korca, Albania. He led the Korca Junior women's squad to a crown in 1968 and helped the women's team to national championships in 1972, '73, '85 and '86. His teams captured the Albanian cup in all but two years from 1971-78 and he's been at the helm for impressive national victories as well, defeating the Algerian, Greek and Chinese national teams behind his Korca squads.

In the 1990s, Gellci took his expertise to Greece and Croatia, where he worked with women's volleyball teams and enjoyed great results.



PAUL LE

Assistant Coach

First Season

Paul Le enters his fourth season as an Assistant Coach for UMass Boston volleyball. In his previous three years with the program, the Beacons have improved their record in each campaign.

Le is very active on the volleyball scene, playing in the USAV with the S.T. Volleyball Club. He has helped his team to many tournament victories in the New England area.

Prior to his arrival at UMass Boston, Le was an outstanding athlete at South Boston High School, excelling in track and field in the 400 meters, triple and long jump.

He currently resides in Dorchester.

For Head Coach Terry Condon this will be year two of turning a program back into a power player. The Beacons got on track last season with their highest win total in four seasons and return the core from last year and add a talented class of newcomers. UMass Boston showcases a solid balance of experience throughout the roster. Athletics and solid fundamentals will be counted on to make up for a lack of height, but either way, the Beacons fate for 2006 looks bright.

Hitters

The Beacons boast a good mix of experience and youth with their hitters.

Junior **Denise Hill (Sabana Seca, PR)** will make the move to middle hitter after playing on the

outside the past two seasons. The two-year captain is an outstanding athlete and worked very hard in the off-season. She was third on the team with 182 kills and 36 aces last season and should provide some pop in the middle on the offensive side of the net and rely on her vertical leap to play the defensive side. Sophomores **Tanya Beckford (Framingham, MA)** and **Allison Johnston (Weymouth, MA)** will also see significant time after posting impressive seasons, respectively, last year. Beckford turned into the team's top offensive threat with 196 kills and featured a potent serve, firing 43 aces to place eighth among Little East Conference leaders. She will see action on the outside again this year. Johnston

will get time in the middle and on the right side. She enjoyed a solid first year in '05, registering 83 kills and posted 24 total blocks to rank second on the squad, while showing great improvement throughout the season.

UMass Boston will also look for major contributions from a group of impact freshman. **Megan MacAuley (Upland, CA)** could start right away on the outside. The two-time All-League selection in high school is a dedicated worker with excellent offensive skills and should bolster the Beacons' attack from the service line as well. Classmate **Tatyana Budantsev (Brookline, MA)** provides a big presence for UMass Boston on the outside and could also see action at right side. The six-foot freshman is a strong hitter with a booming serve and could see a lot of playing time right away. **Natalie Crist (Santa Maria, CA)** is a strong player with good fundamentals and should see time in the middle as well. The Captain and Most Valuable Player for her high school team was also named First Team All-League. **Kate White (Plymouth, MA)** rounds out the impressive freshman quartet coming from a strong volleyball program. She could see time at both middle and outside hitter. A good leaper, she was named MVP and All-Scholastic for North Plymouth High School, while helping them to three East Coast titles. Sophomore **Meaghan Lambert (Rehoboth, MA)** has shown great improvement from last year in the off-season and will assume a leadership role as a tri-captain. A great, natural blocker, she will vie for time at right side as will senior **Maryssa Carey (Norwell, MA)**. The four-year player will look to contribute off the bench and could chip in with a serve that produced 13 aces in 2004.

Setters

The Beacons have the luxury of three setters to pace the team's offense. All three provide different strengths.

Senior **Juliane Farias (João Pessoa, Paraíba, Brazil)** has seen action as UMass Boston's primary floor general over the past three seasons. She averaged 6.49 assists per game to rank fifth in the conference, while playing in all 23 matches. She also ranked third on the squad with 116 digs and 14 total blocks. Sophomore transfer **Randle Stock (Hopkinton, MA)** will also push for time at the setter spot. She gained experience at Roger Williams University last season and set for 73 assists in 12 matches, while serving up 13 aces. She has

good hands and fine fundamentals and the ability to set a fast offensive, which should

play to the Beacons' advantage. Freshman **Kathryn Mears (Haverhill, MA)** gives the team height at the setter position and will compete for more time as the season goes on after establishing a school-record for season assists with 1,553 at Haverhill High School.

Libero/Defense

UMass Boston will infuse experience with youth in their utility roles.

Senior **Kassandra Rateau (Brockton, MA)** returns for her fourth season and has served as a defensive specialist as well as a libero and should vie for time as the team's primary libero. She has good digging and passing skills and is coming off a season where she was injured with a sprained ankle. She finished the year with 62 digs and 12 aces. Sophomore **Francis Carrasquillo (Lawrence, MA)** was fifth on the team last year with 102 digs as a defensive specialist and will vie for time at libero this year. A good passer, she has a great work ethic and desire for the game. Freshman **Phi Lang (Arlington, MA)** earned a spot on the team as a walk-on and has shown a great work ethic and excellent defensive skills. She will look to contribute to the squad as a defensive specialist and at libero.

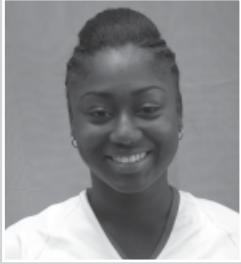

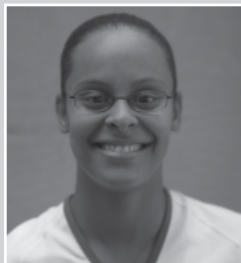

THE LITTLE EAST CONFERENCE

The Little East Conference officially began on April 28, 1986 as a playing conference for men's and women's basketball among six New England institutions: Eastern Connecticut State University, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth (formerly Southeastern Massachusetts University), the University of Massachusetts Boston and the University of Southern Maine. From the beginning the conference was officially recognized by the NCAA.

The number of sports contested in the conference has grown to include men's and women's soccer, baseball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track, men's and women's outdoor track, men's and women's lacrosse, softball, men's and women's tennis, volleyball and field hockey, as well as the original men's and women's basketball. The number of participating institutions rose to seven with the addition of Western Connecticut State University in 1993-94 and then to eight for the 1997-98 year as Keene State College joined.

Along with planning for the inclusion of new sports within the conference, the LEC's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field programs are participating in an innovative joint program with the MASCAC conference to determine New England Alliance championships. Events contested are scored within each conference and for the Alliance as well.

The LEC recognizes the advantages of combining with other conferences which allows teams with lower numbers of participants to join forces and compete at a full-team level. It is likely there will be additional sports contested within the Alliance over time.

THIS IS UMASS BOSTON

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 11,862 students in the 2005-2006 academic year, with 8,958 undergraduate students and 2,904 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 34 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment. More than 90 languages are spoken in the homes of members of the 2004 graduating class.

UMass Boston's graduate school and six colleges offer over 100 undergraduate majors, minors, and programs of study, and nearly 61 graduate programs, including 14 at the doctoral level., while the university's 30 institutes and centers are actively involved in research and public service in the areas of public policy; gerontology; media; labor; women in politics; African-American, Latino, and Asian issues; and environmental concerns. More than 280 active research and training grants attracted a total \$35.6 million in external funds—a new record of success—for the fiscal year 2004-05. Comparing five-year averages shows the amount awarded UMass Boston increased a remarkable 70% between 2001 and 2005. The university employs 821 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Instructional Technology Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for



intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the 331,000-square-foot Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The campus' new "front entrance" opened in April of 2004.

Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.



A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and nine summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.

Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.

Academic Advising

At UMass Boston we prepare our students for life.

And because the life of a college student can be much more challenging than a basketball game or a soccer match, the UMass Boston athletic department provides you with the means to be successful in whatever sport you play, and also in the game of life.

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We make sure that our students are not solely concerned with maintaining athletic eligibility. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab--a fully equipped facility open exclusively to UMB student-athletes.

CLARK ATHLETIC CENTER

The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 13 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's



building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six

25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative and combative rooms and a sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural

programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began



hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA. The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.

The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.



IN THE COMMUNITY

Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well--service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- **More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.**
- **Over 150,000 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.**
- **UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.**
- **In 2005 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the eighth straight year.**
- **UMass Boston was named "Honorable Mention" by the National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators/Jostens in the category of *An Array of Projects or Activities*.**

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last twenty years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 14 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 15.7 million hours of community service.

There is no one way to conduct school outreach programs. It is clear from the great work done by NCAS members that there are many

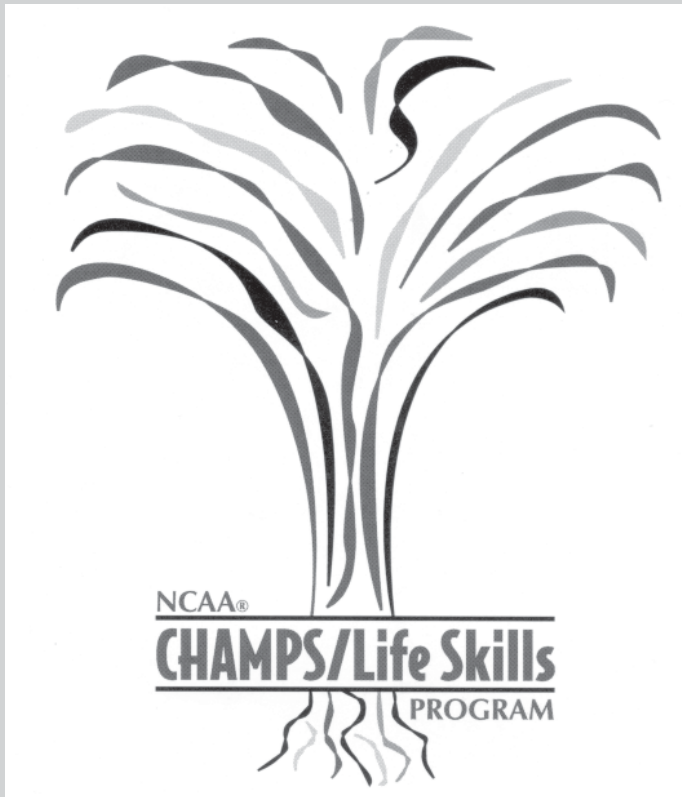

NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. Presently, 323 institutions and six conference offices now participate in this NCAA supported life skills program. The NCAA mission of CHAMPS/Life Skills is "committed to a comprehensive program that provides educational experience and services in order to develop well balanced lifestyles for student-athletes; to encourage growth in decision making, planning and fulfillment of career and life goals."

The CHAMPS/Life Skills program will be presented this year at UMB through the development of workshops/guest speakers that address identified life skill needs in the five commitment areas of this program.

As part of our membership in CHAMPS/Life Skills, each year one of four student athlete nominees will attend the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference.

STUDENT ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student athlete representatives from each of UMass Boston's teams. The purpose of the organization is to promote all UMB sports and provide student athletes an opportunity to impact those issues that affect their daily lives.

SAAC is the student athlete's voice and their vehicle to implement new ideas and influence positive change to enhance the student-athlete experience at UMass Boston.

Members of each team will nominate and select an eligible student athlete to represent their sport on the SAAC. An alternate will also be selected, in the event that the designated representative cannot attend a meeting. It is expected that each team will be represented at every scheduled meeting/event.

Throughout the year, student athletes are encouraged to communicate ideas and concerns to the respective representative of their sport.

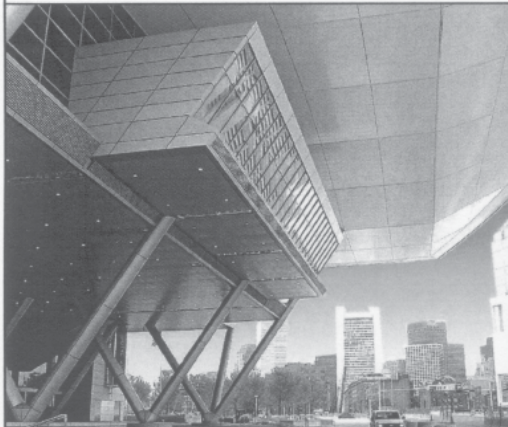

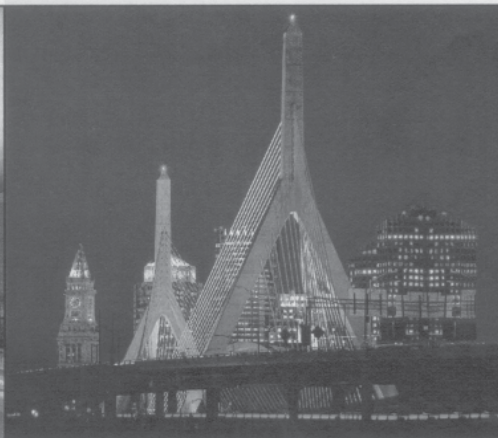
