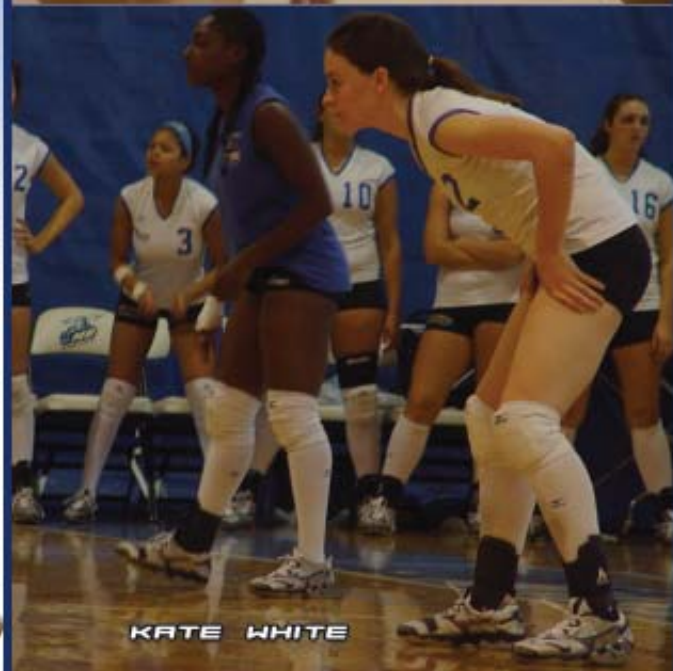

Directions to UMass Boston

From the South

Interstate 93 North (Southeast Expressway) to Exit 14, Morrissey Boulevard/JFK Library/UMass. Continue straight off the exit ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard for approximately one mile. Turn right into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the North

Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway) to exit 15, Columbia Road/JFK Library/UMass. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp and proceed towards the rotary. Turn right the first opportunity out of the rotary and remain in the right lane descending the ramp onto Morrissey Boulevard. Stay to the right of the curb at the bottom of the ramp and in the left lane. The first traffic light is in front of The Boston Globe plant. At the second traffic light, turn left into the campus and follow the driveway to the parking areas.

From the West

Interstate 90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Interstate 93 South (Southeast Expressway). Follow directions from North as indicated above.





TERRY CONDON

HEAD COACH

UCLA 1977 • THIRD SEASON

Terry Condon enters her third season as UMass Boston's Head Coach. Since her arrival at UMB she has continued a trend that's been prevalent throughout her coaching career. Turning around a program and enjoying continued improvement.

In her first season, she led the Beacons to their highest win total in four seasons and last year, Condon guided the squad to just the second-highest win total in school-history with an 18-12 mark. Her success is attributed not just to her coaching ability, but also to her knack for bringing quality players into the UMass Boston fold, as evidenced by the 2006 Little East Conference Rookie of the Year donning a Beacons' uniform.

Condon brings an outstanding volleyball coaching and playing background to UMass Boston and is a legendary figure within college and United States volleyball circles. The former UCLA standout is considered one of the greatest players to ever step on the floor for the Bruins, having been named to the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame in 1992 as well as being honored as one of the 25 greatest players in UCLA history. Her number 34 was retired by the Bruins as well. She enjoyed a tremendous career with UCLA, helping it to an 89-12 record, which included a pair of national titles in 1974 and 1975 and a national runner-up placing in 1976.

Condon's amazing accomplishments were not limited to the collegiate level, however, as she made her mark on the world stage as well, playing for the United States Volleyball National team throughout the 1970s. She was named a seven-time First Team All-American, two-time Second Team All-American and was the Player of the Year in 1971. Condon enjoyed tremendous success with her teams, racking up three USA Open National Championships and was a five-time member of the USA Women's National team, including the 1970 World Championship team and the Pan American Games teams of 1971 and 1975. Her accomplishments were recognized by her selection to the USA Volleyball 75th Anniversary Women's All-Era Team (1949-77) and her honor as an All-Time Great

Female Player by the United State Volleyball Association in 1983.

Condon's achievements transcended her playing career as she went on to a successful coaching career as well. Following two years as the Head Coach of California State University Bakersfield, she took over the reigns at Texas A&M University and in six years, led the Aggies to three NCAA tournament appearances and coached the squad to a 180-101 mark for a .641 winning percentage. The year prior to her arrival, Texas A&M, posted an 18-21 mark and two years later, Condon led the squad to a 40-16 record and a ninth place national finish in 1981. She still holds the Aggies' coaching standard for highest winning percentage in a single-season with her 33-4 (.892) mark for the 1984 campaign.

Following her coaching career, she returned to her alma mater as an Associate Athletic Director for UCLA from 1986-1994 and received three Achievement Awards. She remained in Athletic Administration when she became a Senior Associate Athletic Director at Northeastern University in Boston in 1994 and remained with the Huskies until 1998.

Condon's selection as UMass Boston Head Women's Volleyball Coach is in addition to a position that she already holds, as she was named the Senior Associate Athletic Director for the school in February of 2006. She is also the Assistant Director of many area field hockey camps and works for a tax preparation business as well.

Condon graduated from UCLA in 1977 with a Bachelor of Science degree in kinesiology and currently resides in Rowley, MA.

Ken McNeeley begins his collegiate coaching tenure at UMass Boston following a very successful four-year playing career at Newbury College. He will be responsible for the team's hitting and blocking instruction and will be counted on for recruiting.

The Maryland native enjoyed a wildly successful senior campaign with the Nighthawks, leading the nation in blocks for the third straight year, while leading Newbury to the Eastern College Athletic Conference championship in 2007 and was also named a First Team All-New England Collegiate Volleyball Association honoree after leading the Nighthawks in kills for the second straight season. McNeeley was selected the National Player of the Week on two occasions and landed on the NECVA All-Academic squad for the second straight year as well. He saw Newbury win nearly 100 matches during his time in Brookline, MA and also helped it to a number nine national ranking during his sophomore season, while earning Second Team All-America honors.

A 2007 graduate of Newbury College with a degree in computer science, McNeeley is currently pursuing his masters degree in the MBA program at UMass Boston.



YALCIN OZARAYDIN

ASSISTANT COACH
FIRST SEASON

Yalcin Özaraydin comes to the UMass Boston volleyball staff via his home nation of Turkey, where he enjoyed an outstanding playing career. He is a great motivator and should help the Beacons with game situations and practice skills.

Özaraydin played professionally in the Turkish Volleyball League and also saw action in a different pro league, where he helped his squad to a Turkish Series B Championship in 1996. The former hitter experienced great success as a youth player as well, helping his youth club team to a spot in the National Championship game in 1993 and was also a member of 1989 Regional Youth Team National Championship squad. Özaraydin was a member of the Bursa Boys High School team that finished third in the High School National Championships in 1988 and would later go on to compete with the Turkish Youth National team in 1989.

A 1991 graduate of Tophane Technical High School in Bursa, Turkey, Özaraydin is currently pursuing a business degree at UMass Boston.

Since Head Coach Terry Condon took over the women's volleyball program in 2005, the plan has always been to rebuild the program into a successful one. Condon's track record spoke for itself, making a winner out of both Cal State Bakersfield and Texas A&M in short time. If things keep progressing the way they have been, you can add UMass Boston to the list.

The Beacons welcomed an influx of new talent into the fold last year and it resulted in 11 more wins from the year before and an 18-12

record to rank as the second-highest win total in school history. The success didn't go unnoticed as Condon was named the Little East Conference Coach of the Year and one of the team's freshman was named the LEC Rookie of the Year.

Now that UMass Boston has emerged, it can no longer sneak up on opponents, but has also added to its cache of talent with more skilled newcomers.

Hitters

The Beacons saw the emergence of a talented trio of freshmen hitters last season, who are all back to better last year's success. UMass Boston also welcomes back a senior captain and pair of newcomers, who should be able to make an impact right away.

Senior **Denise Hill (Sabana Seca, PR)** is entering her fourth season with the team as the most experienced player on the squad and is a captain for the second straight season. She made the transition to middle hitter last year and responded by ranking second on the squad with 44 blocks. The hitter also remained a prominent force on the offense, smashing 1.65 kills per game, while owning a respectable .175 hitting percentage and serving up a team-high 49 aces in 112 games.

Sophomore outside hitter **Kate White (Plymouth, MA)** also returns as the reigning LEC Rookie of the Year after spiking for 3.08 kills per game to rank seventh among league leaders. She was the only player in the conference to be named Rookie of the Week three times and was extremely efficient, owning a .250 hitting mark to rank fifth in the conference. White should contribute in the

same role as last season, but could also see time at right side. Classmate **Megan MacAuley (Upland, CA)** proved to be one of the top rookies in the league last year and one of the Beacons' best all-around players. She has great instincts on the court and showed what a great hitter she is with 2.73 kills per game last year to rank 10th in the LEC, while coming up with 2.98 digs per game to lead the team, despite missing time with an injury. She will be counted on again to be one

of the team's most potent offensive weapons, behind a spirited serve that led to 33 aces to rank second on the squad, as well as a solid force on defense. Sophomore middle hitter **Natalie Crist (Santa Maria, CA)** also emerged as one of UMass Boston's best players, topping the team with 57 blocks, including 29 solos. Crist was an extremely effective hitter with a .246 hitting percentage, the sixth best mark in the conference and also averaged 2.50 kills per game to put her third on the team. She and Hill were the only players on the squad to play every game last season and should pose a formidable presence in the middle.

A pair of freshman will join the fold as well and should make immediate contributions. **Karly Sanchez (Lawrence, MA)** is a very strong, physical player, who possesses a wicked arm swing and will see time as an outside hitter, but should also serve as an intimidating force at the net on defense, while classmate **Nina Sullivan (Cheshire, CT)** has very good skills and instincts for the game and will look time at middle hitter, but also at right side. She gives the Beacons good height and owns an effective serve as well.

Setters

UMass Boston returns its primary starting setter from a year ago and will also infuse an athletic newcomer into the mix.

Senior **Randle Stock (Hopkinton, MA)** seized the starting position early last season and will be the team's main floor general again. She is one of the team's three captains and will serve as one of

the team's leaders. She has great hands and moves the ball around effectively, as shown by her 8.25 assists per game last year, which ranked as third best rate in the LEC. Stock also contributed on the defensive end with 1.06 digs per game and 13 blocks in 80 games. Freshman **Alexandria Quinn (Brockton, MA)** earned a spot on the team as a walk-on and impressed with outstanding athletic ability and quickness. She should also provide a surprising presence at the net with her leaping ability.

Libero/Defense

One area the Beacons made a significant upgrade in is the defense with the addition of some outstanding newcomers and the return of a veteran from last season.

Sophomore defensive specialist **Phi Lang (Arlington, MA)** saw action in 30 games last season, averaging 2.87 digs per game and has shown great improvement this year. She is joined by junior defensive specialist **Alessandra Adamo (Glastonbury, CT)**, who returns to the college circuit after taking a few years away from the game. Adamo saw action in 2004 with Division II American International College and has battled through injury since. She is a captain and has very good skills and instincts. Freshman **Emily Thompson (Wausau, WI)** could make the biggest impact of any of the team's newcomers, serving as UMass Boston's libero, but could also see time at right side. She has excellent instincts for the game and is a great passer with outstanding ability to read opposing hitters. Classmate **Giovanna Small (Plymouth, MA)** will make the move from setter to defensive specialist. She has good skills and

knowledge of the game and should show improvement at her new position as she adapts.



Senior Randle Stock earned the setter spot last year and ranked third among LEC leaders in assists.

NOTABLES Named a Captain for the second straight year and came into camp in great condition ... Should be a main contributor and is ready for a big season.

2006 Selected team captain for the second straight year ... One of two players to see action in all 112 games in all 30 matches ... Made the switch from outside to middle hitter and stepped up with 44 total blocks to rank second on the team, including a team-high 29 block assists ... Led the team with a career-high 49 service aces ... Spiked for a career-best 185 kills to rank fourth on the squad ... Owned a .175 hitting percentage ... Smashed five or more kills on 19 occasions, including double-digits in three contests ... Put down 14 kills to go with a pair of aces and a dig vs. Utica on September 2 at the Holiday Inn/Red Dragon Invitational ... Averaged 9.4 kills during a five-match stretch from October 13-21

... Owned a .500 hitting mark with nine kills and just one error at Emerson on October 6, while adding an ace and a dig ... Stood up to make two or more blocks on 12 occasions, including seven total rejections vs. Keene State College on September 23.

2005 Named captain as a sophomore prior to the season ... Played in all 23 of the Beacons' matches ... Third on the team with 182 kills and 36 aces ... Tallied 114 digs and 13 total blocks ... Recorded 22 kills against Regis College on October 6 to follow a 17-kill output vs. Southern Maine just two days prior ... Served for an ace in 12 consecutive matches, including eight straight with two or more ... Averaged 10.2 digs in a six-match stretch from October 4-15.

2004 Boasted a stellar freshman campaign ... Played in all 22 matches ... Finished third on the team with 111 kills, 26 aces and 114 digs ... Recorded 13 total blocks ... Had 15 kills against Suffolk on September 23 ... Began her career with aces in five straight matches and fired 13 in a six-game span from October 2-15 ... The Little East Conference officially began on April 28, 1986 as a playing conference for men's and women's basketball among six New England institutions: Eastern Connecticut State University, Plymouth State College, Rhode Island College, University of Massachusetts Dartmouth (formerly Southeastern Massachusetts University), the University of Massachusetts Boston and the University of Southern Maine. From the beginning the conference was officially recognized by the NCAA.

The number of sports contested in the conference has grown to include men's and women's soccer, baseball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track, men's and women's outdoor track, men's and women's lacrosse, softball, men's and women's tennis, volleyball and field hockey, as well as the original men's and women's basketball. The number of participating institutions rose to seven with the addition of Western Connecticut State University in 1993-94 and then to eight for the 1997-98 year as Keene State College joined.

Along with planning for the inclusion of new sports within the conference, the LEC's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field programs are participating in an innovative joint program with the MASCAC conference to determine New England Alliance championships. Events contested are scored within each conference and for the Alliance as well.

The LEC recognizes the advantages of combining with other conferences which allows teams with lower numbers of participants to join forces and compete at a full-team level. It is likely there will be additional sports contested within the Alliance over time.

The University of Massachusetts Boston was established in 1964 to provide the opportunity for superior education at moderate cost to the people of greater Boston.

Starting out in a downtown Boston location, the university moved to its current 175-acre campus on the Columbia Point peninsula in 1974 and merged with Boston State College in 1982. A commuter school, UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban universities.

UMass Boston enrolled 12,362 students in the 2006-2007 academic year, with 9,246 undergraduate students and 3,116 graduate students comprising a multicultural and diverse student body. Students of all ages are enrolled at UMass Boston and students of color make up 36 percent of the university's undergraduate enrollment. More than 90 languages are spoken in the homes of members of the 2005 graduating class.

UMass Boston's graduate school and six colleges offer over 100 undergraduate majors, minors, and programs of study, and nearly 61 graduate programs, including 14 at the doctoral level., while the university's 30 institutes and centers are actively involved in research and public service in the areas of public policy; gerontology; media; labor; women in politics; African-American, Latino, and Asian issues; and environmental concerns. More than 280 active research and training grants attracted a total \$35.6 million in external funds—a new record of success—for the fiscal year 2004-05. Comparing five-year averages shows the amount awarded UMass Boston increased a remarkable 70% between 2001 and 2005. The university employs 815 distinguished faculty members, including Lloyd Schwartz, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Criticism.

Located in the Boston community of Dorchester, UMass Boston offers excellent views of downtown Boston, the Harbor Islands and Dorchester Bay. UMass Boston shares its campus with the John F. Kennedy Library, which offers its archival resources to UMass Boston students and instructors. The university's own Healey Library is an information gateway to more than 600,000 books and journals on campus and to thousands of electronic information resources on the Internet.

Other academic facilities include the biology department's three greenhouses, which host collections of plant species native to tropical, desert and temperate climates, and The Instructional Technology Center, a professional development and technology facility for faculty and staff, which opened in 1996.

The Clark Athletic Center is home to UMass Boston's varsity athletics program and features a 3,500-seat arena, a hockey arena that seats 1,000, and a swimming and diving facility equipped for



intercollegiate competition. The Beacon Fitness Center is equipped with more than 25 cardiovascular machines, a universal weight machine, 16 Nautilus stations and free weights. The Fitness Center also houses two racquetball courts, a squash court, an aerobics room, a walking track and a two-level lounge.

The newest major addition to the UMass Boston landscape is the 331,000-square-foot Campus Center — a \$50 million project which centralizes student services and activities. The campus' new "front entrance" opened in April of 2004.

The university is the only educational institution in the Northeast that shares its campus with a presidential library.

UMass Boston has won four NCAA Division III national championships, 19 individual national titles and has seen 21 different athletes achieve All-America status a total of 94 times.

Our home, the Clark Athletic Center, is one of the best Division III athletic facilities in New England.

UMass Boston is the only four-year, state-supported institution inside the Interstate 95 beltway.

Students have the opportunity to commute from home or live off-campus with teammates.

We're located just three miles from downtown Boston with all of the city's major attractions easily accessible from the campus.

Academic Advising

At UMass Boston we prepare our students for life.

And because the life of a college student can be much more challenging than a basketball game or a soccer match, the UMass Boston athletic department provides you with the means to be successful in whatever sport you play, and also in the game of life.

UMass Boston's academic advising center for student athletes is designed to help each Beacon athlete in every sport complete his or her undergraduate degree. We make sure that our students are not solely concerned with maintaining athletic eligibility. We work extensively with the faculty and professional staff on-campus, and we help our students with course selection, advising and counseling, and career and graduate school exploration.

When you enroll at UMass Boston, you will get to know your advisor quite well. One of our primary focuses is freshman-year retention, so we are highly motivated in your first year to work with you to develop a plan for academic success. Your advisor will meet with you on a one-to-one basis and introduce you to the Clark Athletic Center's computer lab--a fully equipped facility open exclusively to UMB student-athletes.

Your academic advisor will also work with your professors. Your instructors will update the athletic department with progress reports, and when you are having trouble, they will let us know. But more importantly, they'll let us know how we can help you.

As a student athlete at UMass Boston you will have unique opportunities to represent the University on a national level and in national programs.

Sports Medicine

Quite simply, the sports medicine center at UMass Boston is one of the best in the area. It combines the best facility with the best people -- all with the goal of keeping Beacon student-athletes healthy.

The sports medicine room falls under the direction of head athletic trainer Ed Perkins, a UMass Boston graduate and former athlete with the Beacons. Before taking over at UMB, Ed worked with the nationally ranked men's basketball team at Temple University before returning to Division III athletics at MIT and at Bridgewater State College.

A.J. Rourke, a certified athletic trainer in her own right, is the university's assistant athletic trainer. A.J.'s credentials include a stint with Marietta College, where she worked with the nationally ranked baseball program, and nine summers working with top major league baseball prospects in the prestigious Cape Cod League.

What that means to you is that when you become a member of the Beacons, you are in the safest environment possible. Whether it be injury prevention, evaluation, treatment, or rehabilitation, the training staff at UMass Boston is looking out for you.

Before you are eligible for competition, you will be required to undergo a thorough physical examination. You will be monitored throughout the training phase and competitive season. And the training staff works closely with your head coach to make your participation in Beacon athletics as safe as it can be.

To ensure quality individual care, the training staff regularly acquires the latest and most effective modalities. The sports medicine center at UMass Boston is equipped with a four-channel electrical stimulation with combination ultrasound unit, a paraffin bath, two hydrocollator units, a Jobst compression unit and a whirlpool bath.



Strength & Conditioning

The University of Massachusetts Boston is one of the few NCAA III schools in the country to offer a year round strength and conditioning program.

The varsity weight room is designed to improve all areas of athletic performance for all sports. The strength and conditioning coach is a certified professional. The focus is to educate and train athletes on how to properly execute exercises that will allow them to be more efficient with the sports specific movements and enable them to participate with a reduced chance of injury. Our goal is to produce athletes who are faster, stronger and more powerful, in order for them to compete at their highest level.

The student athlete at UMass Boston has a wealth of athletic and recreational facilities available within the confines of the Clark Athletic Center.

The athletic center has served as the home of the Beacon basketball program since its completion in 1981.



Named for Catherine Forbes Clark, a former trustee of the University of Massachusetts system and prominent Dorchester civic leader, the Clark Athletic Center emulates its namesake by serving the University community as well as area residents throughout the year.

Considered one of the finest athletic and recreational facilities in Greater Boston, the complex accommodates the school's 16 intercollegiate sports and extensive intramural program. The Center's building houses a main gymnasium, which includes a 3,500-seat

basketball arena along with three auxiliary basketball courts and two volleyball courts, a 1,000-seat ice rink, and an Olympic-size swimming pool with a high-dive area, six 25-yard lanes and an observation deck. A weight room, creative room and a



sports medicine area round out the interior of the structure.

Outside the building, UMass Boston boasts an eight-lane 400-meter track, eight tennis courts, a softball diamond and two multipurpose fields primarily used for soccer and lacrosse. The outdoor facilities also include a boathouse and dock for the sailing program as well as several recreational fields.

In addition to extensive use by the intercollegiate and intramural programs, the Clark Athletic Center serves as the site for numerous community activities. Included in the list of community activities

are a variety of events for both youth and the physically challenged. UMass Boston hosts the National Youth Sports Program, an NCAA-sponsored summer camp for inner-city youth, as well as the Dana Barros Basketball Camp, the All Dorchester Sports League, the Boston Youth Games, the Boston Housing Authority Jamboree, the Bay State Games and MIAA state tournament games in soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

The athletic center became the new home of the Boston Shootout, the premier high school basketball tournament in the nation, in 1997 and has served as a workout facility for the Boston Celtics and the 2000 McDonald's All-American High School Basketball team, while also serving as the site of the Sprite Slam Jam. During the summer of 1999, the center began hosting the Shaw's Summer Pro League, featuring current and future stars of the NBA.



The center also hosts the Indiana Pacers and San Antonio Spurs during the NBA season, serving as a practice site for both of those teams on their visits to Boston.

The Clark Athletic Center saw its most excitement for 2000 in just one night when on October 3rd, the University hosted the first United States Presidential Debate of 2000. When the parties finally agreed to the Boston debate, the event was suddenly only two weeks away. In that time frame the Clark Athletic Center had to be converted into a debate hall and the adjacent hockey rink into a media center, replete with red carpet, approximately 700 phones, more than 70 televisions, and accommodations for almost 1,600 media representatives from around the world. The complex has also doubled as a concert venue, hosting multiple-Grammy winning artist Kanye West in 2006.

UMass Boston also boasts one of the finest personal fitness facilities in the area in the Beacon Fitness Center. The state-of-the-art recreational area provides students, faculty and staff with modern equipment in a clean environment.

The fitness center offers cardiovascular machines, nautilus and free weights, squash and racquetball courts, a walking track and aerobics.



Intercollegiate athletics, intramurals and recreation for students, staff and faculty are the primary programs of the UMass Boston Department of Athletics. The department offers 14 varsity sports and is a member of the NCAA's Division III. UMass Boston has teams competing in the ECAC, the Little East Conference and ECAC East Ice Hockey. Ninety-three Beacons in seven sports have been named All-Americans. The women's indoor and outdoor track and field teams had an outstanding record of achievement, including four NCAA Team Championships and 37 individual NCAA Championships.

But the Department of Athletics has another important concern as well—service to the community. Whether it's complimentary use of the University's athletic facilities, coaches' and student athletes' sports clinics for youth groups, or holiday visits to area hospitals, UMass Boston Athletics is in the forefront of serving area neighborhoods and communities throughout the state.

- More than 150 school, charitable, government and private organizations use UMass Boston athletic facilities each year at little or no cost.
- Over 2,500 people visit our athletic facilities each year, as participants or spectators.
- UMass Boston's indoor and outdoor athletic facilities are in use by visitors for over 2100 hours each year.
- In 2005 the National Consortium for Academics and Sports named the Department of Athletics at UMass Boston as # 1 in the country for Community Service for the eighth straight year.
- UMass Boston was named "Honorable Mention" by the National Association of Division III Athletics Administrators/Jostens in the category of *An Array of Projects or Activities in 2005*.

UMass Boston is in a unique position as the only public university in the City of Boston. For that reason, the University has a responsibility above and beyond its mission to provide a superior higher education at moderate cost to the people of the metropolitan area. Because of its urban environment and its spacious, coastline location, the University can reach out to its neighbors and provide first rate facilities for healthy, stimulating sports and recreational activities.

National Consortium for Academics and Sports member institutions develop Outreach and Community Service programs with current student-athletes and former student-athletes from the Degree Completion Program. Over the last 21 years, NCAS member institutions, through their outreach and community service programs, have reached more than 15.3 million youth nationwide with messages about violence prevention, gender sensitivity, conflict resolution, the importance of academics and athletics, staying in school, the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and much more. Since 1985, NCAS student-athletes have given over 16.6 million hours of community service.

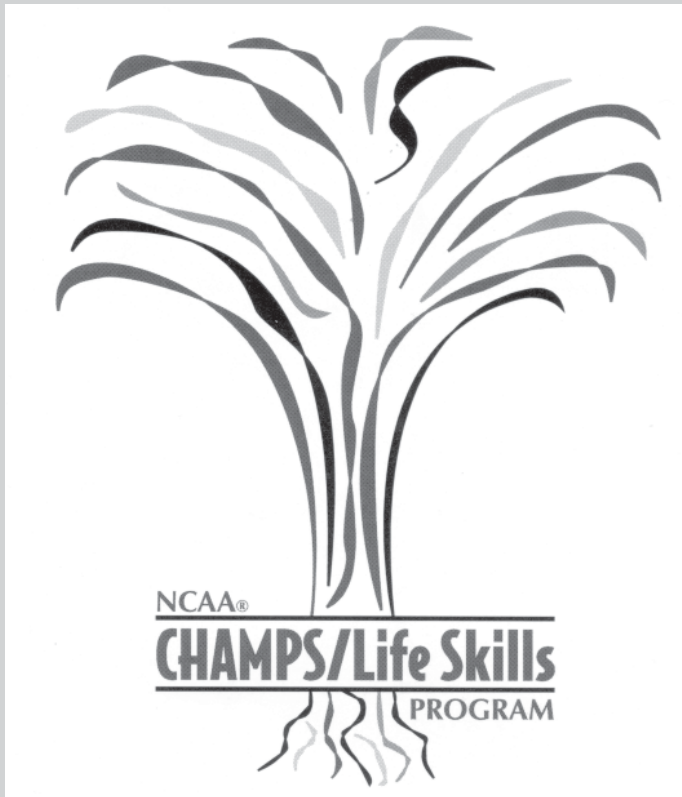

NCAA CHAMPS/LIFE SKILLS

The 2000-01 school year marked the department's first year as a member of the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program. Presently, 323 institutions and six conference offices now participate in this NCAA supported life skills program. The NCAA mission of CHAMPS/Life Skills is "committed to a comprehensive program that provides educational experience and services in order to develop well balanced lifestyles for student-athletes; to encourage growth in decision making, planning and fulfillment of career and life goals."

The CHAMPS/Life Skills program will be presented this year at UMB through the development of workshops/guest speakers that address identified life skill needs in the five commitment areas of this program.

As part of our membership in CHAMPS/Life Skills, each year one of four student athlete nominees will attend the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference.

STUDENT ATHLETE ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) is comprised of student athlete representatives from each of UMass Boston's teams. The purpose of the organization is to promote all UMB sports and provide student athletes an opportunity to impact those issues that affect their daily lives.

SAAC is the student athlete's voice and their vehicle to implement new ideas and influence positive change to enhance the student-athlete experience at UMass Boston.

Members of each team will nominate and select an eligible student athlete to represent their sport on the SAAC. An alternate will also be selected, in the event that the designated representative cannot attend a meeting. It is expected that each team will be represented at every scheduled meeting/event.

Throughout the year, student athletes are encouraged to communicate ideas and concerns to the respective representative of their sport.
